
- T. In 1897 three organizations, The First Church of Christ, Scientists of Kansas City, the Western Church of Christ, Scientist (later changed to Second Church Christ, Scientist) and the Third Church of Christ, Scientist, came together under a charter as First Church of Christ, Scientist. That same year they purchased the lot the present church sits on and the foundation was built. The cornerstone was laid May 1897 and the church was dedicated in 1898. It cost \$50,000 to construct. In 1908 a lot adjoining the church was purchased. The plan was to extend the main building west to the property line and add the new building on the south side adjoining the church. The extension was near completion when a fire on January 29, 1910 burned the main auditorium. The extension was also damaged. As early as October 1910 the Sunday School Auditorium although partly finished was being used. By November services were in the main auditorium, though not finished. The architect George Mathews designed the 1897 church and Herman Stroeh designed the addition. This church was Mathews' first important commission after beginning his own practice.
- 2X. The main facade faces east. Additional features include: 75 ft. crenelated tower with pyramidal roof at northeast corner; main entrance in northeast tower is paired paneled wood doors with tympanum, entrance placed within pointed arch, oculus art-glass window in tower; paired pointed arched openings covered with louvers in tower, full gable to the south of tower has triparite art-glass rectangular windows with slanted stone sills and flat stone lintels-first story; large art-glass window with tracery flanked by smaller art-glass windows on second story; windows within pointed arch with stone drip molds; a two-story addition to the south of the church has fenestration of leaded glass windows in pointed arches with slanted stone sills and stone quoin surround, entrance on this portion is recessed, paired wooden doors with tympanum; through-the-cornice crenelated dormers with pointed arch windows are on both north and south facade; stone buttressing; squat crenelated tower with pyramidal roof located midway on north facade (beginning of addition); large ornate stone chimney-south elevation.





- T. As the result of the reorganization of two churches (Olive Street and Emanuel) the Central Baptist Church was formed in 1907, during the pastorate of Rev. J. S. Davis. The first \$2,000 toward the construction of a new church was raised in 1907-09. In June, 1911, construction of the new church began under the pastorate of Rev. Roluix Harlan. Rev. and Dr. W. S. Abernathy dedicated the church on Nov. 17, 1912. The cost of the building was reported at \$28,000.
- 2X. The main elevation faces south. Entry placed in the three-story arcaded tower unit. Main entry is recessed, double-door placed below a cast-stone entablature supported by cast stone piers. Above the molded entablature are paired windows (double-hung, sash-type) with a cast stone label mold surround. Additional fenestration at the south facade includes: non-original fixed paned plate glass units below wood paneled spandrels. Pointed arch windows set in cast-stone pointed arch surrounds, have been boarded -up; an oculus with art glass and cast stone surround; double-hung, sash-type art glass units with side cast-stone lintels and lug sills. This fenestration is repeated at the east elevation. West facade features fixed paired art glass units set below wood spandrels, in turn, set below pointed arch tracery-styled art glass units set in cast stone pointed arches. Brick buttressing with cast-stone amortizements separate the bays at each facade. Additional features include denticulation and a brick chimney at the east elevation. Non-original shed roofed metal canopy at main entrance.

- The site for this church was donated by the Bales family in 1895. In 1915 plans were prepared for a church plant of the most modern specifications. The plans were designed by Shepard, Farrar & Wiser. The church was to seat 800 and plans included large balcony, large chorus choir, organ, baptestry, a basement housing a gymnasium with full basketball court. The cornerstone was laid April 13, 1916. The roof was designed as a decked roof arranged as a roof garden so that summer services could be held outside. The church plant cost \$200,000 to construct and contains 64 rooms. The church was dedicated in 1921.

- T. With a donation of \$8,000 and smaller gifts, Father Cyprian purchased a lot at the NE corner of 17th and Lydia Streets, which included 4 houses. Three of the homes were rented, and the income from these properties were used to supplement the donation to build a church. The remaining house was remodeled and used as a church and school. The first service was held on Oct. 16, 1910. Three years later, in 1913, a two-story school and chapel was constructed. All that remains of the original houses and school is this property. (1400-1402 E. 17th St.) It is now owned by St. Joseph's Church
- 2X. The main elevation faces south. Centrally placed non-original double-door entrance, placed below a name tablet with "St. Monica" carved into the face; in turn, placed within a cast stone surround. Fenestration at the south facade is paired and ribboned, double-hung, sash (with glass transoms at the first-story level) with wide lug sills. Above the second-story fenestration are carved festoons which flank an occulus. Fenestration at the west facade is double-hung, sash-type, with stone lug sills. First-story fenstration features glass transoms and wide brick lintels. East elevation fenestration features similar configuration as the west facade, in addition to segmental arched lintels at the first story and basement level. (Parking lot must have been raised as the basement level windows have been obscured.) Much of the north elevation fenestration (double-hung, sash) has been filled in with concrete block. Additional entrances and non-original concrete block unit at this elevation. A non-contributing building, located at 1406 E. 17th, is now used as Mother's Refuge (originally St. Monica's Convent).



- T. When the American Radiator Company established a plant in Centropolis, Kansas, in 1910, a number of Polish foundry workers from Buffalo, N.Y. moved to the area to work for the company. In 1913, when the Polish settlement had grown to about 75 families, the need to establish a parish became evident. In 1914, the construction of the church began, with approximately one-third of the church built of stone. When WWI began, the construction of the church was halted and debts mounted. Many families in the area returned to the East while others moved to Kansas City, Kansas. For about one year (1918) the parish church was attended by Franciscan and Redemptorist Fathers.
- 2X. The main elevation faces south. Entry to church is reached by a ramp which leads to series of steps. Entry is placed in a hipped roof, semi-enclosed addition. Fenestration is minimal at the south elevation and features units infilled with glass block; brick sills. North elevation fenestration has been infilled with glass block. Brick piers may also be non-original. Basement level fenestration (boarded up) features wide stone lintels. Center bay features stone buttressing and arched entry. Roofline is crenelated.

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- T. This church was originally the Swedish Evangelical Lutheran Emmanuel Church. It cost \$100,000 to construct. The cornerstone was laid Oct. 28, 1900. The superstructure was completed in 1913. The church was sold Sept. 11, 1919 at a cost of \$18,000. The Catholic Church Extension Society contributed \$500.00 towards the purchase price. This is perhaps the first project the Extension Society funded in the diocese. On Oct. 5, 1919, the church was formally opened for Catholic worship and has served the Hispanic community since that time. In 1990, the parish was consolidated with the Sacred Heart Parish. Our Lady of Guadulupe Parish was established in June, 1914, with Father Muñoz, a priest exiled from Mexico, as pastor. A school was built to the south of the church in 1926 and opened the following year.

Additional features include central steeple with belfry; louvered opening in pointed arch with cut stone lintel and drip stone in steeple tower; buttress with cut stone trim, stained glass sash windows with cut stone sills and stone lintels with cut stone keystone and skewbacks; two story central crenelated projection houses rosette window within cut stone surround and main entrance; entrance, recessed, paired, wood panel doors with single light; stained glass tympanun; cut stone arch lintel with drip stone; decorative buttress with cut stone flank main projection, stone urn on cornice table above entrance. 

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- The church was built by F. H. Greitag at a cost of \$10,000. The church was the first of a group planned by the Christian Woman's Council of Jackson County. In 1952-53, the Hiram Elliott Memorial building was added to the west and adjoins the church. It was constructed to house classrooms, youth chapel, social hall and storeroom. The church is significant in the area of ethnic heritage--Hispanic. It was constructed to serve the Hispanic community. The church evolved as a result of the Mexican Christian Institute which began in 1913-1914 when a large number of Mexican railroad workers lost employment. The Christian Woman's Council opened a soup kitchen at 20th and Madison as a result. In 1931, the present church was built.

- T. In 1906, Father Hogan, then pastor of Sacred Heart Church, purchased the lot across the street from the church. The parish hall was built on that site in 1922 at a cost of approximately \$35,000. At that time, the parish was noted for it's Drama Club and with the construction of this building they then had a place to hold their productions. Later the hall was used as a diocesan center for CYC (Catholic Youth Council) activities. In 1980 the hall was closed due to high utility bills. On Aug. 29, 1981, the hall was rededicated. Over \$250,000 of improvements were made to the hall under the leadership of Robert Reeds, Kansas City Center Labor Council and Bill Dunn, Kansas City Labor-Management Council. The original stone trim was done by Trusswall Manufacturing Company.



- The lot for this church was purchased by April 1905. William Barnes Fall, English-born architect from Wichita was selected as architect for the church. The firm of Van Brunt and Howe had prepared an earlier design in 1902. The new church measured 154' x 128' and had a 65' tower. The first service was held April 1, 1906. Two months after the church opened, Fall, the architect, died, and his funeral service was the first to be helddin the church. In 1910 a rectory at 4010 Walnut Street was built adjacent to the Guildhall at a cost of \$10,000. In 1924 it was converted for parish use and known as St. Paul's House. The first stained glass window, The Adoration of the Shepherds, was installed in 1922. On May 22, 1949, ground was broken for a parish house with auditorium, classrooms, chapel and nursery. This addition was designed by Neville-Sharp & Simon, architects. Memorial garden at the corner of Fortieth and Walnut Streets was developed by Hare and Hare. In 1971 southeast corner of church and parish house were rebuilt. Ground broken in 1988 for new south entry with port-cochere, and other interior remodeling.



At the time of construction, the education wing was considered outstanding in Sunday School planning and equipment. The cornerstone was laid June 15, 1930. 

