

In the Marshall Chick Hatchery is to be found one of the most modern and efficient hatcheries that it is possible to construct. Building and equipment form a unit of large production that can supply the needs of a large territory. In 1928 the hatchery turned out slightly in excess of 310,000 chickens, which were sent over local territory and 26 additional states. The hatchery has a capacity of 108,000 eggs; the system used allows systematic hatching.

The equipment represents many thousands of dollars but

the plant fills a definite need in this territory.


A systematized selection of eggs for the hatchery is carried out. Ten cents per dozen is paid over market price for all eggs selected. The hatchery now has in excess of 15,000 hens under its supervision, assuring a constant supply of high quality eggs. Custom hatching is also done for those people who do not wish to buy chicks.

Mr. J. L. Gordon, the owner, is a graduate in agriculture from Iowa State College at Ames. He has held various important posts in the poultry business and for four years was manager of two large hatcheries in Connecticut and Ohio. He has owned the Marshall Hatchery for two years and intends to increase as much as possible the poultry standards in this territory. He believes in careful selection and breeding from improved lines. Profits from such poultry are much greater and justify the slight additional effort.

This hatchery merits your attention. Chickens of guaranteed stock can be supplied you at a lesser cost than you can produce them. All types of chickens may be had, from Leghorns to the heavier Rocks and Orpingtons. Under the Gordon plan satisfaction is assured.

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

This store stocks a wide variety of merchandise in addition to a full line of groceries. The plan of operation is similar to that followed by chain stores in the cities. Taking advantage of ready cash from quick turnovers, the Deis Cash Store is able to offer first-quality goods at a worth-while discount from prevailing retail prices.

Libby's, Pickwick, FFOG, American Lady, Lee, Campbell's, Monarch, are but a few of the leading brands to be found on the commodious shelves of the Dels Cash Store. Fresh and cured meats from the Morrell, Morris, Swift and Wilson packing companies are protected from the bacteria of putrefaction and kept wholesome by a Frigidaire refrigerating unit which the store has installed in its McCray icer. In addition to these nationally advertised meats the store sells fresh country-cured bacon, lard and sausage, as well as eggs, butter, honey and sorghum from local farmers. The Claycomb Dairy supplies the store's milk. Because the store does a large part of its total volume of business with the farmers of Sa-

line county, it buys many locally grown foodstuffs, among them fresh fruits and vegetables.

No other store in Marshall has such a large coffee trade. Deis' Special Peaberry Coffee is the best seller, but Forbes' Reliable Guatemala is another bulk coffee of wide popularity. Package coffees sold include Folger's, Morning Glory, Blue Jay and Golden Wedding. The store handles Maud S, Sweetheart and Jumbo flours, and Al's and Nafziger's breads and cakes. The Sunshine and National quality lines of cookies and crackers are sold.

Other merchandise includes tobaccos and candies, graniteware, aluminum ware and similar household necessities; ammunition—especially shotgun shells—and so on, even down to alarm clocks.

The present owner of the store, C. M. Deis, joined the ranks of Marshall merchants in 1920, in partnership with his father, A. F. Deis. The store was sold in 1925, and in 1926 the present Deis Cash Store was established by C. M. Deis. There are three employees at the present time. Miss Florence Cochran who owns the Marshall Book Store on the south side of the square has the distinction of being one of the nation's youngest business women. She is just twenty-three.

Yet a visit to her place of business and a glance over its very complete stock would never betray its proprietor as a Goucher student who was abruptly transplanted from that pleasant eastern college atmosphere overnight.

Miss Cochran had been graduated from Goucher College, Baltimore, Maryland, and was enrolled for post-graduate work at George Washington University, Washington, D. C., when she received a telegram informing her that her father had been killed by a railroad train and that it was imperative that she return to Marshall to conduct his book store. How well she met the crisis is a familiar story to this community.

Today the Marshall Book Store affords employment to four people and is daily providing members of the community with the best in current and classical literature. All the popular authors of the day, as well as the masters of the past, are represented. In addition to books and magazines, the Marshall Book Store is headquarters for school and office supplies and stationery. Desirable gifts may be selected from the various specialties on display. For example, the stock includes fountain pens by Carter, Parker and Waterman—three nationally advertised manufacturers of quality goods.

An exclusive line, of personal stationery is offered for that correspondence which "really matters." And who better than Miss Cochran would be able to select such a varied and correct stock of such stationery.

All copyright fiction which is offered in popular priced editions is displayed on the large stand at the front of the store. If your favorite author is not to be found, Miss Cochran or one of her assistants will secure the book for you by return mail. But most of the best sellers are available from stock, making delay unnecessary.

Traditionally book shops are dusty and dingy with a heavy odor pervading them. In this respect at least the Marshall Book Store is not traditional. Everything is as neat as the little proprietress.

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



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

construction of the one-story building will cost in excess of \$1 million. The new edifice is being constructed on the site of the present building and upon the site of adjoining buildings.

In October, the first phase of construction began when the two-story addition to the east of the three-story bank was razed. The two-story portion, the Springate or Allen Building, was acquired by the bank in 1975. Prior to the late 1970s the Springate building and the top floors of the Farmers Savings Bank had provided offices for lawyers, accountants, optometrists, dentists, the draft toard and other agencies and businesses.

"At one time or another, those two buildings housed most of the medical community in Marshall," Hupp said.

The Masonic, Eastern Star and Rainbow Girls temple was housed on the third floor of the bank building. On the ground floor of the east building, numerous retail businesses and municipal utilities occupied the space.

By the end of the late 1970s all offices had been vacated because of the bank's desire to either renovate or rebuild its existing building.

As the bank's services, including a television drive-in facility on the south side of the bank in 1968, expanded, the Farmers Savings Bank acquired property to the south and east of the corner of Arrow and Jefferson streets. Those purchases included a flower shop, garage, implement dealer and gas station.

That property then became a parking lot, thus giving access to the building from both the south and north sides of the block.

The progress through the years

can be traced back to a pivotal point in the bank's history, the Great Depression.

During the depths of the Depression, a decision was made on whether to close the bank or make a run for it and remodel. The feeling was that it would show strength if the bank remodeled," Hupp said.

That rationale must have worked since, after the Depression, two banks survived in Marshall, and one each in Blackburn and Sweet Springs.

Another remodeling of the building was completed in 1959, with the present lobby and bank equipment. Since that time, the television drive-in was aded in the late 1960s and a new Motor Bank was constructed at 1255 S. Odell Ave. in 1980. The Farmers Savings Bank joined Charter Corp. of Kansas City in March. 1980.

However, since the early 1970s the bank had been planning the construction of the new building in its acquisitions of property and the vacating of the offices above the bank and adjoining building.

The new building will be a onestory, completely new edifice, with 9,000 square feet on the main floor and 7,000 square feet on the lower level.

"This is a total commitment to Marshall and the downtown area," said Hupp. "The bank has been on this corner of the square for more than 80 years, and we made a deliberate decision to support the downtown area by the construction of this new building.

"CharterBank Marshall needed to expand facilities for its customers. Because of the need for expansion, the decision was made to explore the possibilities of renovating the old building or constructing a new building," Hupp said.

"But, our commitment has always been to the downtown area," he said.

The new building will have more usable square footage than the present structure, with more efficient useage of that space, he said.

Prior planning called for the renovation of the 81-year-old, three-story building.

"However, with the extreme cost of renovation, combined with the projected increased expense to maintain and operate the old

if the bank were to spend that much money, we could serve our customers better with a one-story, accessible, modern building," he

building, the decision was made that

"Everything will be on the street level, which will be more convenient for our customers. Also, with the demolishment of the old building and the construction of the new, there is an increased efficiency of space, which will aid our conducting of business for our customers."

The first step of construction was the razing of the east portion of the existing building, with 13,000 square feet of street and lower level building constructed. When that wing is completed, the operations of the bank will move to that area. The second step of construction will include the razing of the west, threestory portion of the building, with the construction of an additional 3,000 square feet of street and lower level building. Projected plans call for the construction to be completed in 12-14 months.

An architect's drawing of the new building is on display in the CharterBank Marshall main bank lobby.

Farmers Savings Bank

A brief history of Farmers Savings Bank, Marshall. Mo., by William Catron Cordon:

On June 18, 1870, a group of ten men met in the store room of G. C. Fletcher & Son at Waverly, Mo., to organize the Farmers Savings Bank. The bank was originally capitalized at \$50,000 and opened its doors for business during the last week of July 1870 in Waverly.

In February, 1879, due to the coming of the railroad, the decision was made to move the Farmers Savings Bank to Marshall. It purchased for \$6,500 the building, vault, and other equipment of the then existing Saline County Bank on the east side of the square, and entered into an agreement with the latter bank to take over and liquidate all its assets. One month later, in March 1879, the Farmers Savings Bank discontinued business at Waverly and moved to the new location at Marshall.

On May 14, 1896, the capital stock of the bank was increased from \$50,000 to \$100,000, and its continued growth made necessary a search for larger banking quarters. In 1902, the bank purchased the site formerly occupied by the New York store on the southeast corner of the square. A new 3-story structure, furnished with new equipment. Was completed and occupied in April 1903 and has been one of the business landmarks of Marshall ever since.

Further expansion of the bank resulted in two modernization and remodeling moves in 1929-30 and again in 1960. Included in these modernization activities was the construction of new and larger vault facilities and more efficient utilization of banking space for customer convenience.

Since its inception, the Farmers Savings Bank has had a continuous record of growth.

Startine were deposits of about \$2,900 cm Joll, 30, 1870, by the end of 1562 the bank had total deposits of isone than \$9,700,000. Over the genes capital stock has been in isone to \$250,000 with an equal mount of paid-in surplus as a more than \$750,000 in undivided profits and reserves to prote the depositors.

The bank successfully weathered the fin ocial crises of 1873, 1893 and 1907, and the banking holiday of 1930. Except for a period of a few years following the latter crisis, it has had a continuous record of dividend payments to its stockholders and save for a few days during the 1930 bank no ratorium, when all banks there closed, has continued to serve its customers every business day since its doors were opened

Through the years the Farmers Savings Bank has developed complete banking services for its customers and the community, and has kept pace with modern trends in banking. In February, 1914, the bank opened a savings department, and in the late 1930s put in an "after-hour" depository, being the first financial institution in Marshall to inaugurate those features. In 1942. the bank made another significant move when it established a trust department, and again in 1945 when it became a member of the Federal Reserve System. It has also been a member of the Federal Deposit Insurance corporation since this agency was established in the early 1930s.

Since its organization, nearly 93 years ago, the Farmers Savings Bank has had only six presidents and the combined experience of present bank personnel totals more than 25 years. Many years ago the bank adopted a slogan — "Service That Satisfies" — which has become a familiar trademark to the people of Marshail and Saline county.

CharterBank continues

Charler Sank Marshall, in its 114th year of serving residents and businesses in the mid-Missouri area. is at an important time in its long history

The bank will be moving into its fourth location at the end of this year. Construction of a new building began in October, 1982, and will be completed at the first of the year.

"We are pleased to contribute a new, exhanded, facility to the area


of Marshall's Square," said Alfred R. Hupp, chairman of the board of directors at the bank.

"This bank has long served this community," said E. Joseph Bode, president and chief executive officer, "and, we are continuing that committment to this city's and county's growth."

The bank was founded as the Farmers Savings Bank on June 18. 1870. In the 1870's the bank moved to the east side of the Marshall Square when it acquired the Saline County Banking Co. headquartered there.

The existing building on the southeast corner of the square was constructed in 1901. "Construction began on the building in 1900, with the building being completed in 1901," said Hupp.

In constructing the brick and sandstone three-story building, the bank invested \$55,000. In 1983 the



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

M. E. CHURCH, SOUTH.

The Methodist Episcopal Church, South, was organized in 1842. The first members were Rev. John Hood and wife, Dr. John Hicks (or Hix) and wife, John A. Trigg, Mrs. Rebecca Trigg, Fleming H. Brown, Benoni Robion, and Thomas Davis. The first church building was erected where the Baptist Church now is, on Lafayette street, north of the northwest corner of the square. It was a frame. It still stands, in the rear of the Baptist Church, and is occupied as a dwelling house. During the war and after the fight at Marshall between Shelby and Brown, it was used as a Confederate hospital. It was dedicated by Rev. T. P. Akers. The second church was the present, which was begun in 1870. It was dedicated in October, 1876, by Bishop E. M. Marvin. The church is of brick, and cost, including the site, about \$9,000. The pastors of this church were in its first days Benj. Johnson, -- Jones, Wm. Prots man, Thomas Finney, Thomas Wallace, and others, who were "circuit riders." The pastors proper have been: Rev. M. G. Williams, I. C. Shack elford, W. F. Camp, S. M. Godby, W. M. Page, W. B. Palmore; and E. G. Frazier, present pastor. Present membership, about 200.

The basement of the church building is usually rented out for school purposes, and is rarely used for religious exercises, which are uniformly conducted in the auditorium overhead; this is reached from the central doorway and a stairway through the vestibule, and also by way of a door and stairway in the tower. The choir occupies a gallery containing seats and a fine organ, situated over the vestibule.

ILLIAM HARRISON, M. D. One of the most eminent medical practitioners in the city of Marshall is the gentleman whose name appears above. As his name will suggest, he is a member of that eminent family which has twice received at the hands of the Nation the greatest honors that can be conferred upon an individual. Dr. Harrison was born in Fayette County, Ohio, near Madison Mills, July 8, 1850. He is a son of Capt. Scott Harrison, who was born in Fayette County, Ohio, in 1817, and served during the late war as a member of the One Hundred and Fourteenth Ohio Infantry.

