## 2. What are we doing right now?

- 1. Develop a gift shop that generates revenue. Jana has been working really hard to find site specific items that both promote the site and sell. Not always as easy task.
- 2. Improve and develop a better Tourist Information Center. More and more people in our community have come to our door to gather information on planning their vacations in state.
- 3. Pershing Boyhood Home foundation full basement project. (on hold)
- 4. Paint Pershing Boyhood Home
- 5. Roof Prairie Mound School
- 6. Paint Prairie Mound School
- 7. Continuing to work on developing the site Conceptual Development Plan, Interpretation Plan, Operation Plan, and the Emergency Plans.
- 8. Working on a museum exhibit plan to best support our interpretation of the life and story of General Pershing.

9. Working on Acquiring, "General Pershing and his Generals of the AEF" from the US Army Archives.

### 3. What are we striving to do in the future?

- 1. Working on acquiring an M-26 Pershing Tank for the site.
- 2. Working on getting a prop Gatling Gun, and a Philippine sword
- 3. Still working on what the requirements are to be an electric or electric/ hybrid vehicle recharging station.
- 4. Working on acquiring a Harley Davidson Motorcycle with sidecar to depict the Punitive Expedition into Mexico.
- 5. Making a website more interactive to classrooms on the web. Also set up a 360 degree interactive tour.
- 6. Complete and open to the public the Pershing Memorial Museum and Leadership Archives.
- 7. Construct a retaining wall stage with soil near the new museum building from Pershing Home Foundation Project providing a program space big enough to support the US Army Band, "Pershing's Own". (Possibly called "Pershing Chinese Theater" honoring the Pershing Chinese interpreting their story and General Pershing's role.)
- 8. Add lights to outside of Pershing Home when foundation work is completed.
- 9. Add lights to garden

- The mission of the state park system is to preserve and interpret the state's most outstanding natural landscapes and cultural landmarks, and to provide recreational opportunities compatible with those resources.