This steel and masonry church is "revolutionary in both its concept and design." The church nave, conceived in the shape of a fish, represents an early liturgical symbol for Christ.

In 1937 a fund was begun to build a new church. By 1941, \$65,000 had been raised. In 1941 plans were drawn for the church, however, with the outbreak of WWII, plans were delayed. Finally in 1947, Francis Barry Byrne, an architect from Chicago/N.Y. was chosen whith Joseph B. Shaughnessy, Sr. as an associate. Ground was broken on 14 March 1948 and on 26 June 1949 the cornerstone was laid. On July 4, 1950 the church was formally blessed. At the time it was thought to be the most modern church building in the Middle West.

- 2X. St Francis Xavier was designed and built in the shape of a fish. Additional features of St. Zavier Church include two metal-framed double-door entrances with prominent metal clad canopy east and northwest elevation; prominent art glass windows (north & south facades) set in 9 recessed panels with operable units at the bottom of each unit; a porte-cochere at the northeast elevation (with handicapped entrance) features a statue (at the east end) of St Francis Xavier; awning-style art glass fenestration at winged units, north and south facades. Parish house connected at the north facade and canted to the west features hopper-style and casement fenestration, cantilevered roofline at north and south elevations and paneled overhead garage doors at the west elevation. Multiple entrances.
- St Francis Xavier School, built in 1961-62, is a non-contributing structure located to the south of the church. It was designed by Shaughnessy, Bower & Grimaldi.

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



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

- T. The early parish of St. Francis Seraph was a "mixed congregation", comprised of English speaking Germans, Belgian, French and Poles. The gospel was read in English, German, Flemish and French. The church was designed by the architectural firm of Brinkman and Steele, Emporia, Kansas. The cornerstone was laid in June 29, 1924 and the Lombardi Romanesque style church dedicated June 4, 1925. The men of the parish dug the basement for the church using scoops and horses. The original address for the church was 605 Wyman Avenue. When the church was dedicated the church was composed of "Swedes, Hungarians, Croatians, Austrians, Irish, German, Italian, French, Belgian, Poles". In 1991 both the church and rectory were purchased by the Phoenix Office Supply Co. 

- T. In July 1921 lots were purchased at the corner of Thirty-ninth Street and Bellefontaine. A basement church was built on the lots at that time. It was blessed on Christmans Eve in 1922, and used as a church for five years. In 1927 the new church (present) was begun. The church measures 75' x 132', and cost \$150,000 to construct. The debt was paid in 1941. The interior stencilling was done by Dante Cosentino. The original light fixtures were designed by the parishioner H. C. Devine. The stations of the cross were imported from Bohemia. Dedication of the church was Oct. 28, 1928. A school to the west was constructed in 1941. It was closed in 1974 when it was consolidated with St. Louis School. In 1974 the priest from Blessed Sacrament moved into 3919 Agnes, the former rectory, 3911 Agnes (1914) became a convent. The Diocesan Planning Commission announced on Oct. 12, 1990 that Blessed Sacrement Church would be closed. Final masses were celebrated the weekend of Feb. 3, 1991. The school to the west was built in 1941 by the architectural firm of Shaughnessy and Bower, and J. E. Dunn Construction Co. was the builder. The school has been vandalized and is in poor condition. In 1927, at the time the church superstructure was designed and constructed, the church received honorable mention by the Architectural League of Kansas City as an outstanding building with respect to effective design.
- 2X. The main facade faces east. Additional features include: basilica plan, three entrance pattern, entrances are paired wood doors, tympanum of cut stone with oculus motif; entrances framed within rounded arch; blind arcading above entrance, rose window dominates main facade, squat towers flank entrance bay; niches in towers absent of statues, cut stone exterior with rough stone basement; a 132' square bell tower-north elevation; clerestory windows are paired rounded arch with stone sills and rounded arch lintels, lonic columns are located between each paired window; cornerstone reads "Blessed Sacrament Church 1926", apse-west elevation.

- This church was designed by E. O. Brostrom for the Church of God, Holiness. The church was constructed in two stages, 1917 and 1928. The Kansas City Church of God, Holiness was begun in 1914. In 1917 the present site was purchased and a basement was built and dedicated that same year. The indebtness was paid off in five years (1922). In 1928 the superstructure was constructed. The church was dedicated December 16, 1928. This church designed by E. O. Brostrom contains some unique architectual features. The exterior walls are stucco over a Con-Tee construction, a new form of using concrete, developed by Brostrom. By 1961 it was being used by the Starlight Missionary Baptist Church.

- T. In April 1888, a tent was erected at the N/W corner of Windsor and Kent Ave. (now Bales Ave.), donated by Rev. Nathan Scarritt, for the purpose of holding church services. On May 6, 1888, the opening day of the services, the Methodist Episcopal Church South was formed. Shortly afterward in 1888, the construction of a church began immediately to the west of the tent on Bales Avenue. Construction of the church was completed in the fall of 1889 at a cost of \$27,000. Land for the church site was donated by Nathan Scarrit. In Feb. 1926, the congregation voted to remodel the existing church into an educational building and add a new auditorium for \$100,000. Ground was broken on the new site, east of the original structure, on June 12, 1927. The cornerstone was laid Sept. 18, 1927. The building was completed in the spring of 1929, and dedicated on April 21, 1929. A striking feature of the addition is the Memory Tower, built in recognition of the services of all the ministers of the church.
- 2X. The main elevation faces south. The original church, now the Nathan Scarritt Memorial Building, features a non-original cast stone entrance with double-doors, long/narrow transoms and a fixed multipaned window. Additional fenestration in the principal gable end is double-hung, sash with course stone sill coursing, tripartite arched unit and a tracery-styled art glass unit. Second-story units are placed below blind arches featuring basket weave patterning capped with stone, punctuated with keystones. Other features include coursed stone belt coursing, brick piers with amortizements, brick corbeling and a three-story slender polygonal spire. West facade features paired, arched windows set in arched surrounds; first and second story fenestration separated by paneled wood spandrels. Brick buttressing with stone amortizements separate bays. Prominent stone coping caps all gable ends.

The 1927 addition now features the main entrance, a double-door wood entry placed in a segmental arched cast-stone surround. "Melrose Methodist Church" is carved above the doors. Main entrance is set in a four-story bell tower, which features tracery styled vents, quoining at the corner piers, finials and trifoil design. Principal gable displays a tracery-styled segmental arched art glass window with trifoil embellishment in a segmental arched surround. Gabled bay flanked by buttresses displaying stone amortizements and prominent finials. Tripartite fenestration and foliated panels. East elevation features clerestory windows above casement fenestration set in lancet arch surrounds; balustrades at balcony features trifoil embellishment. Prominent rosette window, north elevation.



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- T. The Belmont Avenue Christian Church was organized in December, 1916. On May 28, 1918, lots at the southwest corner of Twelfth St. and Belmont Avenue were purchased by the church. Shortly after that construction began. The cornerstone of the educational unit was laid July 13, 1919. The cost of the building was \$33,000. The building had twenty-two classrooms, and an assembly room. It was dedicated February 15, 1920. On Oct. 16, 1921 ground was broken for an addition to house the auditorium of the church and a gymnasium. Construction of this section, however, did not begin until 1923. The cornerstone was laid March 24, 1924 on this section. The completed and "well-appointed" church was completed at a cost of \$150,000 and dedicated February 1, 1925. The builder for the 1923 addition was W. O. Wallner.
- 2X. The main facade faces north. Additional features include: corner square towers housing recessed entrances; entrances are paired wood doors with two lights; cut stone step door head over entryway; fenestration in towers are 1/1 sash-type windows with cut stone flat lintel and stone surrounds; upper section of tower contains triparite pointed arch openings with cut stone continuous sill and surrounds; cut stone coursing and brick buttress with stone amortizement further accent the towers; first story cut stone; central three bays contain multi-light, art glass, sash windows placed within pointed arches; the two stories of windows are placed with stone surround with stone lintel and sill; cornerstone reads "Belmont Avenue Christian Church 1924". The education unit adjoins the church proper to the south. The entrance on this portion of the building faces east; entrance is paired aluminum frame glass doors; tile semi-hip roof protects entrance; fenestration is 1/1 sash windows with transom (second story) and stone sill coursing; flat brick lintels (header/stretcher pattern); wide cornice table; cut stone parapet; star anchors.



- Τ. The original St. Stephan's church and school (1888, 1889) facility burned in 1913. The stone foundation from the original church was refitted to form temporary quarters for the congregation. Plans for the church proceeded; however, the war slowed progress. The cornerstone was laid on April 27, 1919. The first mass was said December 25, 1922 and the church was dedicated September 6, 1925. It is significant to note that the church was rebuilt by the parishioners due to both high unemployment and an empty treasury. The construction cost was half of what it would have cost if labor had been purchased. Materials for the church were donated. Judge Latshaw donated much of the stone. M. E. Reiser, member of the parish and graduate of "Academy of Fine Arts," frescoed some interior murals. Shingles which originally covered the roof were donated by the American Asphalt Roofing Co. The shingles were variegated color, and a newspaper description referred to their effect as combining "something of the effect of a storm at sea with wavering wheat fields of Kansas, and the turning leaves of autumn." The church and rectory are listed in the Kansas City Register. A 1959 school is to the north of the church. A 1909 rectory is to the south. In 1992 the Diocese of Kansas City--St. Joseph closed St. Michael the Archangel, Holy Trinity, St. Stanislaus and St. Stephen's parishes and created Our Lady of Peace Parish which is located on the St. Stephen's campus. In the early 1930's work began on the altars and communion rails. The altar and apostolic figures were designed by Michael E. Reiser and modeled by Edward Lawhan. At the time of construction, the altars were considered an important addition to the sculptural possessions of Kansas City.
- 2X. Additional features of the church include: twin crenellated corner towers, pier buttresses, geometrical bar tracery and stained glass windows placed within painted arches. Church is constructed of contrasting hues of granite ranging from pinkish to brownish in tones, creating a pattern work.