The ancestry of our subject is distinguished and

includes the names of many of the most patriotic men our country has ever had as citizens. Tracing his lineage back several generations, we find Benjamin Harrison, who served as Captain in the Revolution under Gen. George Washington. He was born in Sweetbrier County, Va., married a Miss Vance, moved to Wheeling, W. Va., and in 1783 came down the Ohio River and settled where now stands the town of Cynthiana, which was named in honor of his daughters, Cynthia and Anna. Harrison County, Ky., was named for him.

The children of Benjamin Harrison were William, Cynthia, Anna, Batteal and Aristodes. Willism located in Crawford County, Mo., and had a large family. Batteal was born in Virginia in 1780, and was three years old when his parents moved to Kentucky. As the Indians were troublesome and very hostile, he was left at Wheeling with his Uncle Vance, with whom he remained until he was eighteen. Then removing to Belmont County, Ohio, he there remained until 1811. He enlisted in the United States army at Chillicothe. Ohio, and was commissioned by President Madison First Lieutenant of the Nineteenth Infantry, United States Army, the commission being dated July 12, 1812. He served with ability in that position until March 17, 1811, when he was commissioned Captain of the Second Company of Riflemen, United States Regular Army, and served in that capacity until peace was declared in 1815. He married Miss Elizabeth Scott, of Lexington, Ky., whose brother, M. T. Scott, was Cashier of the Northern Bank of Kentucky for years.

At an early day Gen. Harrison moved to Fayetic County, Ohio, and located a large tract of additional Land in the wilderness on the waters of Paint Creek, which is now Madison Township. He creeted the first cabin in that section of the country, and by industry in a short time had one of the best stock farms in the country. In 1817, he was elected Associate Judge of the Court of Common Pleas for Fayette County. He was also elected Representative to the Ohio Legislature, and was an efficient member of that body. He was a powerful writer and a good thinker. Gen. Harrison was elected and commissioned Brigadier-General in 1858, and served until the repeal of the

military law. The following are the names of Gen. Harrison's children: Benjamin Scott, William H., David V., Joseph and Mary M. John, who served in Company D. One Handred and Fourteenth Ohio Infantry, died in the Civil War. Scott was a Captain in the late were and David was a Lieutenant.

His wife still lives and is a resident of this paty.

Dr. Harrison was educated in Fayette County, Ohio, and at Newton's Prevate School in Marshall, Mo. He began reading with Drs. Tucker and Anderson, now of Colorado Springs, and attended lectures at the St. Louis Medical College, from which he was graduated in 1874. On seeking a location he determined to return to Marshall, and since coming here, nineteen years ago, has established himself in the good graces of scores of patrons. Because of his wife's ill health he has traveled considerably over the Western States, and in these peregrinations practiced for six months at Los Angeles, Cal.

Dr. Harrison is a member of the Saline County Medical Society and is its President. He is also a member of the State Medical Society and an exmember of the American Medical Association, having been a delegate to the Medical Congress held in Washington City. He is local surgeon for the Chicago & Alton Railword - Our subject owns a good farm three miles cast of Napton that comprises two hundred and extrative acres, and also owns a farm of one hundred and ten acres, just north of Nelson. The family home is a beautiful cottage located at No 230 Arrow Street, this city, and its interior arrangement vide books and dainty appointments indicates the self-for and man of refined tastes. He is a member of the Masonic order, belonging to Tridumni Lodge No. 205. Chapter No. 74, and Missouri Commandery No. 36.

Mrs. Harrison was before her marriage Miss Sallie Akin Marmeduke, and a daughter of Col. Vincent Marmeduke of this county. They were married October 4, 1881. Mrs. Harrison was educated in St. Louis, and also attended Monticello Seminary at Godfrey, Ill., then went to Lexington, Mo., where she carried on her stadies in the Methodist Episcopal College. She is a member of the Episcopal Church

DR. WILLIAM HARRISON, physician, P. O., Marshall. Dr. Harrison was born in Fayette county, Ohio, July 8, 1850. In 1865 he came to Cooper county, Missouri, with his parents, and in 1866 moved to this county. He was raised on a farm and educated in the private schools. In 1871 he commenced the study of medicine, and graduated in the St. Louis Medical College in 1874, and he entered on the practice of his profession in Marshall the same year, and has continued there ever since, and stands high in his profession.

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This name recalls much of interest in United States history and carries the memory back to the stirring days of the Revolution. As Doctor Harrison is a lineal descendant of those worthies and thus related to two Pasis deuts, a few remarks of a geneological character will prove of interest. His great-grandfather was Capt, Benjamin Harrison, who held a commission in the Continental army, but had previously gained distinction under Ger. Atdrew Lewis at the battle of Point Pleasant in 1774. He served on the right wing aligned along Crooked creek, and it was the stubborn fighting of dus force that won the day for the American troops. The records show that this gallant officer removed from Wheeling to Kentucky in 1790. He located at Cynthiana, where he built a mill and became so conspicuous that a country (Harrison) was named after him. He was the first member of the Legal lature from Bourbon county when Harrison county was formed from thearbon and Scott. He married a Miss Newell in Virginia, by whom seven children were born, as follows: Batteal, William, Aristides, Catherine, who married Andrew Miller, Jane, who married William Hinkson, Mary and Julian. Two sons, William and Batteal, had noted careers. William a tried in Crawford county, Missouri, about 1817, entered the first land that was taken up after Missouri became organized as a state. He had twelve sons and two daughters. Batteal Harrison, who was born in Virginia in 1788, was three years of age when his parents removed to Kentucky and was left at

Wheeling with his uncle, William Vance, on account of Indian troubles then prevailing on the lower Ohio. In 1811 Batteal Harrison located in Belmont county, Ohio, and on July 6, 1812, he received from President Madison a commission as ensign in the Nineteenth Regiment Infantry, United States Army. On February 1, 1815, he was promoted to the captaincy of the Second Company of Riflemen, in which capacity he served until the conclu-After the war he was appointed adjutant-general of sion of hostilities. Ohio, was subsequently made brigadier-general, and while serving in that office in 1835 refused to muster "corn stalk" militia for the government. In 1817 he was elected the associate judge of the court of common pleas for Favette county, and also served in the Ohio Legislature. He married Filizabeth Scott, of Lexington, Kentucky, daughter of Col. Mathew T. Scott, who received his title during the war of the Revolution. Capt. Scott Harrison. son of Gen. Batteal Harrison, was born February 22, 1817, and gained distinction during the Civil war. In 1862 he organized Company D. One Hundred and Fourteenth Regiment Ohio Volunteer Infantry, of which he was elected captain, and served until the fall of Vicksburg, when he was cischarged by reason of disability, occasioned by illness. When the colonel of his regiment fell, he was promoted to command, but his personal regard for the officer ranking ahead of him caused him to refuse to accept. Subsequently he also declined the office of major, to which he had been elected. After the surrender of Vicksburg, he entered the Ohio militia and commanded his regiment at Chillicothe, during Morgan's raid. He married Frances Young, of Pickaway county. Ohio, and the children by this union were Annetta, Batteal, Vance, Joh V., Elizabeth, William, Belle, John and Jim Cook. He came to Missouri and located in Cooper county in 1865, but the next year removed to Marshall, where he died October 5, 1875. William Harrison, fifth in the above list of children, was born in Madison township. Fayette county, Ohio, July 8, 1850, and consequently was fifteen years old

when his father came to Missouri. He attended school in Fayette county, Ohio, and Saline county, Missouri, and Professor Newton's Academy at Marshall, after which preparation he entered the St. Louis Medical College, from which he was graduated in 1874. For thirty years he has practiced continuously at Marshall, part of the time with Dr. B. St. George Tucker, and for twelve years as a partner of Dr. John B. Wood. During Cleveland's second administration he served as pension examiner and for a time as local surgeon for the Chicago & Alton railroad. He served as county physician, was organizer of and chief medical examiner of the Home Protective Association, founded in Marshall in 1897, and for many years has been local

examiner for leading insurance companies. He is a member of the Saline County, Missouri Valley, district and American Medical associations, and has been president of the society first named. In Masonry he has reached the rank of Knight Templar, and in politics he has always been a staunch Democrat, but never sought or cared for office.

October 4, 1881, Doctor Harrison married Sallie Akin Marmaduke and their only child died in infancy. Mrs. Harrison is a daughter of the late Col. Vincent Marmaduke, a native of Saline county, who was one of her most substantial citizens and largest landowners. He was a son of Hon. M. M. Marmaduke, former governor of Missouri, and a brother of John S. Marmaduke, another governor of the state. Henry Marmaduke, another brother, was a colonel in the Confederate army and a lientenant on the ship "Morrimac" at the time of its famous battle with the "Monitor." Vincent Marmaduke was born in Saline county, Missouri, April 14, 1831. He received a district school education, then became a student in the Masonic College, at Lexington, Missouri, where he graduated. He then entered the law course at Yale University, where he was graduated in 1852, being the valedictorian of his class. After leaving Yale he returned to Saline county. but did not practice his profession, engaging extensively in agricultural operations two miles southwest from Marshall. He was a colonel in the Confederate army and was with Highman's brigade. He was a member of the Missouri Legislature at the outbreak of the secession agitation and voted to keep his state in the union, but after the passage of the ordinance be joined the Confederate forces. He was commissioned by President Davis to go to England and France to purchase arms for the Confederacy and conceived the plan of supplying arms to the forty thousand Confederate prisoners at Chicago. For events growing out of this scheme he was himself arrested and confined in prison until the war was over. He was an intimate friend of the late Senator Vest and a decidedly picturesque character. After the war he engaged in the commission business at St. Louis, but soon afterward he and his brother, ex-Governor Marmaduke, published an agricultural paper in the Missouri metropolis. Subsequently he resided for a while at Sweet Springs, but afterwards came to Marshall, where he died at the home of Doctor Harrison, bis son-in-law. His first wife was formerly Julia Eakin, of Shelbyville, Tennessee, to whom he was married in July, 1853, and by whom he had two sons and two daughters: Mrs. R. W. Carey, of Kansas City, and Mrs. Dr. William Harrison, the sons, Vincent, Jr., and John Eakin, being deceased. Mrs. Harrison's uncle, Claiborne Jackson, was governor of Missouri during the war. Mrs. Harrison died on September 18, 1861, at the age

of thirty years, and in 1873 Vincent Harrison married Mrs. Katharme Ames, widow of Henry Ames, who, at the time of his death, was the largest pork packer in Missouri. Mrs. Harrison's maiden name was Scudder. She died on September 18, 1893.

Doctor Harrison is firmly convinced that his great-grandfather was the real signer of the Declaration of Indepeendence instead of the Benjamin Har rison to whom the honor is usually awarded. The Doctor has made an extensive investigation of the facts, going over all the available records at Washington and elsewhere. The main points of his contention when summed up certainly look formidable. This Benjamin Harrison became a captain in the Revolutionary war, and was an ardent supporter and friend of Patrick Heury. through whose efforts he was elected first revolutionary govern r of Virginia. He resigned in favor of Governor Lee and formed a mutary company, with which he captured Governor Dunsmore's outfit and brought the supplies to Williamsburg, where they were distributed to the state militia. This proceeding really formed the nucleus for rallying the resolutionary forces in Virginia and as such becomes an historic fact of the first importance. Benjamin Harrison was a young radical and an enthusiastic friend of Patrick Henry, while the other Benjamin Harrison was governor under King George. It seems quite logical that such a fiery young patriot should hasten to sign the immortal document of liberty, when more conservative men were holding In after years his heirs secured from the back to watch the trend of events. government a grant of six thousand and fourteen acres of land in Madison township, Favette county, Ohio, for services rendered the government original deeds for this land are still in possession of his descendants and bear the signatures of Presidents Madison, Adams, Monroe and Jackson

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Though now retired, the venerable pioneer above named has for more than fifty-four years been one of the most progressive and prosperous farmers of Saline county. He comes of an old and highly honorable family whose origin is traceable to England and whose representatives have figured prominently in many different states. His great-grandsire emigrated a this country as far back as 1727, being one of four brothers who settled in Vir-A little account book kept by this old colonial and which s still in the possession of his grandson shows by its accuracy that he was a man of education and business ability. He married Margaret Lewis in Virginia, and one of the children by this union was a son named Joseph, who was born May 9, 1763. He was a farmer and dealer in merchandise, besides owing and operating a flowing mill. One of his sons, also named Joseph, was a mechanical genius, and though he never patented it he claimed the honor of discovering the principle of a self-feeder for a cotton gin. He also invested the steam governor for engines and in other ways exhibited marked talcuts. He was a watchmaker by trade and surpassed all competitors by the skill and. originality of his work. November 27, 1794, Joseph Eubank married Dizaboth White, who was born in Virginia, November 8, 1774. They had ten children, all of whom lived to maturity, and among the number was Henry

Eubank, who was born in Virginia, September 14, 1795. In early manhood he migrated to Kentucky, where he became prominent as a merchant and trader and in other ways. Until 1829 he was engaged in business at Gasgow, but in that year retired to his farm and spent the closing years of his life in rural pursuits. Having considerable knowledge of military tactics, he held the offices of captain and major in the state militia. He was quite prominent in Barren county and was identified with many public interests. He married Maria Garnett, who was born in Barren county, Kentucky, May 19, 1807, and of this union seven children were born: America, born at Glasgow, Kentucky, May 11, 1827, now resides in Jackson, Tennessee: Margaret D., born September 15, 1829, married Robert T. Grady, and both are residents of Saline county; James, born April 27, 1833, married Martha Thomas, and is at present a farmer and money lender in Texas; Richard Gurnett, born October 1, 1835, married Catherine Wolfskill and is engaged in farming and grape culture in California; Elizabeth Frances, born September 9, 1838, married H. C. Irby and resides in Tennessee, where her hasband is one of the faculty of a Baptist school; Henry, born March 28, 1844. married Nancy Fishback, and makes his home in Barren county, Kentucky,