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- T. On June 9, 1905, the Eastminster Presbyterian Church was organized. It was organized by a commission from the Upper Missouri Presbytery. Mr. and Mrs. James J. Norton deeded their property at the northeast corner of Walrond and Anderson Streets to Harry T. Abernathy. Mr. Abernathy deeded the property to the Eastminster congregation on May 27, 1907. Work began on the foundation on July 8, 1907. The cornerstone was laid September 15, 1907 and the church dedicated November 9, 1909. On March 12, 1921 the building was severely damaged by a fire resulting in the organ being totally lost, the auditorium having to be replastered and refurnished throughout. On May 10, 1948 another fire struck the church. The architect L. G. Middaugh designed Eastminster Presbyterian Church. The total cost for construction and equipment of the building was \$75,000. By 1913 Eastminster Presbyterian Church was the largest Presbyterian U. S. Church in Missouri.
- 2X. The main facade faces west. Additional features include: side main entrance placed in one-story vestibule, entrance, paired glass doors are placed within rounded stone arch, fenestration on the main facade full gable is rectangular lancet windows with cut stone sills and lintels on ground story; there are five lancet windows in rounded arch with cut stone continuous sill and rounded arch lintel. A large stone panel incised with "Eastminster Presbyterian Church" is located between the first and second story, stone coping. The church measures 76' x 108'.

- T. This church was built as part of a group of parish buildings envisioned by Father Michael J. Lyons. The cornerstone for the church was laid Oct. 13, 1922. The first story and doorways were built from rock quarried at Second and Lydia. The stone window trim is Bedford stone. At the time of construction the proposed plant (school, church, auditorium) was considered one of Kansas City's "architectural gems". The superstructure for the church was built in 1926. The architect for the church, Chester Dean, combined both the Romanesque and Mission influence in order to harmonize with architecture being used by the Park Department in designing the Concourse. Father Lyons was the general contractor. It was calculated that each rock cost \$1.65; each brick \$0.09, and the building itself \$0.35 per cubic foot. An additional reference states that Father Lyons designed the church from two postcards. The parishoners finished the interior cement work with their bare hands, which can be seen on the walls today. The church was originally ornamented in white and gold trim by Dante Cosentino. In 1931 Mr. and Mrs. Ferdinand Heim donated a residence at 318 Benton to be used as a rectory. That same year Mary M. and W. M. List donated a residence at 328 Benton for a convent. The stained glass came from Munich and the rock wall surrounding the edifice came from seven different states. At one time there was a pergola and a fountain which had a Blarney Stone from Ireland (extinct). In 1990 the parish was consolidated with St. John Baptist and St. Francis Seraph. At this time the church name was changed to St. Anthony's. In 1954 an addition to the school was begun. Presently the original school is called Joseph Hall and the addition is the Thomas J. Parrins Center.
- The main facade faces west. Additional features include: cornerstone reads "Church of the Assumption 2X. 1922"; three entrance pattern, entrances are recessed and placed within rounded stone arches; lower portion of building course stone; central bay projects and is flanked by three-story brick towers with copper dome roof; cross finial on domes; openings on towers are rounded arch; large rosette window, life size stone statues, brick blind arcade corbeling and ornate brackets supporting cornice table are all features on the central bay; art glass tympanum over entrances; cut stone coping, cross acroterion; attached school building to the south and east; (rock used on first floor on church and school was quarried at Second and Lydia).

Howe was elected pastor. The present lot was selected and the church was built and completed in 1907. The organ and pews came from the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. In 1930 an addition was designed by George Siemens. This addition to the south was used as a community center in the northeast section of the city. Also, the Sunday School section to the east was rebuilt at this time. The expansion cost \$35,000 \$40,000.

Additional features include: crenelated square bell tower housing entrance; entrance is paired wooden door placed within pointed arch stone surround; stone buttress, stone coping fenestration is art glass, sash-type windows in wood frames; in full gable there are paired sash windows stone sills and lintels; triparite art glass windows above; smooth stone spandrel between windows; addition to the south entrance, a slab door with ornate cut stone surround is placed in a gable projection; fenestration on this addition are sash-type windows, exposed stone basement and false half-timbering comprise the remainder of this addition. Cornerstone reads "Grace Presbyterian Church 1907".

- T. In 1904 property at the southeast corner of Benton Boulevard and 23rd Street was purchased as a new site for the Holy Name Church and School. The owner of the property was Thomas Swope. The lot cost \$13,200. Additional property was also purchased along Benton Boulevard. The basement for the church was constructed in 1911. At this time the parish ran out of money so the basement was enclosed and construction was halted for thirteen years. The first design for the church was prepared by the architectural firm of Wight and Wight. However, their design, if executed would be too costly. The contract with Wight and Wight was terminated and H. W. Brinkman was hired. Brinkman eliminated the transepts in the original plan and lowered the roof. The final cost for the church was approximately \$175,000. In August 1924 work was resumed on the church. Frank Pavlick was general contractor. The church was dedicated on June 3, 1928. The church is French Gothic in design and originally had a seating capacity of 1000. The church was modeled after the cathedral at Rouen, France. In 1949 a bowling alley was installed in the basement of the church. The bowling alley was closed in 1959 at which time the equipment was removed. In 1974 Holy Name Parish was part of the consolidation by the Diocese. On July 15, 1975, the church was sold to Bishop Harris E. Moore of the Church of God in Christ for \$70,000. The church was then renamed Barker Temple. In the interest of energy conservation the congregation erected a shell within the church which prevents one from seeing the stained glass windows.
- 2X. The main facade faces south. Additional features of this church include: centrally placed entrance; entrance is double paired vertical board with single light, plain cut stone transom above; compound arch over entrance, open gable with quatrefoil motif over entrance; open arcade with trifoil in central bay; rose window with stone tracery above entrance; semi-hexagonal bell tower with stepped steeple to the west of the entrance; west tower has outstanading animal gargoyles; east tower is shorter and is capped with dome roof; stone buttress with amortizement; crockets; cornerstone reads "Holy Name Church Dominican Fathers 1928."; cut stone coursing, fenestration consists of cusped arch windows with tracery; some windows have stone sills and drip molds; apse and apsidioles at north end.

- T. The Benton Boulevard Baptist Church was constructed in 1904-1905 and exhibits an early use of concrete block construction. This is particularly unique to ecclesiastical building of this era. Designed by the architectural firm of Edward and Sunderland, this church is a good example of the Late Gothic Revival Style of architecture. The Walnut Grove Baptist Church was formed in 1894. In 1896 fifty members of the congregation formed the South Park Baptist Church. Rev. William T. Campbell served as first minister of the South Park Baptist Church from 1896-1899. It was at this time that a campaign to build a new church was initiated. The present church was built in 1904-1905, it was at that time that the name of the church was changed to Benton Boulevard Baptist Church. In 1955 the Benton Boulevard Baptist Church sold the church building to the Macedonia Baptist Church for approximately \$45,000. In 1921 a gymnasium addition was constructed on the south facade to the east.
- 2X. The main facade faces west. Additional features include: triple entrance; entrances are recessed and are modern wooden doors with trim molding; art glass transoms above doors; drip molds with labels above entrances; large art-glass window with tracery and drip mold above entrances; twin semi-hexagonal crenelated towers; pointed arch art-glass windows with drip molds in tower, one-story crenelated wing to the north; a recessed, slab door entrance in this section; rose window-north elevation; to the east adjoining the church (1921 addition) is a one-story, stucco building with exposed stone basement; fenestration is 4/2 light, sash windows; entrance is centrally placed and covered by a open gable porch; porch roof supported by stucco piers; entrance is paired wooden doors. The church is constructed of concrete blocks which have been highly polished.



- T. This church was originally called Annunciation Church. The property at the northwest corner of Linwood and Benton was purchased on Nov. 20, 1901. Ground was broken for the church on Nov. 16, 1902. On May 26, 1903, work began on the foundation walls for the church which were under the supervision of H. Cashian. On Oct. 11, 1903 the cornerstone was laid. Lack of money kept the church from being built until 1920. That year a fund drive was begun and construction resumed. The church was finally completed and dedicated May 1924. The stain glass windows in the church were made in Innsbruck, Austria and were installed in 1924. The original plan for the church called for piers/steeples on the towers. The church design was modeled after a church in Chicago. In 1940 the church interior was remodeled, in 1953 a new school building to the west was constructed. In 1975 the parishes of Annunciation, Holy Name and St. Vincent were consolidated and renamed Church of the Risen Christ. The original address was 2814-2810 Linwood Boulevard.

Additional features of this church include cut stone water table; rusticated first story; twin, square, corner towers; small sash rounded arch windows with brick quoining and/or cut stone quoin surrounds on first and second story of towers; main entrance is centrally placed, cut stone pediment with cross covers central entrance, three rows of with cut stone band coursing above entrances, large prominent stained glass window with pointed arches and three quatrefoil motif; stained glass window within cut stone rounded arch lintel and stone quoin surround.



- T. On Oct. 18, 1925, the congregation of the St. Therese Little Flower Parish gathered for the first time. The church that stands today was built from 1948-1949. On April 4, 1948, ground was broken for this church; on April 15, the cornerstone was laid. Costing \$175,000, the building was dedicated on Thanksgiving Day, November 24, 1949. The architect was Joseph B. Shaughnessy, Sr.
- 2X. The main elevation faces north. Additional features include a deep recessed entry with wooden double-doors with coffered panels. Curved walls flank the entry. A cut-stone canopy with "St. Terese's Church" carved into the face crowns the entry. Fenestration includes recessed leaded art glass windows, with cast-stone surround, metal casement-style units (some art glass), with cast-stone sills; a modest-size apse at the northwest corner with recessed, casement-style art glass windows and wide sill tables. A cornerstone is located at the north facade, east end. The church measures 114' long, 78' wide and 40' high. Tower is 70' in height. The 9 1/2 foot statue of the Little Flower was made by the Kansas City Marble and Tile Company. A two-story rectory featureing ribboned metal fenestration and prominent recessed entry, was added in 1954-1955 to the south elevtion. Architects were Shaughnessy, Bower, Grimaldi.

- T. The property opposite the original St. Vincent Church was purchased in 1906 for school purposes. The cornerstone for the school for St. Vincent's Church was laid June 17, 1906. The parish school was opened Sept. 3, 1907. The school cost \$50,000 to construct. It was built by Jerome and John Donnelly and was constructed of concrete and faced with Carthage stone. "The school was thought to be one of the first fireproof structures built in the city." The original idea for the school was to be "select." Once it became a parish school overcrowding became a problem. The Sisters of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary staffed the school and lived in the building until 1940. In 1908 a parish high school was begun in the building then called St. Vincent's Academy. The school was closed in 1943 and the auditorium was used as a parish hall. In 1979 the building was sold to the Crusaders Church Cooperation.
- 2X. The main entrance faces east. Additional features of the building include: a recessed entrance; paired slab doors located within projecting entryway; cut stone flat arch with voussours and keystone over entryway; cut stone piers with egg and dart molding support entablature; "St. Vincent's Academy" in enblature; paired cut stone scrolls situated on top of entrance cornice; non-original aluminum frame windows; cut stone water table; cut stone coursing, prominent decorative gable with triparite windows; flat stone arches over first story windows; finials and cross on parapet of dormer--main elevation.



- T. The cornerstone for this church was laid on October 8, 1922 and dedicated May 29, 1924. It was built on the west side of Flora facing the old St. Vincent church. The church cost \$230,000 to build and took ten years to complete. The object of the design for this church was to build a parish church of Gothic design without copying any existing building. "There are no massive girders or heavy arches resting in the air or on flimsy columns. The two transept arches and the main sanctuary arch are poured monolithic concrete." More than nine thousand sacks were used in the concrete work. In 1944 marble altars were installed. Some of the cost of the building include cut stone \$51,474; plastering \$12,510; carpenter/laborers \$37,96; architect \$10,800. Joseph Conradi, Swiss artist, sculpted a statue of Christ Crucified (west elevation). A rectory is to the south and school to the north.
- 2X. The main elevation faces east. Additional features include: paired double wooden doors and glass doors in portals; canvas awning covering entryway; cut stone panel above entrance featuring ornate ogee arches and shield motif; prominent art glass window with stone tracery (east); central bay--stepped gable with stone coping; cut stone niche (empty) in gable, belfry with cut stone trim and spires, crockets and copper dome.

The church measures 193' x 92', the nave width is 50' and 69' high, redwood timber used to sustain the roof load. The art glass, set in Bedford stone tracery are a series of repetitions of the symbols of the chalice, host, cross and keys (St. Peters). Cornerstone reads "St. Vincent de Paul A D 1922". Large sculpture of Christ on Cross west elevation.

T. On Sept. 10, 1905 a group of ministers and deacons from the Baptist Church of the city organized a presbytery for the purpose of creating a new church. On Sept. 15, 1905 the name Forest Avenue Baptist Church was adopted. The basement for the present church was built in 1907 with Frank DeShazer as superintendent of construction. This section was designed by the architectural firm of Rose and Peterson. The first gathering in the new church was not until 1917. The church was dedicated Sept. 9, 1923. The mortgage was burned February 6, 1924. The basement of the Sunday School wing was begun in 1926 and completed in 1927 at a cost of \$13,000. It was designed by the architectural firm of Keene and Simpson. It was one-story and constructed of brick. In 1953 a one-story addition was added on top of the 1927 addition. The architect for this portion was H. A. Noble and the builder was L. I. Largen. The addition is presently being used as the Forest Avenue Shelter.

The superstructure was not begun until 1915.

Additional features include: crenelated corner tower, paired slab doors with three lights in tower; fenestration is art-glass, sash-type windows in pointed arches; stone voussoirs lintels and stone sills, stone buttresses with stone amortizements; cornerstone reads "Forest Avenue Baptist Church, organized 1905, erected 1917"; one-and-a-half story addition to the south, paired slab doors flanked by 1/1 sash windows on addition.

The cornerstone of the Church was laid on February 18, 1923, and finally the bulding was dedicated on Sept. 30, 1923. The original portion of this church, which faces Garfield Avenue, was a private residence from its construction C.1886, until 1926 when the building was purchased by the Metropolitan Spiritual Church. That year, a rear addition was constructed, significantly enlarging the Italianate style residence at its east elevation. Again in 1933, an addition was made to the east, and then in 1946 the front portico, as well as the garage, were constructed. Five years later in 1951, a balcony was added to the rear addition. Modifications were made after a 1964 fire.
- 2X. The older section of this church faces Garfield (1231). This Italianate style building was originally a residence. The main elevation faces west. Non-original double-door entrance features a wide glass transom set below a prominent stone lintel. Fenestration is double-hung, sash with wide stone lintels and lug sills. This unit features a single bay overhead door at the first story and ribboned 10/10 light double-hung, sash windows with wide lintel and lug sill at the second story. Fenestration at south elevation; of original unit is also double-hung, sash. Other details include quarter-round windows at gable end, south elevation, fleurons and denticulation at cornice line. The brick addition, east elevation, is where the main entrance is now located. A recessed, pointed arched double-door is set within a pointed, arched lintel with prominent voussoirs and keystone. Fenestration at the first story level is recessed double-hung, sash. mulitpaned art glass and casement style with wide stone lintels and lug sills. Second story windows are casement style with pointed arch transoms placed within a pointed arch surround with keystone and scewbacks. In addition, a tripartite Gothic-styled art glass unit is also featured. Third story units are mulitpaned casement and double-hung, sash mulitpaned art glass. - T. An organization of a Southern Methodist society in the East Bottoms began under elder Dr. C. H. Briggs, in 1886. The Rev. W. G. Pike (1887-88), the first pastor, built the church at a cost of \$3,000.00. It was dedicated by Bishop E. R. Hendrix. The Garland Avenue ME Church, as it was called, fought against saloons and gambling houses that once were prominent in the east bottoms, but as conditions changed in that area, the congregation fell from a high of 100 in 1913 to a low of 14 in 1924. In 1975, the congregation totaled 60; mostly women. Today, the church is boarded closed.
- 2X. The main elevation faces east. Additional features of this side steepled church include an off-centered hipped roofed porch with turned wooden porch supports; double-door wooden entry placed below a transom; multipaned double-hung fenestration with Gothic-styled wooden pointed arch surrounds has been boarded up. A two-story bell-cast roof tower is placed at the south elevation. Brick chimney side right. A non-contributing concrete block building to the north of the church now is the location of the congregation.



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
- The Independence Boulevard Christian Church's original unit (east) or main auditorium was built in T. 1905. Mr. R. A. Long offered to build an educational building and a gymnasium. The buildings to the west and southwest of the original 1905 unit were constructed in 1910 as the educational facility and gymnasium. In addition a three-story clubhouse which was connected to the annex building at the basement level was also constructed at that time. The club house was for young men and the building faces onto Sixth Street. This construction cost \$200,000. The educational building was equipped with two pipe organs. The gymnasium had a flying track, a white tile swimming pool, parallel bars, Indian clubs and dumbbells. In 1920 Mr. Long gave the church a carillon. Eleven bells of copper and tin weighing fifteen tons were hung in a tower atop the Educational Building. Cast into the largest bell was "Given in appreciation for the friendship of Mr. & Mrs. D. O. Smart by Mr. & Mrs. R. A. Long." The original address was 2905 Independence Boulevard. In 1921 the church purchased the Walpole Resdience at the northeast corner of Sixth and Gladstone to be used as a parsonage.
- The main facade faces north. Additional features include; colossal monolithic lonic stone columns; main 2X. facade Bedford stone-remainder grey brick; two classical pedimented portico or entryways; pediments have antefix, denticulated cornice; triple entrances, paired glass doors with fishscale transoms; first story windows have denticulated entablature hoods with ornate brackets and sills supported by triglyph; dome on eastern portion; carillon with pyramidal roof on western portion; basement level is phoenix stone: west elevation has two vertical light-over-two vertical light sash windows with stone stills. The south portion (Clubhouse, 2832 East 6th Street) is attached to the rear of the church. The main facade of this section faces Sixth Street. Wooden Doric columns support a flat roof porch; fenestration is one-over-one or fixed windows with stone sills and cut stone lintels; entrance is multi-light door with sidelight; semi-circular dormers.