Reuben B. Eubank, eidest of the seven children, was born at Glasgew. Kentucky, February 9, 1824. He left school at the age of eighteen to cargage as clerk for David R. Young, a storekeeper of the town, receiving only his board and clothing as pay. After a year he entered the employment of Joseph Glazebrook, in consideration of one hundred dollars per annum, with board and washing. He retained this position for three years and then vent to Hopkinsville. Kentucky, but returned in a few months to his former employer. He was thus variously engaged until his marriage, when he went to farming, his wife having been presented by her father with a tract of two hundred acres of land. This, however, was afterwards traded for a money consideration and he embarked in the business of tobacco culture, to which five years were devoted, but becoming dissatisfied with the narrow seepe of his life and opportunities, he sold his little farm for ten dollars an acre and

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in 1055 crossed the Mississippi river into missour. Having picked out Saline county as a desirable place of abode, he rented a farm for two years and then purchased a tract of practically unimproved land, three miles northwest of Slater, to the clearing of which he bent all his energies for some years. From time to time he added to his original purchase until at one period he owned over iour thousand five hundred acres of land in Saline and adjoining counties. Mr. Eubank has every tax receipt that he received. the first dated 1846, showing that he paid thirty-one cents for county levy and state revenue. In after years the taxes amounted to five hundred dollars annually. He has been a very industrious man, of remarkably fine business judgment, and one of the best practical farmers that ever turned the sod in the state of Missouri. He is now a resident of Marshall, living there in dignified case and restful enjoyment, hale and hearty, at the advanced age of eighty-six. He has been a member of the Christian church since 1858. and has been conspicuous for his liberality in religious causes, as well as for his charitable deeds in the community. Among his numerous gifts was one of one hundred and sixty acres of land and five hundred cash to the Bible School of Columbia, Missouri: two thousand five hundred dollars to the Christian Church University, at Canton, Missouri, and a three thousand dollar parsonage to the Christian church at Marshall. Impecunious young men of ambition and talent have found in him a ready, sympathizing friend and helper. He has given to his children over nineteen hundred acres of land and several thousand dollars in eash. Originally a Whig, he became a Democrat when the old party went to pieces and has always taken an active interest in reform work.

October 30, 1848, Mr. Eubank married Martha, daughter of Robert S. Thompson, member of an old and representative family of Havi county, Kentucky. By this union there were three children: Robert, deceased, Henry and Reuben. The eldest was born in Barren county, Kentucky, in 1849, married Mary Bumbarger and resided near Slater, where he engaged in farming until his death, which occurred December 24, 1875. His only son is a resident of Bourbon county, Kentucky. Henry, who was born in Hart county. Kentucky, in 1852, married Jane Jenkins, of Slater, and now live in Chariton county. Missouri, where he farms and preaches. Reuben, who was born in Saline county, married Mary Campbell, and is engaged in busiaess at Lexington, Missouri. After the death of his first wife, January 25. 1861. Mr. Eubank was married to Elizabeth Whitaker, on June 22, 1861. She was born in Boone county, Kentucky, May 18, 1834, and died February 28, 1873, after becoming the mother of four children, the eldest of whom died in infancy. Those living are John, who was born in Saline county. April 12, 1863, married Lucy Smith and is engaged in farming. Ernest was born in Saline county. July 6, 4864, married Lillie Gaines, and has been farming for some years. Jerome, born October 3, 1865, married Zudie Purdom, and is engaged in stock-baying at the Kansas City stock yards. The third marriage of Mr. Eubank occurred July 30, 1873, to Annie Eliza Leeper, who was born January 13, 1838, at Monticello, Lewis county, Missouri. She is the mother of three children, the eldest of whom, Charles, died in infancy.

Those living are Preston Leeper, born March 3, 1877; married Okie Dyer and resides at Slater; Katharine Mariah, born February 20, 1881, married Eugene Wesley Collier and resides with her parents in Marshall.

REUBEN B. EUBANK, P. O., Slater. One of the most successful farmers, stock-raisers, and stock-feeders in Saline county. Was born in Glasgow, Barren county, Kentucky, February 9, 1824. While yet very young, his father moved from town to a farm near Glasgow, upon which he was raised, and where he received his education. Between his twentieth and twenty-first year, he entered the store of D. R. Young, as salesman, and after about a year, entered the store of Joseph Glazebrook, and remained with him four years, and then took charge of a store located at a little station called Horse Well, remaining two years. Out of his whole earnings as clerk, he laid by the sum of \$750, which was the foundation upon which he erected his subsequent fortune. He was married to Miss Martha Thomson, October 30, 1848, daughter of R. S. Thomson, an old settler of Hart county, Kentucky. After a year, he moved to Hart county, and lived there five years. In 1855, he moved to Missouri, and landed in Miami, March 27. In the following fall he bought a small tract of land, which is now included in his present farm, upon which he settled in the next year, 1857, and where he has since resided. By intelligent energy and judicious management, this farm has been increased to 820 acres, and is now one of the finest estates in the county. The soil is rich and inexhaustible, and the improvements are first-class. Besides this farm, he owns another, of 380 acres, equally good, and still more valuable, adjoining Slater, an "addition" to the city being located on a portion of it. He also owns about 2,000 acres of land in other portions of the state. Commencing, as he did, a poor boy, Mr. Eubank has reason to be proud of his financial achievements. Before the war, he dealt largely and successfully in hemp, but since the war closed, his whole attention has been devoted to raising grain, and to the raising and feeding of live stock. The war cost him heavily in the way of personal property, his farm being literally stripped, but in a short time, everything was restored. His first wife died January 25, 1861, and out of a family of five, left three children living. She was a member of the Christian church. His second wife was Miss Elizabeth Whitaker, daughter of John Whitaker, an old settler of Boone county, Kentucky. She also was a member of the Christian church, and died February 27, 1873. She also left three children living. His present wife, who was Miss Annie Leeper, was a daughter of James Leeper, of Lewis county, Missouri, formerly of Kentucky. He has had twelve children, eight of them now living, two by his present wife. In 1844, he joined the Baptist church; but on settling in Saline, he united with the Christian denomination, in 1859. He was an old line whig, but on the dissolution of the whig party, he joined the democratic party, to which he still adheres. There are twelve miles of hedge on his farm, and no field larger than forty acres. He operated the first horse corn-planter used in Saline, in 1858.

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HENRY EUBANK, P. O., Slater. Is a son of Reuben B. Eubank and Martha Eubank (nee Thompson), his wife, and was born in Barren county, Kentucky, September 4, 1851. In 1854, came with his parents to this county, where he was raised. He was educated at the "Christian" university, Canton, Missouri, for the ministry, and was ordained in Canton, by the Rev. Dr. W. H. Hopson, and has been engaged in preaching, for some time. April 15, 1879, he was married to Miss Jennie Jenkins, daughter of Judge R. Jenkins, of this county. In 1879, he moved to Slater, and in the spring of that year, laid off "Eubank's addition" to the town of Slater—ten acres—and at this time it is being rapidly bought, and built up.

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JAMES EUBANK, P. O., Slater; was born in Barren county, Kentucky, April 27, 1833, where he was raised on a farm, and received an English education. In 1855, he came to Missouri, and located in Saline county, which has since been his home. In 1853 and 1854, he was engaged in the drug trade in Glasgow, Kentucky. In Saline, he has been engaged in farming and stock feeding; has a farm of 272 acres, with a fine residence crowning an eminence. Has 300 acre farm in St. Clair county, Missouri, and like his brother Reuben, has been the founder and builder of his own fortune; coming to this county with no other property than one horse. He was married May 22, 1859 to Miss Mattie F. Thomas. They have three children, Minnie, Ann Lee and May, and two dead. Mr. Eubank enlisted in the confederate army in December, 1861, and was captured December 19, 1861 in Robinson's regiment of recruits. Imprisoned at St. Louis, then at Alton, Illinois. Released on taking the oath, February 1, 1862, and returned home. In October, 1864, he re-enlisted in Nixon's company, Gordon's regiment, Shelby's division and was in all the long, running fight of Shelby's division, to Newtonia. Surrendered at Shreveport, 1865.

(An Autobiography.)

In a large family Bible I found it recorded, in the handwriting of my mother, that I was born January 5, 1839, and it is undoubtedly the best evidence of the fact. I have no reason to doubt its correctness for she would annually remind me of my birthday until her death, when I was twenty two years old. My mother was a native of Knoxville, Tennessee, her father. Thomas L. Williams, being chancellor of east Tennessee, and also judge of the supreme court of that state. She was a woman of rare intelligence and unusual accomplishments. My father often said that she was better informed on historical subjects than any man he knew, himself included.

I have a right to entertain a good opinion of my ancestors, particularly on my mother's side, who were the Whites, McClungs and Williamses, of Tennessee, North Carolina, Virginia and Pennsylvania. Gen. James White was the founder of Knoxville, Tennessee. His title to the land on which the city is built was obtained under a grant to him by the state of North Carolina, for services in the Revolution. Here he located his Revolutionary service land grant in 1787. Here he built a fort, and must have had an eye for the beautiful and picturesque in its selection on the banks of the transparent Holston, amidst the beautiful and graceful forest-covered mountains.

Here in this state of Termessee and in North Carolina, Whites, Williamses and McClungs were leaders in the latter part of the eighteenth and beginning of the uineteenth century, prominent men in both military and evil life. They were worthy people and, although not rich, were comfortably well off, enough to properly educate their children, and a number of them became distinguished members of the communities where they lived

In 1700 Robert Williams led the bar at Raleigh and represented the people in Congress. A younger brother, Lewis Williams (my grandfather's twin brother), went to Congress from North Carolina, when he was the

youngest man in the House, and remained there continuously until he became the oldest member there. His brother, John Williams, was senator from Tennessee, preceding Andrew Jackson, and his brother-in-law, Hugh L. White, succeeded Jackson as senator and was offered any place he would accept in his cabinet. The ancestor of these men, Williams, fought the British at King's Mountain and other battles of the Revolution.

My limited schooling was obtained mainly from private tutors at home, with one session (1855-56) at the University of Missouri, being forced to discontinue school afterward, by poor health, at the age of seventeen years. I made a trip out to New Mexico with a freight train of ox wagons in 1857, and up the Missouri river on a steamboat to Fort Benton, Montana, the following year. After that I began studying law at home in a desultory way, the greater part of my time being devoted to deer hunting and kindred sports.

The Civil war coming on, I joined the Confederate forces, serving until the fall of 1861, when I was rendered unfit for duty by a severe spell of fever, and before recovering was captured by Federal troops and given the alternative of going to prison or taking the oath of allegiance. I accepted the latter and quit for good.

I was liceused to practice law in the fall of 1862 and located at Boonville. I married my cousin, Mary P. Shelby, about the same time without the consent of anybody—but she and I. The Civil war progressed, making Boonville a very lively place. In this condition of things a returned miner from Montana persuaded me to join him in a mining venture in that distant region (in 1865), by which I became involved in a debt, a burden which required over twenty years to discharge, but was ultimately accomplished. We bought a quartz mill in St. Louis and I spent a year in quartz mining and milling in Montana Territory, without either great loss or success.

Returning home in 1866, I located in Kausas City in November, 1867, opening a law office there in the spring of 1868, in connection with Gen. John W. Reid, a lawyer of experience. Afterwards I formed a partnership with B. J. Franklin, who was elected to Congress in 1875. In the course of ten years I had built up a very good practice, which I was compelled to abandon by ill health, again taking up my residence in this county, devoting myself to agriculture for about twenty years, during which time I paid off all of my old debts, without contracting any new ones and now own a farm of one thousand acres, which I have cultivated on shares, residing myself in Marshall.

We have three living children, Frances, now in St. Louis; John R., in Kansas City, and Roberta, at home; all grown, but unmarried.

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

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

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

The centleman whose life history is herewith outlined is descended from stanch old German stock, though all of his immediate ancestors have inved in Virginia. The Armentrout family is numbered among the pioneer families of the Old Dominion, and the land first entered by the family in Rockingham county. Virginia, in 1753, during the reign of King George, is still in the possession of the family, a record remarkable in these days of constantly changing land titles. The subject's paternal grandfather, George Armoutrout, was born, reared and died in Rockingham county, where he followed farming and was a highly respected citizen. The subject's parents were levemiah and Sarah J. (Miller) Armentrout, who also were born, reared and lived their entire lives in Rockingham county. The father also followed the tilling of the soil and his death occurred in 1886, his wife having died in 1868 They were the parents of eleven children, of whom nine are still living. The subject's maternal grandfather was Peter Miller, who, like the other members of this connection, was a successful farmer in Rockingham county, Virginia, where he was born, lived and died.