- T. The parish for this church was canonically established in 1906. The first pastor was Father John Keyes. The original site for the church and school was at Fortieth & Tracy Streets. In 1909, part of lots 23 and all of 24, Troost Highland Addtion, were purchased from R. S. Asbury at a cost of \$39,000. There was a house on the site which was used as a rectory. In 1910, the remainder of lot 23 and part of lot 22 wese deeded to Father Keyes. The following year the present church was built and modeled after St. James Episcopal Church in London. The architects, Sanneman and Van Trump declined to take a fee for their design. The church was completed Dec. 22, 1912. The Carthage limestone used in the construction of the church came from the top 65 ft. of the Winner Piers (forerunner of ASB Bridge). The stone was mined in Cotton Falls, Ks. in 1887 and cost \$19,000. The church itself cost \$40,000 to construct and originally had a seating capacity for 430 persons. There are no pillars in the church. The church was dedicated on Aug. 24, 1913. In 1924, a \$60,000 addition to the east of the church was begun. New stained glass was installed in this addition. This addition was dedicated in 1925. In 1927 a \$40,000 Kilgen organ was installed and 1965 the high altar and communion rail were removed. The rectory is to the west of the church and connected by a 102 foot colonnade.

Additional features of the church include: twin towers (north tower belfry); main entrance centrally placed and placed within blunt arch with stone voussoirs; buttress flanking entrance supports; cut stone stepped coursing; stained glass windows with sills and blunt arches on first story of towers and on north and south facades; triple rectangular windows with continuous stone sills in towers; cut stone parapet; stone cross at ridge; stone retaining wall surrounds property on west and north; cornerstone north tower. - T. A resolution to establish the church was passed by the Missouri conference of the United Brethern in Christ at the 1905 annual session. The lot for the church was purchased for \$2,590. Groundbreaking took place on April 6, 1907. The Church was dedicated on Oct. 24, 1907. It cost \$30,000 to construct. In 1922-24, the Church was remodeled and the second floor added to the education wing, which was rededicated November 29, 1925. This church was the first of the original denomination to be built in Kansas City.

The Northeast Community Center, featuring a double-door wooden entry flanked by lonic columns and set in a gabled arch, is joined to the church by a three-story bell-tower. The fenestration of the Community Center is non-original double-hung, sash, metal with brick sills; fixed multipaned units with awning-type units set in blind arches. The Davis Education Building, a non-contributing building, lies to the west. A stone retaining wall with wrought-iron fence lines the property.

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- T. In the spring of 1900, funds for the Oakley United Methodist Church were raised. One of the first lots in the new addition developed by the Abington Land Company was purchased as a site. The plans for the church were designed in 1900 by local architects Shepard and Farrar. All native stone was used in the construction of the church from a quarry located in what is now Kessler Park. On August 31, 1902, the cornerstone was laid and on February 22, 1903 the church was dedicated. Total cost of the construction was \$33,000.00
- 2X. The main elevation faces south. Additional features include two main entrances in the three story crenellated tower bay; one double wooden door (south) and a sliding patio door (west) set in cast stone pointed arch surrounds with transoms featuring art glass tracery. Tower bay also includes prominent buttressing and art glass fenestration set in lancet arches. A semi-hexagonal bay at the west facade of the 1902-03 structure features lancet style art glass windows, buttressing and crenelated roof line. Additional entry at the north bay of the west facade. The Chapel unit to the east features multiple tripartite art glass window units with wood surrounds and wide sills. Each bay unit is separated by prominent stone buttressing. Clerestory windows are paired, in multiples, and are lancet style art glass. Other features include modillions with lion heads at the first story eave, modillions at the second story and an entrance at the east entry of the south facade featuring a semi-hexagonal bay, multipaned art glass and a gabled porch entry with carved rafter tails and vergeboard. Prominent exterior stone chimney. A buff-brick addition was constructed to the north facade c. 1960s.

- The Independence Avenue Baptist Church was designed by J.G. Breacklein, a Kansas City Architect. The cost of the building was approximately \$25,000.00. Excavation of the site began in November, 1911. The cornerstone was laid on August 11, 1912. Construction was completed that year. A non-contributing addition was constructed to the north side of the building in 1966.
- 2X. The main elevation faces east. Additional features include three symmetrically placed double-door entrances with wide stone lintels. Main facade is dominated by four colossal Doric columns which support a wide entablature and prominent pediment with oculus. Brick arches with keystones and screwbacks crown these units. Exaggerated eaves, corbeling and cast stone belt coursing. Non-contributing brick addition connected to the north elevation by an enclosed walkway.

- T. Saint John's Episcopal Church began in 1890 as St. John's Mission. In 1902 the present lot was selected and an earlier chapel was moved to the lot that same year. The church was being built as money came in. Although free of debt, but not quite finished, it was consecrated in October 1905. A memorial window to Rt. Rev. 

- T. The congregation of B'nai Jehudah was originally organized in 1870. Two locations served as temples before this structure was built. The cornerstone of this structure was laid in October, 1907, and the construction was completed in September 1908. It remained the only Reform Congregation in Kansas City and the largest Reform group in the Middle West. An annex to the structure (south end) designed by Greenebaum, Hardy and Schumacher, was constructed in 1920.
- 2X. The main elevation faces north. Additonal features of this massive temple include six colossal fluted Doric columns resting on cast-stone plinths. A wide, unadorned pediment with multiple acroterions rests above a wide entablature. Flve non-original metal double-door entrances with glass transoms are set in cast-stone denticulated entablatures with ancons resting below pediments. Colossal pilasters separate the entrances. Fenestration is sliding-type, metal multipaned units (non-original) set in cast-stone surrounds with ancons. Secondary elevations feature non-original metal window units separated by colossal pilasters and decorative spandrels. A secondary entry is located at the southwest corner and features a wide denticulated entablature resting on classically-inspired piers. The rear addition features double-hung, sash-type and sliding fenestration with an ornately decorated entry at the west elevation featuring motifs incorporated in the original structure. A prominent water table is also featured.

Stained glass windows were designed by John La Farge to typify the ten periods of Jewish history.



- The cornerstone for the church was laid October 7, 1923. In 1940 the Sunday School wing, also designed by G. B. Franklin, was constructed. Both the Sunday School wing and church were designed in the Norman Gothic, style. The original congregation of this church was the oldest German church in the city, having occupied a site at Thirteenth and Oak for four decades. The lot for the present church was purchased in 1921 for \$9,000. The church was dedicated August 3, 1924. The cost for the construction of the church was \$150,000. The organ for the church, costing \$125,000, was given in honor of William Volker. In 1940, a new chancel was designed by George Franklin, as well as a new Sunday School to the west, and a general remodeling of the church. The chancel is of the "Lutheran type"--the altar and reredos with space on both sides for vested choir of forty. The Jamison Temple rededicated this church in 1968 and it serves African-American community.

- T. This school building was originally built as Our Lady of Guadalupe School. Our Lady of the America's School, its present name, is a consolidated school, composed of the former schools of the Immaculate Conception and Sacred Heart Parishes. Our Lady of Guadalupe School was established in 1915. In 1919, the property where the school is located was donated to the parish by Judge William T. Johnson. When the school was first begun in 1915, it was located in a store building at Twenty-first and Belleview. The school took only children who could not speak English. In 1925, the present site was purchased. In 1927, a city-wide campaign was begun to raise funds to build the school on the property. The new school was dedicated August 21, 1927, and cost \$35,000 to construct. "Our Lady of Guadalupe School was one of the few schools in the city with a fresh air room for tubercular children." It was discontinued in 1942. The school was consolidated in 1966. In 1981, its status changed to a parochial school. In 1991, the school became a co-operative program and on December 12, 1991, its name was changed back to Our Lady of Guadalupe School.

Additional features of the building include: exposed stone basement level; projecting central bay housing main entrance, entrance placed within stone rounded arch surround; brick sills and lintels; triple windows in rounded arches above entrance; decorative parapet above projecting pavillion, tile half-hipped roof.

- T. The Community Christian Church was designed in 1940 by the reknown architect Frank Lloyd Wright and completed by the prominent Kansas City architect, Edward Buehler Delk in 1941. Wright's original plan had called for a light steel frame, flexible in shape, resting on a rock ballast foundation. The steel skelton was to be covered by heavy paper strung with steel wires (Steeltex) and then waterproofed with Gunite (sprayed cement). This design created problems with the building codes and subsequently led to Wright's withdrawal from the project. The church was completed by Delk (bringing the design within code requirements). The church was dedicated on Jan. 4, 1942 with 1,500 persons attending. In 1942-1943 theater type seats were added to the sanctuary. Because of budget and wartime shortages of material, the parking terrace, fellowship hall and small chapel were never built to Mr. Wright's designs. The Bonfils Chapel was designed by Herbert E. Duncan and dedicated Sept. 24, 1944. In addition to being an architect, Rev. Duncan was an assistant minister of the church, in 1945-46 served as senior minister of this church. The fellowship hall was added in two stages beginning in 1947. In 1953-54 the Youth Center building was erected across 46th Street to the north of the church. This church is significant as the only church designed by Frank Lloyd Wright in Kansas City and as an example of free form church design. Wright called this church "The Church of the Future".
- 2X. This church, in keeping with Wright's original design features a hexagonal plan, cantilevered balconies and low canopies, horizontal emphasis, small fixed ribbon windows along the northeast and southeast corner of the structure-second story. There are five entrances on main facade (north) three modern glass aluminum frame doors and two original two glass panel in metal frame. Entrances in north facade are five paired glass aluminum frame doors. To the left of this entrance is a brass plaque that reads "Community Christian Church erected 1942." Perforated concrete dome (Wright called it "perforated Gunite latern.") on roof. Wright used this instead of a steeple.

- T. A barn of the church property was used as a church office and Father McDonald lived with his parents at 5101 Main until Aug. 1917. In August, McDonald rented a home at 5125 Walnut where he lived until the new parish house, constructed north of the Church, was completed on Oct. 1, 1919, for a cost of \$20,000. This addition is now the Church office.
- 2X. Additional features of Visitation office include an off-centered entrance, with sidelights, west elevation; multiframed wooden casement windows with multipaned art glass fan light transoms set in brick surrounds at the first-story; double-hung sash-type multipaned windows with brick surrounds and wrought-iron balconetts; secondary elevation features double-hung sash-type fenestration with brick surround and stone sills. 

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- T. A permanent church and parish house was planned for this site in the spring of 1915. On June 6, 1915, the cornerstone for the church was laid and first mass was offered on December 25, 1916. Finally on May 6, 1917, the church was dedicated. Patterned after the California Missions (i.e. Santa Barbara Mission). The architecture of this church quite possibly influenced J. C. Nichols and his concept for the Country Club Plaza. The towers were added in 1935. The church was totally renovated in 1974 by local architect John Lawrence Daw. The addition to the rear of the church was constructed in 1953 and named the St. Anne Chapel. It is now called Tighe Hall.
- 2X. The main elevation faces west. Additional features of this church include three recessed paneled wood double-door entrances set in deep niches. Fenestration includes twin tripartite windows with artglass separated by engaged columns and pilasters set below decorative entablatures. Each unit rests in the first-story of each three-story tower. Other features include carved wooden and stone brackets, arched art glass windows and buttresses. Arcades at north and south elevations connect church to church office and Priest's residence. The south arcade features a mosaic clad niche with a statue of Our Lady of Fatima and a bas relief.



- T. Ground was broken for this church on Dec. 26, 1943. Due to wartime restrictions on building, permission to construct had to be first obtained from the government. Plans by the architects were reviewed by the City's Art Commission. The church was dedicated Sept. 8, 1946. The church won an AIA, K.C. award in 1947. Architects for the church were Carroll and Dean, Joseph Shaughnessy, Sr.
- The main elevation faces north. Dimensions are 143' x 54' x 67'. Additional features of this building 2X. include a coffered wooden, double-door entrance set below a coffered pointed arch double panel. Entry set into a ribbed, pointed arch recess, placed within a crenelated portal flanked by massive stone piers. Fenestration includes leaded and art glass tracery windows set within pointed arch surrounds. Buttressing with amortizements and a small domed bell tower also articulate the exterior. A porte-cochere is located at the west elevation, while a pointed arched cloister is located at the east facade. Sanctuary furnishings designed by Charlton Fortune of the Monterey Guild, Portsmouth, Rhode Island. Stations of the Cross designed by John H. Benson. Stones for the exterior were mined, cut and arranged by Marco Pellegrino. The main elevation features an acroterion of a cross flanked by statues of Sts. Peter and Paul. A stone retaining wall with decorative lanterns located along the north property line.

- This building originally housed a community of Catholic nuns. The convent included both living quarters and a chapel which was located next to the campanile. The nuns were members of the order of the Benedictine Sanctuary of Perpetual Adoration, founded in 1875 in the U.S. The architects for this church were Joseph B. Shaughnessy, Sr. and Edwin L. Bowers. J.E. Dunn was the builder. In August 1982, the church was closed because of increasing costs to run the facility. In November, 1984, the complex was closed and the property sold to Youth For Christ for \$750,000. This organization renovated the building and adapted its use for housing and support services for unmarried parents.
- 2X. The main entry faces north. Additional features of this massive building include a recessed paneled, double-door entrance set in a stone portal, placed below a carved stone tympanum. "Benedectine Sanctuary of Perpetual Adoration" is carved below the tympanum. Flanking the main portal are blind arches resting on columns and framed by stone surrounds. Above the portal is a prominent stone rosette window flanked at the top and bottom with carved stone figures. The entrance to the Benedictine Convent of Perpetual Adoration is placed at the north elevation of the south portion of the building. It is recessed and placed in a decorative stone surround. Fenestration of the Convent is multipaned, metal casement with brick lintels, stone sills, and transoms. First-story fenestration is placed in a blind arch surround. Other features include brick corbeling, a five-story bell tower, two apses (north and south facades) fixed arched fenestration, stone belt coursing, additional entrances at the east elevation and a courtyard (The Light House Garden of Prayer) at the north elevation.

- T. A temporary church, completed in October, 1921, was first located at this present site. On October 6, 1921, the Wornall Baptist Church was formally organized. In 1928, a new campaign was started to raise funds for the church to construct a new building. When it was completed in 1930, the Wornall Road Baptist Church was the only Baptist Church south of 39th Street and West of Harrison. The architects were Felt, Dunham and Kriehn.

The Tracy property was traded for \$3,000 and the remaining cost was taken out on a loan. That same year, the congregation moved to this location. In 1938, the Pleasant View Baptist Church Congregation occupied this building. Then in 1990, the New Hope Baptist Church moved to this building. Recently, the House of Refuge Pentecostal Church purchased the building.
- 2X. The main elevation faces east. Original entrance has been altered. Non-original metal door with wide stone lintel. Fenestration at east facade has also been drastically modified with brick infill and glass block at the first-story level; aluminum frame double-hung sash units and brick infill at the second-story. Tower unit window has been boarded up. Stone lintels and lug sills remain. Segmental arched fenestration (divided by brick buttressing) at north elevation has been infilled with brick. Fenestration at south elevation has also been modified with glass block and art glass. Segmental arched fenestration at west facade has been infilled with brick or boarded over; four double-hung, sash metal frame units remain. Non-continuous belt course. Brick oculus.

Construction of St. Therese of the Little Flower School began in May, 1926, and the first classes were held in Jan., 1927, when the first story of the school was completed. In September, 1932, the second story of the school building was completed, including three classrooms and a gymnasium.
- 2X. The main elevation faces west. Additional features include a non-original double door metal entry with multipaned transom set in a wide entablature surround and flanked by classically-inspired piers. "St. Therese's School" is carved into a frieze above the entryway. Above the entry is a tripartite arched window unit with multipanes, brick surround and sills set into a recessed blind arch. Arched brick corbeling, set below contrasting brick patterns, is placed below the main gable end. Original metal fenestration has been replaced with fixed and awning type units. Original brick sills and lintels extant. Wide eaves feature carved wooden brackets. A brick faced addition built to the north features the same metal windows units. It was constructed in 1960.

In July 1910 the church was hit by lightning and a good portion of the church was destroyed by fire. Immediately following the fire rebuilding and a re-dedication occurred. William Schrage was the architect used in the rebuilding. In 1921 the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, Sloan Lodge No. 729 purchased the church. The building was remodeled at that time by William Feaman, builder.

Additional features include: slab door entrance centrally placed, sash-typhe windows, twin gables echo lines of large gable, first story covered with vinyl siding, exposed full stone basement- north and south elevation. The original church design was most probably a vernacular gable end type.



- T. Ground was broken for the construction of this church on August 5, 1925 and the church was dedicated in August 1926. Construction costs were in excess of \$90,000. Upon completion of the church, the Bishop referred to its interior as "heaven". Basement walls were constructed of Carthage stone laid on 4" concrete base. Walls are 10 ft. high. The Sanctuary floor is marble over 8" of concrete. The nave floor is terrazzo over concrete. The stained glass windows depicted scenes of the five joyful and five glorious mysteries of the rosary and some other Bibical scenes. Dante Cosentino did the stencilling work. The Reuter's pipe organ was designed and custom built to fit the size and acoustics of the church. In 1958, a new school building was constructed at a cost of \$240,000. In 1960 the high altar was removed; communion rail, oak pulpit and side altars were removed. On Jan. 15, 1991 the last mass was said. Holy Trinity, St. Michael's, and St. Stephen's and St. Stanislaus parishes were closed by the diocese as part of a consolidation plan. In 1993, the church is being rented to the Church of Christ of Latter Day Saints.
- 2X. The main elevation faces west. Additional feaures include twin towers with diamond pattern brick; brick corbeling blind arcade with Doric stone columns in upper belfry section of towers, three door entrance panel; central door is covered by projecting cut stone rounded arch door head resting on ornate stone brackets. Door head is supported by stone Doric columns; cut stone wide lintel over entrances; ornate stone tympanum over central door; rectangular brick panel comprised of herringbone pattern brick and stone oculus is above entrances, cut stone niches (statues gone) flank the rectangular panel; triparite rounded arch windows with continuous stone sill are placed within a large rounded arch brick surround; tympanum consists of oculus of checkerboard brick motif placed within alternating raised brick; central projection further embellished with corbel blind arcade; cut stone coursing, cut stone parapet; crosses on towers and transcept gables; cornerstone reads "1925", cut stone water table; course stone basement.

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- Т. In 1902, the lot at the northwest corner of Linwood and Olive was purchased and services were held in a tent at this location. The church basement was constructed in 1902, with the first service held in January 1903. The church was dedicated June 26, 1904 and cost \$17,606.49 to construct. Beginning as early as 1910, plans for a new auditorium were begun. The basement for the auditorium was completed by May 15, 1915 at a cost of \$12,000. In 1920, a \$100,000 auditorium was added to the frontage of the church to the east. A building was erected to house the men's Bible Class Room. The auditorium was dedicated March 14, 1920. In 1923 a lot facing Olive Street north of the church was purchased. A two-apartment flat was remodeled into Sunday School rooms in 1924. It was called Chesney Hall, in memory of Fred L. Chesney, an early and active member of the congregation. In 1925 an electric revolving cross was installed above the church (extinct). In 1949 this church was considered the largest Methodist congregation in the mid-west. In 1951 a two story addition was added to the east of the church. It includes a social hall, chapel, kitchen, Boy Scout room, women's lounge and seven Sunday school rooms. This addition cost \$150,000. The architect for this addition was Richard Wakefield and the builder Hiram Elliot Construction Co. Walter Lovitt, architect designed the church in 1912-13, several years before it was built, he also designed the 1920 addition. In 1975 the congregation united with Linwood Presbyterian Church to become Linwood United Church.