P. C. Armentrout was born in Rockingham county, Virginia, on the 4th day of November, 1849, and was reared under the paternal roof, teceiv ing his education in private schools in the neighborhood, and spending his vacation periods in assisting in the labor of the farm. On September 28, 1860, before he had attained his majority, he came to Saline county, wissouri. and for four years was employed in teaching school. During the following four years he was engaged in farming near Shackelford, this county, meeting with fair success. At the end of the period noted he sold his farm and during the following five years be was in the grain and general mercantile business at Shackelford. Desiring a larger field for operations, he removed, in 2381, to Marshall and, in partnership with B. F. Naylor, went into the grocery business. He was also for six years engaged in the hardware and familiare business, also in partnership with Mr. Navlor. In all these enterprises Mr. Armentrout was steadily successful and making substantial advances in a financial and material way, his shrewdness and business sagacity being exhibited in every business transaction in which he engaged. On May 1, 1894, he was tendered and accepted the position of vice-president of the Farmers' Savings Bank at Marshall, and, selling his mercantile interests, he has since that time devoted his attention to the banking business, in which be any also demonstrated business qualities of a high order. The Farmers' Savings Bank is one of the strong and popular monetary institutions of Saline county.

On March 8, 1871. Mr. Armentrout was united in marriage to Rachael V. Kiser, who is a native of Saline county, Missouri, and a daughter of James Kiser. The latter was one of the old pioneers of this county, his father having brought his family here in a very early day. To the subject and his wife have been born four children, namely: Ida, who is the widow of the late Dr. Melvin Young; W. J., who is a successful farmer living about five rules from Marshall; Lotta and Edna, the younger children, remain at home.

Politically Mr. Armentrout is a stanch Democrat and takes a healthy interest in the trend of public events, though in no sense an office secker. Fraternally he is a member of the Ancient Free and Accepted Masons, belonging to the blue lodge of Master Masons, the chapter of Royal Arch Masons and the commandery of Knights Templar. In religion Mr. and Mrs. Armentrout are members of the Baptist church, to which they give as earnest and liberal support. Combined with business qualifications of a high order, unimpeached integrity, a public spirited attitude toward all local interests and a genial personality, have combined to gain for Mr. Armentrout a deserved popularity in the community in which he so long resided, he being justly numbered among the representative citizens of Saline county.

March 1 Comment

JOHN W. ARMENTROUT, P. O., Elmwood; son of David and Mary B. Armentrout, of Rockingham county, West Virginia; he went to school in Harrisonburg, and spent the early part of his life on his father's farm. In the spring of 1868, he came to Missouri, and settled in Lafayette county, but soon removed to Saline. In May, 1861, he enlisted in Captain Payne's company; through 1861 he was in the western part of Virginia; was in the seven days fight at Richmond, Antietam, Fredricksburg, Millersburg, Gettysburg, Shepherdstown, where he was taken prisoner, and confined in Fort McHenry, Fort Delaware, Point Lookout, etc. On the 4th of February, 1867, he married Miss Agnes Baker, of Virginia; one child was born, Thomas J. His first wife died. August 2, 1872, and he married Miss Lizzie Smith, daughter of John Smith, October 12, 1878.

P. C. ARMENTROUT, merchant, P. O., Shackelford. Was born in Rockingham county, Virginia, November 4, 1848. His father was Jeremiah, and his mother Sarah J. Armentrout. Was raised and educated in the Oak Grove Academy of the same county. He remained and farmed with his father until he came to Saline county, landing at Miami, October 4, 1869. He taught school in the county for four years. In 1863, he rented a farm, and began farming and trading in cattle. He was a successful trader, and in August, 1876, purchased land south of Shackelford. He moved there in 1877, where he remained until 1879, when he sold out and came to Shackelford, and commenced buying and shipping grain for Rea & Page. In 1878, he was appointed deputy assessor, which position he held until 1879. First of April, 1880, engaged in the grocery business with Mr. G. Gauldin. The firm was known as Armentrout & Gauldin. He afterwards bought the full interest, then his brother came in as partner, making the firm Armentrout & Bro. Armentrout & Bro. are wide awake men, do business on the square, and have built for themselves a reputation as first-class men. Was married March 8, 1871, to Miss Rachel V. Kiser, of Saline county, by Rev. Joshua Barbee. By this union they have three children: Ida M., John W., and Lottie Lee. He is a master mason, and also master workman of the A. O. U. W. Lodge.



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

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MRS. GEORGIE DUGGINS

The early settlers of the west were generally men of energy, with small capital, who left the more densely populated sections of the country that they might obtain the advantages to be found in the then comparatively sparsely settled regions of the new states. Mr. Duggins was represented in that class, and as the personal history of such settlers will always be of interest to the people, we subjoin a succinct memoir of his rather eventful life. He was born in Laurenceauty, virginia, March 10th, 1810, and was raised up to manhood within his native county. 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of the excellent farm located on section 8, township 52, Saline County, is the gentleman whose name is to be seen at the head of this sketch. He is a native of the Hoosier State and was bern in La Porte, November 5, 1855. He is a son of Abraham and Louisa Hupp. Our subject was

educated at Huntsville (Mo.) Academy, and left school at the age of nineteen years well equipped to take upon himself the responsibilities of a business life

Mr. Hupp was engaged in work upon his father's farm and had a partnership in the same until the place was cleared up and out of debt. He built a good house and barn and greatly improved the place in general. Later his father gave him a tract comprising forty acres of land, which was well worth at that time \$1,200. Upon this he erected a snug little house, devoting to it the savings from his hard labor. About that time he married Miss Martha Davis, their marriage being solemnized November 12, 1879. She was a native of Saline County and was born in 1861, being the daughter of Tyre and Mary Davis. The young couple immediately moved into the little home which had previously been prepared for their occupancy. They remained there one year and added to the original tract one hundred and forty acres, which was valued at \$30 per acre.

This last addition to the property was purchased on credit, but in the incredibly short space of three years he had so managed as to have discharged the entire indebtedness. It took Spartan energy and the severest economy on the part of himself and wife to accomplish this. At the same time he was in partnership with his father and purchased with him another tract of fifty-seven acres, for \$19 per acre. This was sold at the expiration of three years to a Mr. Watson Wood. About this time Mr. Hupp purchased at sheriff's sale, of the Me Amis beirs, a tract of one hundred and seventytwo and a-half acres, for which he paid \$20 an acre. This brought upon him new obligations and incumbrance, but be paid off the indubtedness, partly in work. He had to resort to many makeshifts in order to raise the money, growing wheat and herding cattle to get together the payments on the land, but at the expiration of four years he was again free from debt. He now has an attractive and comfortable home, with barns and outbuildings in keeping with the place.

Mr. and Mrs. Hupp have been made happy by the advent into their home life of live children. Neither have they been spared sorrow, for only

Erma, who was born in 1886, attends school in the vicinity of her home. Reserve was born in 1887. Mr. Hupp is, and has been sure heyhood, an energetic worker and a public-spirited business man. Many men who find it necessary to devote much time to the drudgery of business find the process hardening to the better nature. Not so with our subject, however, as with a best treatment of his nephew, Walter Crane, who was left as a boy of five years to the care of his grandfather. He made his home with him twelve years and then came to live with our subject, with whom he has since resided, sharing equally in all the property with the original of our sketch.

Mr. and Mrs. Hupp are members of the Baptist Church, and the interest that he gives to religion is of the most active sort. When the new Baptist Church was built some few years ago, Mr. Hupp was appointed Trustee and also one of the Deacons, and has continued to be so associated ever since. Politically, our subject is a Republican, and, although he is not an aspirant for office, he takes a very active interest in local affairs.

ORMOND HUPP, P. O., Miami. Was born in the city of La Porte, Indiana, in 1840, and at the age of three years, moved with his father to a farm, and was educated at the Notre Dame Collège and University, South Bend, Indiana. In 1861, he enlisted in the 5th Indiana battery, and was in the battles of Perryville, Atlanta, Altoona, and in the Georgia campaign was under fire continuously for four months, except three days of the time. At the battle of Perryville, he was wounded by a piece of shell, which has so disabled him since, that he cannot now perform hard manual labor. He was discharged in 1864, and returned home to his native county, and remained there one year. He then came with his father and brother to this county, and purchased the Dr. William Lacy farm, and settled on it in 1878. Afterwards, he removed to the farm where he now lives. In the fall of 1873, he was married, in this county, to Miss Laura M. Campbell a native of Tennessee. They have four children living: Jesse K., Charles C., Luella and Gertrude. Mr. Hupp's attention is largely given to the handling of stock. His farm lies between Slater and the river, giving him the advantage of both river and railroad shipping facilities.

BRAM HIPPP, for nearly two-score years an honored citizen of Saline County and widely known as a prosperous agriculturist, resides upon section 4, township 52, range 20, near the village of Sharon. A native of Virginia, he was born in Shenandoah County in 1805, and is the son of Abraham and Elizabeth Hupp, both Virginians by birth. The father was one of the courageous and faithful officers who fought bravely in the War of 1812. Our subject was the third in a family of seven sons. John Hupp, born in Virginia in 1802, married Miss Circle, and was a farmer in Ohio; Samuel, born in the Old Dominion in 1803, married Miss Gips and resides in Virginia; Israel, who was born in Virginia in 1807, was united in marriage with Miss Barnes, and some time afterward died in his native State: Michael, born in 1809. married and afterward removed to Ohio; George Washington married and located in Ohio.

Our subject studied in both the American and German schools of Virginia, and industriously acquired all the book knowledge his limited time for study allowed him to gain. He was present at the laying of the corner-stone of the Baltimore Railroad Depot. The first wages he received amounted to \$96 per year, and for a time he was employed in driving cattle for a resident Virginian. Five years steady occupation as a drover gave him the munificent salary of \$100 each twelve months. He next became overseer of a

large slave plantation, and continued there until he finally decided to locate in La Porte, Ind., where he purchased forty acres of land, paying for the property \$13 per acre. Industrious, hardworking and thrifty, he prospered and added to his real estate until he had acquired by honest toil one hundred and five acres, which he brought under a high state of cultivation, and made his permanent home for thirty years.

On account of business reverses Mr. Hupp settled in Saline County, Mo., December 1, 1865, and bought a tract of land containing six hundred and fifty-eight acres, at that time worth \$15 per acre, but now valued at \$40 and upward. The home of our subject is desirably located, and could not be purchased for \$11,000 with its excellent improvements. Aside from this property, Mr. Hupp has given to each of his children a quarter-section of fine land, or its equivalent in money. Devoting his time to agricultural duties, he raises mostly wheat and corn, and also is an extensive stock-feeder.

Sharing Mr. Hupp's pleasant and attractive home is his devoted wife, formerly Miss Louisa Gardner, with whom he was anited in marriage June 9, 1837. Mrs. Hupp was born in 1814, and was the mother of ten children, of whom there are four boys and two girls living: Ann Elizabeth, born in La Porte. Ind., iv 1838, married William Replogle, and resides in her native city, where her husband is a well-known banker and farmer. Ormond, born in La Porte, Ind., September 11, 1840, married Mrs. Laura Campbell, and resides in Saline County, where he owns mine hundred acres of valuable land; he became the father of eleven children, of whom there are nine living. Arthur, born in La Porte, Ind., married Mis. McAmis and removed to Fairville, Saline County, where he is a farmer and cattle dealer: Julia, born in Virginia, married a Mr. Crane and died in 1880; Mary E., whose native place is La Porte, Ind., is married and lives in Wichita, Kan.; Theodore, born in 1857, married Miss Martha Davis, and they are the parents of five children, two of whom now survive; he resides in Saline County, where he owns three hundred and sixty acres of valuable land, all under excellent cultivation.

Mr. Hupp is a devoted member of the Baptist Church, and a liberal supporter of that religious organization located in Miami Township. Fraternally, he has been a Free Mm in since 1839, when he joined that order in La Porte, and is now identified with Lodge No 85 at Miami. As a pioneer settler in the West, as incommany severe and thrilling experiences. For a brief time during the year 1832 be lived in the wilderness of Ohio, where he was ever surrounded by woives and narrowly escaped with its life. Being nearer his destination than he supposed, a friend heard his ery for help and came to his relief. He has had many hardships to surreculat and obstrales to overcome. Prior to his marriage he had \$4,000 loaned out, and through the Bankrupt Act lost every dollar of the amount. After his marriage he suffered another heavy loss, as some scoundrel poisoned eleven head of his best horses. Politically, our subject was in early days a Whig, and later became an active supporter of the Republican party. In Indiana he served as Door-keeper of the Legislature in 1845-46, one year in the House and one year in the Senate when it was Democratic. A true friend, a kind husband and father, and a law-abiding vitizen, he has won and retains the confidence of all who know him.

When he received his sharge in June 16, 1865, he irned to his home in Monia county and then the fammoved the same year to Sacounty. His father purchasa farm 41/2 miles southeast Marshall.

obert had seven brothers two sisters. They were Anw, John, Adolphus, James, ham, Benjamin and Tom, ha and Margaret. Several of brothers farmed in Saline oty.

obert in a short time after ling to Saline went in partship with his brother, Adola, and e gaged in farming a number of years in the Springs community. Later ort and Adolphus dissolved thership.

ebruary 10, 1803, Robert chased one of the best forms the best part of Saline, 212 is southeast of Salt Springs ated on what is now known flighway 20, from William fer. This farm consisted of acres. Later, September 22, Robert purchased 200 acmore land adjoining this in from John L. Houston and grence N. Houston, making

540 acres in this farm. This farm has been well kept through the years and at the present time, 1967, it is considered one of the land marks in Saline county.

Mr. Ransberger was an energetic, good farmer and a very successful one. He was held in high esteem by his neighbors and friends. At that time he was still a bachelor. He married May 16, 1838 Miss Jennie Reed, a daughter of William Robert Reed and Louise Spradling Reed, of Malta Bend, Mo.

Because of his wife's health, Mr. Ransberger left the farm in 1889 in charge of his brother-inlaw, Richard Reed, and they moved to Marshall, buying a house on West Arrow Street.

July 29, 1890, Robert purchased a building on the north side of the square from I. O. Striker. At the present time this building is occupied by the Missourl Public Service Company. Robert entered the grocery business in this building for a few years.

December 11, 1890 their only child, a daughter Penrl Jone, was born.

Mr. Ransberger closed out his grocery store in 1893 and the family moved back to the farm. He resumed farmers again and continued until his death March 1 1898

Mr. Ransberger professed his faith in Christ some morths before, his death and showed to those around him by his patience and uncomplaining suffering in his last illness, as well as his kind deeds to his friends and fellowman, that his faith was proven by his works.

His wife, Mrs. Jennie Ransberger, known as a good financier, and daughter, Pearl Ione, still remained on the farm for three years. Then they rented the farm and moved back to Marshall.

The daughter started her schooling in the country at the Prairie View school, a short distance from the farm. She continued her education in the Marshall Public Schools and Central College at Lexington, Mo. She also studied music and art.

Pearl ione we married March 21, 1917 to originally from Sweet Mo. Mr. Thomson East Noccupied Sales. W. dealer for many years, until his health became impaired and he finally sold his business to his brother. A. G. Thomas.

The mother, daughter and her husband lived together at their home on Eastwood. Mrs. Jennie Ransberger passed away January 23, 1947 and W. P. Thomas passed away December 20, 1951. The daughter, Pearl Ransberger Thomas, still resides at the

home place. 524 East Eastwood.

HENRY RANSBERGER, farmer, P. O., Marshall. Was born in Augusta county, Virginia, in 1819, and lived there until nineteen years old. In 1838 he moved to Washington county, Missouri, where he lived four years. From Washington he moved to Jefferson county, where he lived until 1855. He then went to Moniteau county, and lived there until 1865, when he came to Saline county and settled on the farm he now occupies. In 1839 he was married to Miss Elizabeth Shelton, of Washington county, Missouri. Ten children have been born to them. Three are at home; Benjamin F., Th. J., and Julia A. Margaret is the wife of George Purcell; John is farming in Cass county, Missouri. Several of his sons are farming near Salt Springs, in this county. Mr. Ransberger is a member of the Baptist Church at Marshall. A constitutional Union man, he took no part in the war, though his sympathies were, naturally, with the south. He started in life with nothing, and by energy, intelligence and perseverance, has made a comfortable living for his old age. His farm of 280 acres is well stocked, and finely improved. His oldest son is a member of the firm of Ransberger & Lantz, Marshall, Missouri.

A. J. RANSBERGER, P. O., Marshall. Was born in Washington county, Missouri, July 27, 1839. Soon after his birth his parents moved to Jefferson, and in 1855, moved to Moniteau county. In 1861, he joined the M. S. G. for six months, and was in the battle of Lexington. In 1864, he re-enlisted in Gen. Shelby's command, C. S. A., in which he served to the end of the war, participating in the engagements of that command. In 1867, he came to Marshall, in this county, and carried on his trade, that of blacksmithing. In 1871, he entered into partnership with Mr. Lantz, and established the business firm of Ransberger & Lantz, carriage and wagon makers, which they have carried on prosperously since. He was married December 3, 1873, to Miss Laura Neely, Washington county, Missouri. They have had three children, two living now: Lester H., Frank E.

A. R. LANTZ, P. O., Marshall. Was born in Rockingham county, Virginia, January 31, 1844, where he was raised and educated. April, 1861, he enlisted in company E, 17th regiment Virginia cavalry, and was in the battles of Salt Pond Mountain, Lewisburg, Lynchburg, Narrow at New River, Salem, North Mountain, Hedge's Depot, where he was taken prisoner July 3, 1864, and was held prisoner for nine months, and exchanged March 18, 1865, and returned to Richmond, and surrendered a few months later. Returned to Rockingham county, and worked at his trade. In 1869 he came west, and located in Marshall, in this county, where he has since carried on his trade, carriage and wagon making. On the 4th of April, 1871, he married Miss Alice T. Piper, of Rockingham county; have had one child, who died at the age of six years.

## ADAM TABLER SWISHER.

The founder of the Saline county family of this name was Henry Swisher, born in eastern Virginia, near the Blue Ridge mountains in 1774. Let lived most of his life in Berkeley county. He was a farmer by occulation, served in the war of 1812 and was at Baltimore when General Ross leas killed. In 1858 he removed to Kansas, where he died at the age of lighty-four years. His son, also named Henry, was born in Berkeley county in April, 1868, adopted the carpenter's trade and remained in his native place until 1857, when he migrated to Saline county, Missouri, where he remained

until his death in 1875. He married Elizabeth Barnes, who was sorn in Berkeley county in May, 1809, and died in 1885. They had five enildrenal sons: Adam T.; Vinyard B., who was born in 1840 and resides in Saline county near Norton; Michael S., who was born in 1842 and lives at Slater; F. L., born in 1847, lives near Norton; Mathias D., born in 1849 and died in 1905 near Norton.

Adam T. Swisher, eldest of the five boys, was born in Berkeley county. Virginia, October 13, 1838. The only education of the children was obtained at the old-fashioned subscription schools, then common in Virginia, but after coming to Saline county, in 1857, Mr. Swisher attended two terms in one of the educational institutions of this vicinity. Before reaching his majority he began learning the carpenter's trade, which he followed without a break until his election as county recorder in 1902. Beginning the following year, he served a two-year term and was re-elected in 1906. He had no opposition in the primary, which in Democratic Saline county is equivalent to election.

Mr. Swisher has a creditable record as a soldier in the Confederate army during the Civil war. Answering the first call, he joined the Saline county Jackson Guards under General Marmaduke, enlisting in April, 1861. and being first ordered to Jefferson City. Besides participating in the skirmish at Boonville, he was in the battle of Lexington. In September, 1861, he was brought home sick with typhoid fever, but returned to if e army in December, was captured at Black Water and taken to St. Louis, where he was kept a prisoner until February and then removed to the federal prison at Alton, Illinois. July 11, 1862, he was paroled to report to the provost marshal at St. Louis, by whom he was released, and st. oly pitch made his way home. He was forced to sign an oath of allegiance without knowing what it was, disregarded it and left for the south where he reentered the Confederate service, being with Shelby's brigade until de close of hostilities. He was in a number of engagements, including the battle of Prairie Grove and all the fighting around Little Rock. He received a light gunshot wound at the battle of Lexington, but aside from that escaped unscathed.

In 1867 Mr. Swisher married Mary Katharine Hedges, who was born in Berkeley county. Virginia, within two miles of his own birthplace. His seven children are all living and doing well in their respective lanes. David A. resides near Napton, in Saline county; Catherine E. is the wife of Ezra Baker, professor in Trinity University of Waxahatchie, Texas: Harry A. is a resident of Saline county, near Norton; Joseph F. is a bookkeeper in

the Bank of Saline at Marshall; May E. married Robert J. Kiser and they live in Saline county near Blosser; Ada V. is a teacher in the public schools at Marshall and still remains under the parental roof; Adam T., Jr., lives with and assists his father as deputy recorder. Mr. Swisher is a member of the Knights of Pythias, the Maccabees and the Masons. He is regarded as one of the reliable and solid men of the county, faithful in all the relations of life and as a consequence enjoying the confidence and esteem of the public.

B. SWISHER, a leading agriculturist and successful stock-raiser of Saline County, is pleasantly located in township 51, range 20, near Norton. For the past thirty-five years a constant resident in the immediate neighborhood of his present home, our subject has been closely identified with all the marked improvements and progressive advancement of his locality, and has long been known and highly respected by the entire community among whom his life of busy usefulness is passed. He was born September 21, 1840, in Berkeley County, Va. (now W. Va.).

The paternal grandfather, Henry Swisher, went from Pennsylvania to Berkeley County, Va., in an early day. He was a soldier in the War of 1812, and was at the bombardment of Ft. McHenry, which celebrated event was the inspiration of the national poem, "The Star Spangled Banner." He was a farmer by occupation, and died at the advanced age of ninety-two, near Leavenworth, Kan., where he lived with some of his children. The father of our subject, also named Henry, was born in Berkeley County, Va., May 25, 1809. He was one of a large family of children, and until twenty-one years of age, assisted his father upon the farm. He also learned the carpenter's trade, and helped to build the court house at Charleston, Va., where John Brown subsequently had his trial. The mother of Mr. Swisher was Elizabeth, a

daughter of Michael and Phoebe (Tabler) Barnes. and a native of Berkeley County, Va. The parents of our subject continued to reside in Virginia until 1857, when they removed to Saline County, Mo., and located upon section 20, township al. range 20. Henry Swisher here continued his trade as a builder, and also did farming, but in the latter years of his life he withdrew from active basiness, and, although remaining on the farm, he gave up the management of the place to his sons. He was a man of strong character, honest and upright, and was a worthy member of the Cumberland Presbyterian church. In politics, he was a Democrat and an ardent advocate of his party. For many years he had been an Odd Feliow, being one of the charter members of the Hedgesville Lodge, of Hedgesville, Berkeley County, Va., and with this lodge he maintained his connection until the day of his death. He was a prosperous man, an enterprising and honored citizen, and when he died. upon December 12, 1875, his demise was mourned as a loss to the community. He left a widow and five sons: Adam Tabler, Vineyard B., Michael S., Franklin L. and Mathias D. These sons are all now living upon the land bequeathed to them by their father, except Adam, who resides in Marshall.

Three of the five sons were is the Confederate army, in which service their conrage and fearlessness were remarked. The mother of our subject died May 18, 1885, and in her death the sons tost a loving and unselfish friend, whose greatest happiness had ever been to do for others. Mrs. Swisher had two brothers: Adam Ged in Mississippi; and William Barnes is a highly respected citizen of the county, and lives on land adjoining the Swisher estate. The Barnes family and German descent. V. B. Swisher, our subject was born in Berkeley County, Va., where he remained with he parents until the family removed to Missouri, it March, 1857, traveling by rail to Wheeling, then by beat to Cambridge, Saline County. He lived with his parents until his marriage, when he settled upon the land where he now resides. He was married April 23, 1870, to Elvira, daughter of Harvey and Catherine (Miller) Hedges, of Spline County. Mr. and Mrs. Swisher have been the procents of four children: Early, the first-born, is deveased: Sarah Al-

len, Charles V. and Alma are all at home with their parents, and are entering upon life with bright prospects.

Mr. Swisher is a pronounced Democrat. He entered the Confederate army in November. 1862, and belenged to Company & Shanks' Regiment, Shelby's Brigade. Missonr Cavairy, and bravely remained in constant duty unit dune 19, 1865, when he was paroled at Shreveport, La. Mr. Swisher was twice severely weinded, first of Big Blue, Jackson County, Miss., and later at Ft. Scott, Kan., where he was shot through the lag, and later his horse under him was hit three times, but not mortally lurit. Our subject was chiefly in the battles and skirmishes of Arkansas and Missouri.

Mr. Swisher participated in all the conflicts in which his regiment engaged, except one skirmish, when his wound incapacitated him from active duty. After the war he returned home and once more engaged in the peaceful occupation of farming and busily devoted himself to the care of his two hundred and twenty acres. His live-stock is a prominent feature of his successful ventures, and his Galloway cattle are pronouncd to be of a high grade. Earnest and energetic, he takes a deep interest in all that pertains to local progress and public advancement, and generously aids in social and benevolent enterprises.


A. T. SWISHER, P. O., Marshall. Mr. Swisher was born in Berkley county, Virginia, October 17, 1838, where he was raised on a farm, until he was nineteen years old, and educated in a subscription school. At the age of sixteen he learned the carpenter's trade. In 1857 he came to this county with his parents, and has devoted himself to his trade ever since. For the first year or so he worked for other contractors; he has contracted for himself. At the breaking out of the war, in the spring of 1861, he joined the first company (Marmaduke's) organized in this county, under Gov. Jackson's call for the M. S. G. He was in the first battle of Booneville; and when his company broke up, after the battle, he joined the company formed by Capt. Sheridan, and was at the battle of Lexington. In December, 1869, he joined the body of recruits going south, under Col. Robinson, and was captured with them on Blackwater, December 19, 1861; was taken to St. Louis, then to Alton, Illinois; where, in the spring of 1862, he took the oath, and came home. When the general call for all to join the militia was made, he again went south, in 1862, and joined Gen. Shelby's command, with which he continued to the end of the war. After the war closed he returned to Saline county, and has been here ever since. In 1870 he moved to Marshall, and has steadily

Mr. Guthrey was born in Cumberland acounty, Virginia, May the 22nd, 1810. He was raised and educated within his native standy. spending his time principally in working on his father's fam. In his nineteenth year he embarked in the ngggangile business, in the little town of Cairo, of the same county. After serving out an appropriate ship in this line, he made a trip west, and during the tour visited descent in 1835 and 36. Long since their voices have been bushed in death, but their memory still lives fresh and green in his mind, and from their maxims and counsels he has never departed; and it is pleasant to record that their united counsels have formed a golden thread throughout the life of their child, forming, also, an archor to the great future.

The Guthrey family came to this country from Southwest Reing Reing Render to the new to obtain the religious freedom denied them in the old world. Mr. Guthrey's great-grandfather, Thomas, came to the colony of Virginia, and settled a behavior to the colony of Virginia, and settled and Mr. Guthrey remembers having seen his venerable face. He closed his mortal life in the county where he at first settled, and where Mr. Guthrey's grandfather, William, an old revolutionary soldier, and his father, John, a soldier in the war of 1812—were born. Mr. Guthrey's mother, the first of his father's three wives, was formerly Miss Nancy Palmer, the daughter of William Palmer, an old settler of Virginia, and a revolutionary veteran who was captured in one of the engagements of the war, and who was carried to England as a prisoner.