Additional features of this church include centrally placed entrance; the entrance is framed by cut stone surround; a signature stone with "Linwood Boulevard Methodist Episcopal Church" is above the entrance; cut stone water table; windows are art glass with cut stone quoin surrounds placed in pointed arches or rectangular frames, stone sills, crenellated and gable parapet; stone coping. The 1951 addition is two-story yellow brick with cut stone trim and false half-timbering on second story; second story windows are double hung sash. Building is connected to church by a gable parapet covered walkway. At one time the address for the church had been 2400-2404 Linwood.

The church was designed by Rudolf Markgroff and constructed in 1907. Dedication was Nov. 11, 1907. Services at the time of dedication were in German in the morning and English in the afternoon. Total cost of construction was \$16,000. In 1922 the Sunday School annex was built to the west.
- 2X. The main entrance faces southeast. Additonal features include: hexagonal tower located at southeast corner; entrance, paired wooden doors with single light, is recessed in tower; stone columns with raised stone banding support a curved pediment; date plate of 1907 above portico; oculus windows with voussoir surrounds and keystones are on tower, tower capped with slate bell roof; remaining fenestration in tower are stained glass sash windows with transom, flat arch of stone voussoirs and stone lug sills; east and south facades have curved "Mission-like" parapets; oval window with stone surround in parapet; south and east elevation divided into three bays by stone piers; rounded head stain glass windows with stone voussoir lintels and stone sills in each bay; basement windows are 1/1 light, double hung sash with flat stone lintel and sills; top portion of the lantern at the north end of the east facade has been removed, two story addition on west covered with siding.

- T. The first service of the Budd Park Christian Church was held on Dec. 1, 1907. No formal dedication was planned until the construction of the church was complete. The 1907 building campaign consisted of a basement with a roof. On June 7, 1914, the building was completed and dedicated. In 1932, a large gymnasium was added to the building and in 1964, an addition was constructed to the west facade. At that time, the original building was remodeled. In 1952, a fire caused extensive damage to (offices, classrooms) the church. Repairs were completed by April of that year.
- 2X. The main elevation faces north. Additional features of this Temple-front church include symmetrically-placed double-door (glass panel/wood frame) entrances. The central entrance features a molded stone elliptical arch and stone surround, while the flanking entrances feature molded entablature surrounds. A Roman Doric portico featuring four colossal columns on stone plinths rest below a prominent denticulated pediment and a wide classically-inspired entablature. Fenestration of the main facade is fixed and casement style with shouldered architrave surrounds. First-floor fenestration features transoms and molded entablature surrounds. Entrances feature spoke-patterned cut stone panels. The west and east elevations feature art glass arched windows with plaster spandrels, cast-stone keystones and brick surrounds. Art glass has been covered with protective plastic. In addition there are fixed and casement style windows (far north bays) which repeat the design of the fenestration found at the main facade. Basement fenestration has been infilled with brick and features cast-stone lintels. The 1932 gymnasium, added to the south facade features double-hung and multipaned casement fenestration and a metal door entry at the north facade. Additional features include cast-stone unadorned and molded string coursing, denticulation, and a wide molded water table. The 1964 building unit was added to the west elevation.



In 1904, a 125' x 145' lot at the northwest corner of St. John Avenue and Quincy was purchased for \$1600 for the site of the Holy Cross Church. The cornerstone for the church was laid July 10, 1904. Although not furnished, the church was used by 1905. In 1912-14, a 40' addition was made to the north end of the church. The addition was used as a school for boys. In 1916, work resumed on the church the foundation was extended; walls built to intended height; tower built; new roof replaced temporary one. The church was finally dedicated Nov. 4, 1917. In 1928 the bell tower was purchased from the Bethany Baptist Church. The church cost \$25,000 to construct. In 1944 the church interior was redecorated by Dante Cosentino. The church was renovated in 1961, 1977- a new altar was installed; some pews rearranged-cost of renovation was \$83,000 and work done by Jean Poulin. In 1984 stained glass windows were sealed.
- 2X. The main facade faces south. Additional features include: crenelated bell tower-side placed; entrance, double paired aluminum frame glass doors with tympanum, entrance is recessed and placed within segmental stone arch; "HOLY CROSS" in raised stone is above the entrance; above the lettering in an outstanding art-glass window with wood tracery; sandstone quoining surrounds the entrance and window; stone coping at roof line, stone buttressing, stone cross acroterion, fleche. Fenestration is art-glass windows with wood tracery, stone lug sills and flat stone slightly pointed arched lintels. Cornerstone reads "Holy Cross 1904, 'IN HOC SIGND VINCES'".



- T. In 1910, Otis Goddard designed a structure which was to be used as a printing plant for Unity. The 40 x 70 foot building consisted of a basement and one story, although it was designed to carry an additional two stories. In 1914, Boillot and Lauck prepared plans to modify the building which at this time had an additional story added. Boillot and Lauck's design was to add a Classic Greek temple front to the 1910 building. This extension carried the building to the edge of the street line. In 1917, Boillot designed the central wing of the building which was placed perpendicularly to the original 1910 structure. During the 1950s, the building received an extensive warehouse addition to the rear and to the south.
- 2X. The main elevation faces west. Additional features include colossal fluted engaged Doric columns flanking a geometric patterned metal entry with cast-stone surround. Columns support a massive unadorned entablature which rests below a pediment that features geometric patterning and carved, cast-stone griffons. Egg and dart molding separates the entablature from the pediment. Piers with acanthus leaf decorated capitols are also featured. Original primary facade windows have been boarded up or modified. Remaining fenestration is double-hung, sash-type with cast-stone sills and decorative brick spandrels. Secondary elevation fenestration is segmental arched with cast-stone lintels. A large, one-story addition with ribboned casement-style windows is located at the south elevation. The Salvation Army Adult Rehab Center and Thrift Store and large warehouse have also been added.

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
- T. In 1922 a tract of land on the southside of Forty-Second Street from Virginia to Tracy Avenues was purchased. In 1924 the basement for the church was built and dedicated November 9, 1924. The construction cost for the church basement and parsonage was approximately \$40,000. The attached parsonage to the west was completed before the church and was constructed in 1924. Construction on the superstructure of the church began in 1931. The church cost \$80,000 to construct. The church was dedicated in Dec. 1931. The organ was a gift of the ladies' aid and Darcas Society of the church. In 1941 a school building was constructed across the street and to the west of the church. Both the church and the parsonage were designed by Phillip Drotts. Original plan called for the school to be attached to the church to the east. Although the church faces 42nd Street, the main entrance is on the Tracy Avenue side.
- 2X. The main facade of the church faces west. Additional features of the church include: entrance located in crenelated, 76 foot, corner tower; entrance-paired double wood doors with art glass transom; entrance placed within compound pointed arches; large cut stone tracery art glass windows cut stone slant sills; cut stone surrounds, compound pointed arch; additional fenestration consists of multi-light art glass with flat or arch lintels and stone sills; cornerstone reads "Immanuel E. V. Lutheran Church solided gloria 1931."; stone finials-tower, illuminated cross, cupola; small one-story annex building east elevation. The attached parsonage to the south is stucco; fenestration is sash-type windows, jerkinhead roof; gable dormers; exposed stone basement with overhead panel garage door at north end; entrance, asymmetrical is multi-light and wood panel door.



- T. The St. James Recreation Center was constructed in 1939 and designed by the architects Edgar Madorie and S. W. Bihr, Jr. The building was dedicated Oct. 27, 1939. Father Keyes was pastor of St. James parish at the time of the construction of this building. The building was constructed to be used by the entire community. "The parish wanted to provide a place where the children and grown-ups of all faiths may come and plan in sound and wholesome surroundings."
- 2X. The building originally measured 50' x 125'. It originally contained a foyer, lounge, large hall for athletic and social events. Additions to the rear were added in 1940 and 1941. Additional features of the building include; double wooden door entrance; casement windows with brick sills; small iron balconuy with font over entrance, cut stone medallions (head of boy with basketball-right, and girl with tennis racket-left) flank the entrance and are the prominent decoration on the building; brick cornice consists of alternating six headers and six stretchers and barrel vault roof.

- T. In 1914 a lot was purchased for the construction of this church. The foundation was laid immediately and the church was dedicated January 16, 1916, costing \$60,000 to complete. Owen and Payson's design included a parsonage adjoining the auditorium, Sunday school rooms and ladies parlor in the basement, and the auditorium, vestry, study and council room on the main floor. At the time of construction the large art glass window over the main entrance was to be the largest in the city. In 1922, a balcony was added and organ was enlarged. On March 24, 1923, an application was made to change the name of the church to St. Mark's Lutheran Church. In 1924, the lot west of the church was purchased in order to build a parish house. Also included in the plans at that time were the enlargement of the auditorium, a new parsonage, and general remodeling. The three-story Tudor design parish house was designed by Shephard and Wiser, architects. The original parsonage was incorporated into the 1924 addition when the auditorium was expanded, and an existing residence to the south was purchased (Charles H. Surber Residence) and used as the parsonage. It should be noted that the intent of the architects for the 1924 addition (parish house) was to design a building which would preserve the residential nature of the street.
- 2X. The church originally measured 66' x 110'. The main entrance faces east. Additional features of the church include: corner towers (north-belfry); crenelated projection first story; entrance recessed and centrally placed; stepped cut stone parapet with pointed arch and shield motif over entrance; windows have stone lintels and sills, large stained glass window framed within cut stone arch surround with drip stone; cut stone coping; decorative stone cross at ridge; north elevation stucco, false half-timber, 1/1 double hung sash window; stone retaining wall and iron fencing run along property.