Contractor and builder and for fifty-four years an honored resident of Saline county, the subject of this sketch was born at Madison Mills, near Orange, on the Rapidan river, Virginia, April 1, 1837. His father was Robert F. Page, a native of Nelson county, that state, and a descendant or one of the first English families that settled in Virginia. By occupation he was a miller and spent all of his life near the place of his birth, dying in preene county, Virginia, at the advanced age of eighty years. Prior to her marriage to Robert F. Page, the subject's mother bore the name of Sarah has, whose birth occurred in the county of Albemarle and who died in 1808, then about ninety years old. The family of this estimable couple consisted of ton children, of whom the following survive: C. G. Page, of Marshall; Z. K., who has been clerk of Greene county, Virginia, for over thirty years. W. B. of Crockett, Texas, and for several years a member of the Legislature of that state.

E. R. Page spent his early life in Virginia, and while still a trace youth gave evidence of decided mechanical skill, which he subsequently utilized as a carpenter, which trade he learned at his native place and at which he soon acquired much more than ordinary proficiency. Thinking the West abounded in better opportunities for a young man than his own state, he secure! home ties in September, 1855, and in the following November reached saint country, Missouri, where he immediately found remunerative employment at his trade. Being a skillful workman, his services were soon in great demand, we only in the locality where lived, but throughout a large area of the county as well, and from that time on his progress was rapid and his success assured.

At the breaking out of the Civil war Mr. Page went west and from 1864 to 1866 inclusive was engaged in contracting and mining in Nevada. In the latter year he returned to Saline county and resumed his trade a Marshall where, during the ensuing twenty-five years, he erected more buildings than any other contractor, and to him as much as to any one man is due the rade advancement of the city from that time to the present. It is a fact beyond dispute that he practically built the thriving county seat, the majority of the basiness blocks, public confices and finer class of residences being the result of his mechanical skill, in addition to which he also erected many dwellings throughout the rural districts and in other towns. Among the more noted evidences of his workmanship in Marshall are the Missouri Valley College buildings several beautiful and imposing church edinces, private residences of a number of the leading citizens and various other structures, all of which bear witness to his efficiency as a master of the calling and which will long stand as monuments to his energy and skill.

Mr. Page's financial success was commensurate with the ability displayed in his labors. As a man and citizen he always manifested a lively interest in the growth of his adopted city, and all enterprises having for their object the moral welfare of the community received his encouragement and support. He always stood for law, order and a high standard of citizenship, while his social status and personal integrity were ever above reproach and all of his promises religiously kept.

Mr. Page was a Democrat, but made politics secondary to his business shairs, although well informed on the leading questions of the day and abreast of the times on current events. Fraternally he was a Mason of high degree, belonging to the three branches of the order, and in religion he held to the faith of the Methodist church, with which body his family are also identified. The death of Mr. Page occurred November 8, 1909.


In the year 1866 Mr. Page was united in marriage with Caroline W. Sims, a native of Greene county, of the Old Dominion state, in which she was born and reared, the ceremony taking place in the same neighborhood where they spent their childhood and youth. Of the twelve children resulting from this union, one lives in Seattle, Washington, two in old Mexico, and the rest in or near Marshall, Missouri, where the family is so well known and

so highly esteemed.

## DR. JOHN SAPPINGTON Va - Ky

Was born on the ldes of May, 1776. He was the second son and child of eight eldfelren, four of whom were boys. The order of their births was as follower Reger, Frank, John. Thomas, Rebecca, Elenor, and two half-sisters. Facility and Mary. Roger, John and Thomas became physicians, while Frank sacued his attention to mercantile pursuits.

The Supplimments are descended from English ancestry, who were among the early services of this continent. Mark Sappington, the father of one sopject, was a physician by profession, and while John was quite young energiated from Virginia to what afterwords became known as Nashviile. Tennessee, while the site of that city was but a can brake. There he emissed the new sec of medicine among the few inhabitants of that section, but owing to the sparsely settled condition of the country he mot with only leaded success. He died at a very old age - his wife, whose maiden name wer Payce, having previously died. Owing to the limited means at the a amound of the family John was forced to resort to various kinds of more oal labor as a means of support, usually working as a farm taken reduct a the summer. Having received but a limited primary schooling he old only applied himself during the long evenings of the winter wasar, a fac aid of such light as was afforded by the burning of none knots to the attainment of an education. While under the parental read is stacked the science of medicine, and in company with his habor, because the practice, with whom he continued until his marriage, which took place at Russellville, Logan county, Kentucky, on the 22nd day of November, 1804, to Miss Jane, daughter of William and Elizabeth Breathet. Miss Jane was the eldest of eight children, five of whom were boys. John was afterwards governor of Kentucky, and died while filling the gubernatorial chair; Edward, a physician, and studied medicine under Dr. Sappington, and practice . his profession at Franklin, Tennessee; James, attorney-at-law, at Hopkinsville, Kentucky; Cardwell, a farmer and merchant, at Russellville, Kentucky; George was private secretary to President Jackson, and died while holding that

position. Dr. Sappington continued the practice of his profession after his marriage, at Franklin, Tennessee. While there, about the years 1814 and 1815, he attended a course of medical lectures at Philadelphia. Soon after his return from Philadelphia he removed to a farm near Elkton. Todd county, Kentucky, where he united the business of farming with that of his medical practice, but ere long returned to Franklin, Tennessee. The fertile soil, cheap lands and salubrious stimate of central Missouri began to attract the attention of the people of the Mississippi vailey, and in 1817 he emigrated to this state, at first settling near Glasgow, Howard county, where he purchased land at the local sales at Franklin, upon which he located. In 1819 he removed to the west side of the Missouri river and located upon sections 8 and 9, township 49, range 19. Here, by rigid economy and close attention to both farming and the practice of medicine, he continued to accumulate means, which he inmediately invested in lands and otherwise advantageously. His medical practice soon became very extensive reaching as far as Jefferson City on the cest, hexington on the west, are as to the adjoining counties, being especially successful in the treatment of malarial fevers. About the year 1832 he retired from the practice of medicine, and manufactured and put out what was known as Dr. John Sappington's Anti-Pever Pills, and in 1844 published his theory and treatment of fevers.

Before his death he placed into the hands of trustees twenty thousand dollars, the interest of which was to be expended for the education of the indigent children of the county. This fund has accumulated until at present it amounts to about thirty-five thousand dollars.

While the doctor did not belong to any religious creed or denomination, he was always liberal in his views upon religious matters, believing in the right of individual independent thought. If tensor the liberal independent thought. If

He was a man possessed of a fine physique and endowed with a full share of natural sense; and though what saught be truly termed a self-educated man, had many years previous to his demise, stored his acute and closely discriminating mind with all the practical parts of the various theories set forth by the learned sages in therapeutics. To this knowledge, qualities of mind and wide and successful experience, may be attributed the high esteem with which the people and medical profession regard his opinions.

He died at his residence on the 7th J of Se, tember, 1856, in the S1st year of his age, of a tumor, of a cancer on his forehead; his wife having previously departed this life on the 14th Jay of December, 1855.

The doctor reared a family of eight children, viz: in the order of their births—Eiiza, third wife of Governor Chiborn F. Jackson; Lavenia, wife of Governor Merideth M. Marmadoke; Erasmus D.; William B.; Jane, first wife of Governor Jackson: Louisa, second wife of Governor Jackson; Susan wife of Captain L. S. Eddins; Mary Ellen, wife of Dr. William Price.

William B., now residing on the homestead of his father, was born in Franklin. Tennessee, on the 4th day of January, 1811. He remained on the farm with his father, receiving the benefits of such schools as the country then afforded, until he arrived at the age of seventeen, when he was sent to the Princeton Manual Labor School where he remained four years. On his return home he applied himself to the study of the law, but owing to a contracted weakness of his eyes was forced to abandon his studies, after which he directed his attention principally to farming.

n which capacity he continues to act. He

was in sympathy with the south during the late war. He has brought up a family of five children, viz: William E., deceased; John C.; Mildred; Jane; E. D. and Stella.

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

GEORGE A. MURRELL. In 1805, George Murrell, with his father, Samuel Murrell, emigrated from Virginia to Kentucky, and settled near Glasgow, in Barren county. There, February the 18th, 1826, the subject of this sketch, youngest son of George Murrell, was born. Mr. Murrell's parents died in his infancy, consequently he knows nothing of them, save what he has gathered from tradition. He was raised on a farm; and farming, together with trading in live stock, has been his only occupation, except during a brief interval, mentioned below. His education is not more extensive than familiarity with the ordinary English branches—such as are taught in the common schools of the country. This, however, is greatly strengthened by strong natural endowments,

coupled with a retentive memory that stores whatever of value is to be learned from passing events. In 1847 Mr. Murrell went to New Orleans and engaged in buying horses and selling them to the government for service in the Mexican war. Three years later he left Kentucky, seeking a location farther west, and traveled the state of Missouri in every direction. Returning to Kentucky in the fall of 1850, he purchased and carried south a drove of mules, which he disposed of in the southern markets. Mr. Murrell then went to Louisville, Kentucky, where he bought a stock of dry goods and shipped them to Carrollton, Missouri, without having made any previous arrangement for their delivery, disposition, or storage—being unacquainted in Carrollton, and wholly unfamiliar with the mercantile business. He remained at Carrollton through the summer of 1851, selling his goods with profit; becoming dissatisfied with merchandising, however, he sold the residue of his stock to a gentleman who had accompanied him from Kentucky, and went to Saline county with the view of buying mules. Hearing of a certain lot of mules for sale, he called on their owner, intending to buy them; instead of doing so, however, he purchased the gentleman's farm, in section 11, township 49, of range 20—the same on which Mr. Murrell now resides. In the winter of 1856 he sold his farm and went to Texas, with the intention of settling in that State. He returned to Missouri, however, the following autumn, and re-purchased the farm he had sold. February, 1859, Mr. Murrell was married to Miss Sophia T. McMahan, of Cooper county, to whom were born three sons: Leonard D., Wm. B. and George A., Ir. The last named lost his life by falling into a well. Mr. Murrell's wife died in 1874, and he has since married Mrs. Sarah M. Thompson, nee Abney. One child, Minnie Sophia, blesses the second union. Of active, ardent temperament, no other calling could have been so congenial to his disposition as that of farming; and, following the bent of his inclination with unyielding, patient endeavor, incited by a laudable ambition, and sustained by a consciousness of his own rectitude of purpose, Mr. Murrell has been amply and handsomely rewarded, as the truly deserving never fail to be. In politics, Mr. Murrell was, up to the war, a democrat. He has not voted for a presidential candidate since 1860, when he cast his ballot for Stephen A. Douglas. While he deprecated civil war, he believed that secession was wrong, and that its toleration would be ruinous to the country. Since that time he has been properly regarded as a republican, though, in truth, he is a member of no party. He upholds what he believes to be right and contributes liberally to whatever, in his opinion, has a tendency to promote the public good, but supports no man merely because he is the "nominee" of a particular political party.

## GEORGE A. MURRELL. Va Ky



The name of this old family is intimately associated with the pioneer history of central Missouri, one of the first permanent settlements in Saline county having been made by Daniel Thornton as early as the year 1816. Daniel Thornton was a native of Charleston, South Carolina, where his birth occurred on the 26th of March. 1788, being the third of four children born to John and Polly Thornton. When a mere youth he removed with his parents to the eastern part of Tennessee, where he assisted his father on the farm until twenty years of age, when he married Mary Neff, of Jackson county, that state, and began cultivating the soil upon his own responsibility. Mrs. Mary Thornton, who was born March 28, 1791, was a daughter of John and Susan Neff, whose respective families were among the old and well known settlers of Jackson county.

Eight years after his marriage Daniel Thornton disposed of his interests in Tennessee and moved to Missouri, which at that time was the western border of civilization, traveling by water down the Ohio and up the Mississipal and Missouri rivers, pulling the boat with ropes and poling it against the current until arriving, in June, 1816, at a point just north of the present site of Arrow Rock, in what is now Saline county, where a landing was made and a settlement founded. According to well authenticated information, this, as already stated, appears to have been the first settlement within the present limits of the county of Saline. Mr. Thornton was accompanied from Tennessee by a brother-in-law of Mrs. Thornton, one Isaac Clark, who with his family located near the site of Saline City, where he remained a short time and then removed to Lexington, near which place he secured land and made a permanent settlement. For a short time after his arrival in the new country Mr. Thornton lived in a tent, but, the Indians becoming quite troublesome, he took his ramily to Cooper Fort in Howard county where they remained until all danger from the savages was over. Returning to his land, he erected a comfortable by cabin and, clearing a few acres, raised a crop of corn, which, with vegetables and wild game, afforded the family ample subsistence until a larger crop was grown the following year. Later he entered a quarter section of prairie land, to which he added at intervals until at one time he owned five hundred acres, the greater part of which he reduced to cultivation. Mr. Thornton conducted farming on quite an extensive scale, raising crops of hemp, flax, corn and oats, for all of which there appears to have been ready sale at fair prices. He was a man of intelligence and great force of character, a leader in the settlement and for many years took an active part in the development of the country and in directing matters of public moment. Religiously he and his family belonged to the Christian church, the first organization of which body in Saline county was the old Concord congregation, near Saline City, with which he held membership. Previous to his removal to Missouri he had served as purvate in the United States army, during the war of 1812, and while living in Saline county he took part in the Black Hawk war, but was absent from home only a few months during the latter trouble. Mr. Thornton lived a useful life and his death, which occurred on the 31st of August, 1855, was greatly deplored by his fellow citizens of Saline county. His widow, who survived him nearly nineteen years, departed this life on the 3d day of March, 1874.

Daniel and Susan Thornton were the parents of twelve children, namely: Susan, Rebecca, John, Isaac, Catherine, Elizabeth, Polly, Nancy, Lydia, Henderson, Mary and Andrew J., the first four born in Tennessee, the others in Missouri. Of this large family but two are living at the present time, Mrs. Nancy Cameron, of Slater, Missouri, who was born March 5, 1824, and Andrew Jackson, of Thornton, this state, who first saw the light of day on May 4, 1833.

Isaac Thornton, the fourth of the above children, was born in Jackson county, Tennessee, January 26, 1816, and brought to Missouri in infancy. He grew to maturity on his father's farm near Arrow Rock, and at the early age of nineteen took to himself a wife in the person of Rachel Chappell, who was born in North Carolina in 1815, being a daughter of Elisha Chappell, who came to Saline county in an early day and settled near the Thornton homestead. A short time after his marriage Mr. Thornton moved to northwestern Missouri and entered land in Buchanau county, which he improved and on which he lived until 1855, when he sold this farm and returning to Saline county, became associated with his father and brother-in-law in the manufacture of lumber. While in Buchanau county he built a water-power sawmill, to which he afterwards added machinery for grinding flour and meal and which in its twofold capacity was greatly prized by the people of the community.

Isaac Thornton, like his father and brothers, was a Democrat and a most excellent and praiseworthy citizen. He lived a long and useful life and died lamented by all who knew him, in 1905, after rounding out his eighty-ninth year, his wife preceding him to the grave in September, 1891. They had a family of eight children, one of whom, Isaac L., died in infancy, the names of those who grew-to maturity being as follows: James H., of Tulare City, California; Daniel, who lives in Clinton, Missouri; John C., deceased; Andrew J., Jr., of Clay township, Saline county; Elisha E., a merchant of Saline City; Mrs. Mary F. Morris, a resident of Marshall, and William H., whose home is in Malta Bend, Missouri.

Elisha E. Thornton, the fifth child of Isaac and Rachel Thornton, was born April 8, 1846, in Buchanan county, Missouri, and remained with his parents until twenty-two years of age, attending school during his youth and later assisting his father with the work of the latter's sawmill. On September 1, 1868, he entered the marriage relation with Mary E. Stapp, who was born in Howard county, Missouri, December 13, 1849, and during the three years ensuing continued the milling business with success and financial profit. At the expiration of that time he rented a farm in Clay township, but after a few months' residence, returned to the county of Saline and accepted the position of engineer of his father's mill. After serving three years in that capacity he moved to a small farm on Island No. 2, Clay township, where he lived three years and then took up his residence in Saline City, leasing the mill of his father and operating the same in partnership with his brother, James, during

the four years following. Discontinuing the manufacture of lumber at the end of the period indicated, Mr. Thornton, in 1886, took a contract for sarrying the mails from Saline to Slater, which position he held until 1801, when he moved to the latter place, where for about six months he was engaged in the poultry business. Returning to Saline City in 1892 to care for his father, he still makes his home in that city, and since the year 1809 has had charge of a grocery store, which formerly belonged to Mr. Dysart, his son-in-law, but which since his death he conducts in his own name. On the death of his father Mr. Thornton inherited the latter's home on the banks of the Missonii river, which he now occupies and which is one of the most beautiful residence sites in Saline City. Mr. and Mrs. Thornton have two children, namely: Perials. born June 1, 1860, married at the age of nineteen T. S. Dysart, of Rend oph who died in 1809, leaving two children, Estell and Jeff H. Dysart. Subsequently, March, 1909, Mrs. Dysart became the wife of Onic Thomas, of City township, where they now reside. Wilbern E., the second child of E. E. and Mary Thornton, was born in Saline City, May, 1872, and now lives in Maricopia, near Bakerfield, California.

Andrew Jackson Thornton, youngest child of Daniel and Mary (Neif) Thornton, was born in Arrow Rock township, Saline county, Missouri, May 4, 1833. He received a common school education and remained with his parents until their respective deaths, receiving as his share of the homestead one hundred ten acres, on which he lived and prospered until 1875, when he sold the place and moved to another farm in the vicinity, which he also owned. After residing on the latter farm until 1880, he built a beautiful and commodious modern dwelling in Saline City, which he has occupied since that year, devoting his attention in the meantime to blacksmithing and wagon making.

On November 6, 1860, was solemnized the marriage of Andrew J. Thornton and Sarah J. Wiley, the latter born December 22, 1844, in North Carolina, being a daughter of Norwood and Alice (Gossett) Wiley, natives of the Old North state, but since 1858 residents of Saline county, Missouri. Nine children have resulted from this union, viz: Mrs. Mary B. Romine, born August 23, 1861, now living at Enid, Oklahoma: Susan Ada, wife of James Thornton, born January 6, 1863, and residing in Clay township; Mrs. Alice D. Walling, of Hugo, Oklahoma, born February 28, 1865; Henry N., of Clay township, Saline county, born April 18, 1869; Mrs. Alice Childers, born August 28, 1872; Rebecca E., who was born January 23, 1875, is still with her parents; Charles A., of Clay township, was born August 27, 1878; Mrs. Susan I. Reynolds, born September 7, 1880, lives in Saline City, and Willard W., who is still a member of the home circle and a pilot on the Missouri river, was born November 24, 1882.

Politically Mr. Thornton is a Democrat and religiously subscribes to the plain teachings of the Christian church. During the late Civil war he espoused the Southern cause and for about ten months served in the Confederate army under General Price, going to the front as a private in a Howard county company, and achieving a creditable record.

JAMES THORNTON, farmer and stock-raiser, P. O., Arrow Rock. Born in Howard county, Missouri, March 13, 1827. His father, Peter Thornton, was born in Virginia, 1779. He married for his first wife Mary Miller, January 20, 1802, by whom he had five children, all deceased. He moved to Howard county, and married Elizabeth Snyder, September 16, 1824. They had one child, James. Peter Thornton moved to Saline county in 1830, and settled on the farm where his son James now resides. His wife died July 6, 1857, and he followed her February 5, 1860. They are both buried on the home place. James, the only child, was educated in the common schools of Saline county. He was first married to Amanda M. Bridgewater, November 21, 1844. They

had five children, three of whom are now living, two boys and one girl: William D., Emma E. Crockett and James C. His first wife died May 26, 1863, and was buried in the family graveyard. He was married again August 1, 1865, to Eliza E. Talbott, daughter of Rev. N. M. Talbott. They have six children, all living, three boys and three girls: Susan J., Frances E., Nathaniel P., Luraney D., Edward F. and Henry B. He owns 300 acres of splendid land. Is engaged in farming and stock-raising. In 1864, he enlisted as private in the Confederate army. under Gen. Price, in Capt. Divers' company, Col. Wood's battalion, Gen. Shelby's division. Was in the following battles: Lexington, Blues, Independence, Newtonia and Little Osage, where Gen. Marmaduke was captured. In the battle of Independence he had a very narrow escape. He was ordered to dismount and advance ten paces to the front. His regiment was ordered to form on him. Just then the enemy made a flank movement, and his colonel ordered the regiment to retreat. Mr. Thornton, with two of his comrades, did not hear the order, and when the regiment fell back, they were left alone to receive the fire of 300 Federals. They, however, miraculously escaped without a scratch. In the fall of 1872, he was elected county assessor of Saline county. In 1874, he was re-elected, serving two terms with credit to himself and his county. He has been an honored member of the Baptist Church since the age of twelve vears.

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



JAMES NEFF, P. O., Marshall. Mr. Neff was born in Cook county, Tennessee, April 27, 1823. His father, Isaac Neff, was born in Jefferson county, Tennessee, in 1798, and was married to Lucy Romines, of which union there were five children, four of whom are now living: John, Abram, James, and Susan. Isaac Neff came to Saline county in the fall of 1836, traveling in wagons, with his family and twelve or thirteen negroes. He died in 1879, and was buried on the home place. His widow still survives him, and is living at the old home place. His name, originally, was Nave, but he had it changed to Neff. Mr. James Neff, the oldest son, was but three years of age when his parents moved to Saline. He was educated at the country schools, and continued on his father's farm until 1866, when he moved to a farm which his father entered, and on which he now lives, eight miles east of Marshall, where he now owns 600 acres of fine land, 180 under fence. In the spring of 1861, he was married to Miss Mary Hungerford, who is a native of this county, born September 13, 1844. Seven children have been born to this union, six of whom are now living, three boys: Isaac, Robert, and James; and three girls: Ella, Lulu, and Sadie. Ida, the eldest daughter, is now deceased. In 1861, Mr. Neff enlisted in the Confederate army; first in Capt. Wm. B. Brown's company, then in Col. McCullough's regiment; was at the battles of Booneville, Carthage, and Wilson's Creek. After which he was taken sick, and returned home, and in December, 1861, he intended, with his brother, to go in Robertson's command, but failed to get ready, and thus escaped capture. He could not stay at home, so he went to Logan county, Illinois, and stayed there until the war was over, and then returned home.

JOHN M. NEFF, farmer, was born in Tennessee, June 24, 1817. He came to Missouri with his mother when quite young, and was educated in this county. When they came to Saline, they settled on the farm now occupied by Dr. A. Neff. John Neff was married February 14, 1853, to Mary Neff, his second cousin, daughter of George Neff. After his marriage, Mr. John M. Neff lived on a farm twelve miles east of Marshall, upon which he died, August 28, 1877, and was buried on the Isaac Neff farm. They had eight children, seven of whom are living, five girls and two boys: Nancy E., Dixon, Lucy Ann, Mary Bell, Fanny G., Laura J., Isaac, and Walter A. Mrs. Neff and her sons continue to carry on the farm since her husband's death.

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zen of Saline County, resides upon his fine farm on section 5, township 51, range 20, near the town of Slater. He was born in Albemarle County, Va., in 1838, the sen of Thomas C. and Elizabeth W. (Jackson) Duggins, and is descended from English ancestry. His great-grand-father married an Irish lady from the city of Dub-

lin, and the one child born to them was the grandfather of the subject of this sketch. After the death of her husband, the widow, with her only child William, emigrated to America and settled in Fredericksburgh, Va. There she afterward married Robert Wilkinson, by whom she had three children, and passed her last days in that town.


When about twelve years of age the grandfather of our subject went to Louisa County and learned the trade of blacksmith and silversmith, and became a first-class workman. At the beginning of the Revolution he joined the Continental army, and during the war his handsome fortune was dissipated. He served until the end of the war, and then married Miss Elizabeth, a daughter of William Perkins, of the well-known family of that name in South Carolina. They reared twelve sons and one daughter. John, Lewis and Thomas C. settled in this county; Fleming P. and Franklin A. located in Texas; Pouncy made his home in Perry County; Robert, Jefferson and James remained in Louisa County, Va., where all the children were born; William removed to Hanover County, Va.; and John to Goochland County, of the same State; and Jane married Joseph Cross, and remained in her rative county.

On the maternal side, the great-grandfather of our subject was Thomas Jackson, a native of Virginia. The grandmother was Margaret, a daughter of Daniel White, who was a captain in the Revolutionary War, and was present at the surrender of the English troops of Yerktown. He married Miss Elizabeth Motes and they reared a family of four sons and so charghters. He was of Weish and his wife of Scotch and stry. Grandfather Jackson was of Irish and mality, and was a consin of President Amirew Jackson.

The distinguished father of our subject, Thomas C. Duggins, was one of the early settlers of the West, and was a man of one gy, with small capital, who left the more densely populated sections of country that he might obtain the advantages to be found in the comparatively sparsely-settled regions of the new States. He was born in Louisa County, Va., March 10, 1810, and was scared to manhood within his native county. He received a liberal education, embracing a thorough course in mathe-

matics, astronomy, philosophy, etc., and a partial course in I dam. He made a specialty of surveying, in which he figured prominently after becoming a citizen of Missouri. Early in life he studied ail of the details of the profession, the thorough knowledge of which afterward gave him the reputation of being the best surveyor who has as yet laid out lands in this county. From 1829 to 1838 he taught school in Virginia. He was married in 1833 to Miss Elizabeth W., daughter of Thomas and Margaret (White) Jackson. A marc's wife is always his safest counselor, and such it proved to be in this case, as it was in accordance with his young wife's advices that Mr. Duggins left the endeared scenes of home and friends, and set his face toward the setting sun. They bade farewell to old Virginia, September 19, 1838, and arrived in Boone County, this State, November 4, traveling the entire distance by wagon.

Mr. Duggins and his wife remained nearly two years in that county, where he was chiefly employed in surveying, having received an interest in a contract obtained from the Government for surveying the Platt Purchase. His partner so managed affairs as to allow Mr. Duggins to have all of the honor, while he took all of the profits to himself. After bearing all of the expenses, he never received more than \$2, thus incurring a loss of about \$10,000. This was a rather severe introduction to Western life, but the lesson proved a salutary one.

In August, 1840, Mr. Duggins removed to Saline County, and made location in the neighborbood where he ever afterward resided. From 1843 to 1845 he entered and located the lands composing portions of the present farm. After coming here he spent some years in teaching, until his election to the office of County Surveyor in 1843, which position he held until 1859. In 1864 he was re-appointed by the County Court, and served until 1868. He passed through many vicissitudes, experienced some heavy losses, but as a final result owned about twelve hundred acres of land, most of which is under cultivation, and upon which there are good improvements. This farm contains large quantities of fine building sandstone, is underlaid with an abundance of coal, has an inexhaustible supply of water, and is in every respect well adapted to stock-raising, for which it has been successfully used for a number of years.