- T. A building expansion program for a new library and chapel was announced on Dec. 17, 1945 by Rev. Lewis B. Carpenter, president of the Kansas City National Training School for Christian workers where the chapel was to be built. At that time it was also announced that the name of the school was changed to the National College for Christian workers. The Chapel was a gift to the school on the condition that the donor's name not be revealed, but later this condition was recinded. The cornerstone was laid on Sept. 27, 1948. Named in honor of Anna E. Kresge who left \$175,000 to the school, the chapel was completed in 1949 at a cost of \$225,000.
- 2X. The main elevation faces west. Additional features include a recessed wooden paneled double-door entry crowned by a deeply recessed fanlight with molded surround and carved ancon. Below the fanlight is a wide, molded entablature. Entry is flanked by pilasters. The entire entry unit is placed below a denticulated pediment with wide entablature supported by wide wooden piers. A larger denticulated pediment, where the tower and spire are placed, crowns the primary facade. The tower unit features a belfry embellished with arched multipaned fenestration and multiple engaged columns which support a wide molded entablature. A slate covered spire with the station of the cross rests above the belfry. Fenestration at the main facade, far west bays of the south and north elevation and rear unit, is double-hung, sash-type multipaned with wide cast stone lintels and sills. North and south facades also feature multipaned fenestration with multipaned arched transoms or fanlights, cast stone keystones and sills. A continuous cast stone water table further embellishes the exterior. Cornice is denticulated. Basement fenestration is casement style. Additional entrances at south and east facades.

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- In 1925, a church extension board of the Church of God (11th and Topping) was organized and the general assembly decided to give the central organization power of control (over church property). The congregation, that year, moved forward with a building plan and in August, became affiliated with the general conference of Undenominational Churches. The first story of the new building was occupied in Feb. 1926. The remainder of the church was completed in 1927; total cost was \$40,000. The original address was 5801 E. 15th Street.
- 2X. The main elevation faces north. Two, multipaned double-door entrances placed at far end bays of main elevation. Entrances, which are set below a wide cast-stone name tablet (with First Church of God carved into the tablet), also feature cast stone surrounds. Central bay features a prominenet multipaned arched window with brick arch surround and cast stone keystone. Transom has been modified. Secondary elevation fenestration is multipaned arched with cast stone keystones and lug stills, and double-hung mulitpaned with cast stone keystones and scewbacks. Basement level fenestration is double-hung sash multipaned with cast stone lug sills. Other details include pressed metal cornice, cast stone belt coursing, additional entrances, and cast stone finals.

Tripartite art glass units in addition to paired art glass units and multipaned sash units are also featured. The 1948 addition features a multipaned double-door set in an recessed gable with false half timbering, fixed art glass windows and casement fenestration.

- T. In 1910, the Van Brunt Church of Christ was organized. The first service at this location was held on May 25, 1930. Construction of this church began in January, 1930, and the building was completed in May of that year. Cost of construction was approximately \$25,000.

Plans for a new church, to replace the building at 1424 Pennsylvania, began that same year and in Sept. 1908, construction was started. This stone church was built for \$20,000 and finished in 1909. Built of native limestone, the original design included a kitchen, dining room, pantry and women's parlor as well as an auditorium and classrooms. Formal dedication of the church occurred on Feb. 6, 1910.

- T. The lot for this church was purchased in 1911 from the Kansas City Athenaeum for \$10,000. The following year plans for the building were discussed which included a fireproof structure of steel, concrete, and carthage granite. The basement level was to be used for Sunday School with the auditorium above. The basement was built first and totally paid for before the rest of the building was started. Contract for the basement was let on March 19, 1913, the cornerstone was laid July 5, 1913 and the first service was held December 17, 1913. Within two years the entire debt was paid for. The superstructure was begun in the spring of 1921 and cost \$200,000 to construct. The first service in the new portion was July 9, 1922 and the building was dedicated April 13, 1926. "No church of this denomination is ever dedicated until wholly free from debt."

- T. In 1924, the Methodist City Missionary Society bought a lot at the corner of 56th and Wayne Avenue and built a stucco chapel. The original chapel was enlarged in 1926. At this time it was announced that St. Pauls Methodist Episcopal would be disbanded and merged with Paseo Methodist. In 1926, the congregation also purchased a lot at the southeast corner of 59th and Paseo. The present church at the site at 56th and Paseo was not constructed until 1948.
- 2X. The main elevation faces east. The original elevation faced west. Additional features include a double-door wooden entry placed below pointed arch coffered panels set in a pointed arch portal. The entry portal is flanked by buttresses with slate covered amortizements. A slender steeple rests at the north side of the entry. Fenestration includes leaded art glass units, both rectangular and pointed arch, with contrasting brick surrounds. Bays are divided by buttressing. The large addition, constructed at the east side was built in strict regard to the original materials and features, and carries the integrity of the original design. Architect for this addition was Richard N. Wakefield, 1959.



T. The original name for this parish was "Schutz Angel Kirche", Guardian Angel Church. It was located at the northwest corner of 43rd and Terrace - the chapel was on the second floor and the school and nuns quarters on the first. This parish served all the German-speaking on the south side of the city. In 1912 ground was broken for the present church. Plans were prepared for a Gothic church in the late Northern French Style, executed in Carthage stone, without pillars. Construction began on the superstructure in 1922. The cornerstone was laid May 14, 1922 and dedicated May 4, 1924. The church was designed by H. W. Brinkman, Emporia, Ks. and cost \$150,000 to construct. The main altar was carved in St. Louis by Tarjanny and Hageman Co. The side altars were bought from the Sts. Peter and Paul Church (demolished 1923) as well as the church bell. A school to the north was built in 1955 at a cost of \$200,000. It was designed by Shaughnessy, Bower and Grimaldi, with C. A. Kelly as contractor. In 1962 renovation occurred in the santuary. In 1991 the school was closed.

a new convent was constructed at 4200 mercrer and in 1966 renovation occurred in the sanctuary.

2X. The main elevation faces east. Additional features of the church include triple double door entrances placed within pointed arches; stained glass typmanum with stone tracery including trefoil motif; columns with crocket capitals are located on either side of entrances, twin towers flank main facade, belfry located at southwest corner; stone blind arcade near roof line; stone string coursing, stone water table, buttressing; cut stone pointed arch lintels, large stained glass window with stone tracery above entrance; an acroterion of a statue of an angel with one gold wing and one white wing at the ridge of gable. Cornerstone reads "Guardian Angel Church 1922".

- T. Excavation was begun in 1926 for the erection of a two-story and basement structure for the Centropolis Baptist Church. (Presently behind or to the north and attached to the present church.) The building was constructed and completed in 1927. The building was to be used exclusively as a Sunday School building. Originally the basement level housed the kitchen, dining room and Sunday School rooms. The main floor housed the temporary auditorium with a seating capacity of 450. The second story was used solely for Sunday School rooms (42 rooms). Plans at this time (1927) were to add a larger addition adjoining this building at a later time. The 1927 portion of the building was designed by Ferrand and Fitch, Dallas, Texas. In 1948 the church auditorium was built. The building was designed by B. A. Larson of D. & L. Engineering and Construction Co.; William Rawlings Co. was the general contractor. The original design allowed for a seating capacity of 700. The cost of construction was approximately \$90,000.
- The main facade faces south. Additional features include: centrally placed entrance; double paired slab 2X. doors; lintel above entrance with "Centropolis Baptist Church"; multi-light art glass rounded arch large window above entrance; corbel brick frames window; remaining fenestration multi-light art-glass in pointed arches with concrete sills and pointed arch flat brick lintels; buttress with stone amortizement; east and west elevation fenestration is sash-type windows in wooden frames with transoms; flat roof semi-circular tower at southeast corner; cut stone parapet. Rear section is two story. Cornerstone on this portion reads "Centropollis Baptist Church 1891-1927"; fenestration on this portion is 3/3 vertical lights, sash-type windows with stone sills and stretcher brick lintels; second story windows have stone sill coursing and brick arcading lintels.

- T. This church was originally built in 1912-13 as the Reformed Presbyterian Church at a cost of \$7,900. At the time of construction the auditorium seated 250. The church was originally organized by Rev. J. M. Wylie. Besides an auditorium the building included study and Sunday School rooms, social rooms and kitchen in basement. The church was designed by E. O. Brostrom, architect, and is similar to other churches designed by him.

Additional features of this church include: crenelated stone tower placed to the side; paired wooden doors with stain glass transom; cut stone drip stone over entrance, cut stone water table; 1/1 double hung sash windows in basement; rectangular lancet window with stone sill and lintel in tower; large lancet window with three aureole designs--entire window within Tudor arch; fenestration east facade consists of paired wooden frame lancet windows with various designs including crown, book, shields--all within a circular motif and secondary recessed entrance covered by gable portico near east of north facade.