Altogether. Mr. Duggins was very successful in life, and though he may not have realized in full the extent of his youthful ambition, still be amassed a sufficiency of this world's goods. With his wife, the companion of his youth, the sharer of his toils and comforts, he passed his later years in peace and plenty. In his domestic relations he was highly blessed, and gave each of his children a good education. He was a wan to be remembered for many noble traits of character, and was a devout Christian, and a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church South. A strong-minded, active business man, he accumulated property rapidly, and was generous in his support of worthy enterprises.

Wisliam T. Duggins was educated in the common schools of Saline County, where he carried on his studies until the age of eighteen. Afterward he became interested in a store at Cambridge. At the age of twenty-three he enlisted under Capt. Brown in the Rangers' Division, with which he served until it disbanded. Later he entered Shelby's Division, Company E, Williams' Regiment, and remained there until the close of the war in 1865. Among the severe engagements in which he participated were those of Lexington and Dry Wood. He was taken prisoner at Glasgow and was held for six months in Boonville, in Southwest Missouri.

After the close of the war, our subject returned home and began farming upon sections 4 and 5, where he remained for a period of seven years. At the expiration of that time he purchased the old homestrael for \$3.500, and now has a well-improved farm of two hundred and forty acres of land, which is valued at \$60 per acre. Here he grows grain and may, principally, and the gross receipts amount annually to \$2,500. Mr. Duggins and his wife are consistent members of the Methodist Episcopal Church South, and he is a liberal supporter of the same. It family has been reared to respect the church, and several, with their parents, have become members of it.

The marriage of our subject took place in 1866, to Miss Acua Pulliam, who was born in Saline County, Mo., and they became the parents of four children. Katie, born in 1867; Mary, in 1871;

and Micajah, in 1874, are still under the home roof. Dera D., who was born in 1869, died in 1884. The mother of these children died February 9, 1875. Politically, our subject is a Democrat, and has taken a deep interest in political affairs, but has never desired nor aspired to official honors.

This well known citizen has been connected with the manufacturing and industrial development of Saline county for more than tifty-three years. During that time he has done his full share towards helping on the community at present occupying several posts of responsibility and trust. He was been in Madison county, Virginia, August 7, 1835, and remained in his native state for twenty-one years, when he was attracted to the West as afferding good opportunities for young men who were willing to work and knew how to do things. His father, Robert F. Page, was a native of Melson county, Virginia, and worked during most of his active life at his made as

* miller. He was a substantial man, of fine character, moral impulse and an integrity that could not be swerved. He died in 1884, when seventy-four years old, a consistent member of the Methodist church, to which he had belonged for many years. He married Sarah Jones, a native of Albemarle county, Virginia, who reached the musual age of ninety years before her death, which occurred only a few years ago. This worthy couple had ten children, all of whom have passed away except three, Z. K., a resident of Virginia; William B., who lives in Texas, and the subject. E. R., deceased, is represented in a sketch elsewhere in this volume.

Chastain G. Page, the eldest of the family, obtained his training and early education in the Old Dominion, but as soon as he reached legal age he furned his foot-steps to the rapidly rising region beyond the Mississippi. He had decided to locate in Missouri, and reached Saline county in 1850, from which time, with a short intermission of two years spent in the Rocky Mountains, he has made his home here. His first work after reaching the county was as a carpenter and for several years he relied on that good old trade for a living. About 1889 he became one of the organizers of the Rea & Page Milling and Elevator Company, at Marshall, and now holds the postion of vice-president of that organization. This is one of the best mills In the state, having a daily capacity of two hundred and seventy-five bargels, and its establishment in Marshall has made a valuable contribution to the city's industries. Mr. Page is also vice-president of the Wood & Huston Bank, of Marshall, a financial institution which does a good business. and is a worthy member of many agencies engaged in strengthening the city's credit and pushing its industries.

Mr. Page married Anna Hafford, of Cape Cod, Massachusetts, and has two children: C. G., Jr., and Nellie C. The parents belong to the old-school Presbyterian church.

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



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## Blosser Home for Crippled Children

The Georgia Brown Blosser
Home for Crippled Children was
founded and incorporated in the
year 1932, under the will of Mrs.
Georgia Brown Blosser, who
was the wife of Louis P. Blosser, living in Marshall, Mo.

Mrs. Blosser left certain real estate and the sum of \$500,000 with which to build and maintain the home. Her will named the following nine persons to serve as the original Board of Trustees of the Home: Louis P. Blosser, Howard Beazley, Mrs. Nadine Irvine, Ralph H. Duggins, Frank H. Naylor, Mrs. Mattie B. Yancey, William G. Rea, John M. Wilson and Leonard W. 'Van Dyke.

The trustees purchased a seven acre tract adjoining the Louis P. Blosser home and used approximately \$100,000 for the building thereon of a modern crippled children's home.

Trust Fund Provided

The will provided that the remainder of the funds be placed with the Merchantile Trust Company of St. Louis as trustee, with the income therefrom to be available for the operation of the home.

Albert M. Owens, architect, of the firm of Saylor and Owens, Kansas City, planned the building. John Epple of Columbia was the contractor-builder.

The dedication service was held January 16, 1934.

The building was planned for the particular purpose of caring for 40 crippled children; the wards on the ground level, opening on a covered patio, and ramps were provided. The home has been fully equipped, including an excellent physical therapy department and everything meeded in the care of crippled children.

Home For Convalescents

While the board of trustees has general supervision of the home, Mrs. Blosser's will provided that the professional management should be under the direction of the faculty of the School of Medicine, University of Missouri, and that the institution should serve as a hospitalhome for convalescent needy crippled children, designated by the faculty as proper subjects for treatment. Under this arrangement, most of the children have come to the home through the University hospital at Columbia, Mo. However, patients have come from St. Luke's hospital and the Children's Mercy hospital, Kansas City, from the Missouri Methodist hospital, St. Joseph, and, occasionally from Burge hospital in Springfield.

The faculty of the school of medicine, working with the Crippled Children's Service through the university, has furnished excellent professional service for the children in the home.

Dr. Edgar Allen, Dean, University of Missouri School of Medicine, and Dr. William J. Stewart, chief of orthopedic surgery, attended the third meeting of the trustees, December 2, 1932. They were eager to see the new institution in operation at the earliest date possible, as a great need existed for its facilities in connection with the crippled children's work in Columbia.

Praise For Dr. Stewart

Without question, Dr. Stewart has devoted more time to the home and its children than any other person. Scarcely a week has gone by since 1932, that he has not performed surgery on crippled children, looked after them in clinics and visited them in the home. They have had his continuing supervision and attention.

During Dr. Stewart's absence for military service in World War II, Dr. Robert McE. Schauffler, Children's Mercy hospital, Kansas City, assumed much of the responsibility for the children's care.

The physicians in Marshall have helped with the medical care whenever needed.

Dr. Dudley Conley, Dean, School of Medicine, and Dr. Middlebush, President of the University of Missouri, were helpful with problems of the home during their tenures at the university.

Officers and Board

The officers of the home, at the time of this publication are: Louis P. Blosser, president; Mrs. J. Francis Buie, vice president; L. W. Van Dyke, treasurer; John P. Huston, secretary, with Elizabeth Martin, R. N., serving as administrator. Other members of the board of trustees are: Mrs. E. Lee McCorkle, Dr. M. D. Overholser, Dr. Carl G. Marienfeld, Dr. Clement Brooke and H. H. Harris.

In addition to the original trustees and the trustees listed above, the following have served on the board: Homer E. Rich, Arthur Nebel, Albert M. Keller, Meril J. Alderman, Dr. Trawick H. Stubbs and Dr. M. Pinson Neal.

Since the founding of the home in 1932, more than 2,700 children have been patients, many of them have been re-admitted several times for further treatment. The nome has been open to any race, color or creed.

For many years the home accepted poliomyelitis patients, from orthopedists approved by the faculty of the school of medicine, University of Missouri, to be cared for by the county chapters, National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis. So many children have been given the poliomyelitis vaccines that few new patients are afflicted with poliomyelitis.

Types of Ailments

The roster of types of ailments of children treated at the home would cover the list of handicaps following poliomyelitis, congenital deformities, traumatic accidents, burns, surgical procedures for correction of these infirmities and rehabilitation by physical therapy.

In 1942, Lavada Windler, R. N. a graduate of Sister Kenney's school for treatment of children afflicted with poliomyelitis, became the first physical therapist.

By 1950, the need arose for a better equipped physical therapy department. A Hubbard tank, a whirlpool, heat therapy machines, and other equipment were added.

Glover Martin Is Therapist

Jean M. Erickson, R.P.T. was the first registered physical therapist. In 1952, Mrs. Viola Lacer, R. N., R.P.T., became therapist. Miss Windler returned in 1957 to work in the department. Glover Martin, B. S., R.P.T., was appointed in 1958 and has continued to work as therapist.

The Occupational therapy department was established early. Miss Nell Finlay was the first occupational therapist, being followed by Mrs. Huff and Mrs. Miriam Young, who for ten years has continued to provide a program of interesting things for the children to do.

The full-time school has provided continuing education for the children. They have received credit for all their work.

From the time the home was opened to 1949, the school was under the direction of Dr. C. A. Phillips, Dean, School of Education, University of Missouri. He chose the teachers. The first teacher was Miss Ozella Krohn. Teachers following her were: Mrs. Roberta Bennington, Miss Mary Catherine David, Miss Marjorie Wahn, Mrs. Marian Abernathy McCarty, Miss Winifred Mabry, Mrs. Helen Gibson, Miss Jean Krouse, Miss Clara Meschede, John Hunt and Miss Sims, Louise who worked through the summer.

In 1949, the school board of the Marshall school district accepted the proposal to make the educational program of the home a part of the public school system of Marshall. Miss Clara Meschede was teacher at that time and has remained teacher of grades one to six. In 1950, Mrs. Roberta Bennington returned to the home as teacher of grades seven to twelve. She has continued in that position.

The administration of the home has been under the supervision of registered nurses:

Helen Nahm, June 1933 to January 1935,

Eugenia Nahm, January 1935 to May 25, 1938,

Madeline Iffrig, May to July 1938 (Acting),

Dorothy Gillette, August 1938 to May 1942,

Marie Temer, May 1942 to August 1946,

Dora Jarboe Ream, August 1946 to January 1947,

Clara Margaret Whaley, (Acting) January-February 1947

Ester Brown, March 1947 to October 1949,

Alberta Jane Beckman, October 1949 to April 1955,

Elizabeth Martin, from April 1955 to date.

The first moving pictures were shown at the home in 1935 by Clark White. In 1948, J. Leo Hayob furnished equipment to establish the showing of 35 millimeter commercial pictures. Through the years Mr. Hayob has booked pictures on a biweekly basis for the entertainment of the children.

Friends of the home have made contributions in many ways. Assistance has come from men's and women's clubs, churches, schools, theater groups, college students, Scouts, and many other organizations, as well as from individuals too numerous to mention. Crippled children's organizations have been helpful. Through the influence of Henry Kleine, chairman, Saline County, Crippled Children's Society, money has been given for equipment, holding of clinics, and rehabilitation of patients by physical therapy.

Have Religious Services

Although the home has not been connected with any particular religious organization, a Sunday school has been conducted through the planning of the Ministerial Alliance of Marshall. The priests from St. Peter's church have attended to the needs of the Catholic children.

No doubt, the backbone of any organization is its personnel. The home has had numerous loyal and efficient workers, registered nurses, practical nurses, nurses' aides, office, dietary and maintenance personnel. Each has tried to contribute the best in the care of children,



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Henry Blasser

ENRY BLOSSER, an extensive and prosperous agriculturist, residing in township 51, range 22, Saline County, is a progressive citizen, widely known throughout his section of the country and universally respected for his ability and integrity of character. Our subject was born in Virginia March 24, 1831. The Blossers are of Swiss descent, and at an early day settled in Virginia. Grandfather Jacob Blosser was born in Virginia January 13, 1756, and died October 6, 1842, in Shenandoah County. His wife. a Miss Beary, was a member of an old Virginia family. Joseph Blosser, the father of our subject, a native of Shenandoah County, was born at five o'clock in the morning of the 2d of March, 1795. He spent the days of boyhood in Virginia, and became a miller, as had been his father before him. He owned and operated for many years a mill on the Hawksbill, a small stream emptying into the Shenandoah River. This mill he finally traded for three hundred and twenty acres of land, located in Pike County, Ohio.

Removing with his family to this purchase in 1831, they found the land almost an impenetrable forest, and were obliged to live in a rail pen until a log cabin could be erected. They wintered in a cabin without a door, but of these pioneer scenes our subject remembers nothing, as he was at the time but an infant six months old. The wife of Joseph Blosser was Sarah Jane Bacy, the daughter of Henry Bacy, of Culpeper County, Va., The maternal grandfather of Henry Blosser was a veteran of the Revolutionary War, and a man of energy and resolution. Joseph Blosser, after remov-

ing to Ohio, did but little farming, but operated a mill, and as the boys grew to manhood they cleared the land and improved the farm. In politics, the father was a Whig. He died December 17, 1863, in Pike County, Ohio. His wife passed away in Mercer County, Ohio, November 7, 1876. Their children numbered nine: Elizabeth Ann, widow of Aaron Saylor, of Malta Bend, Mo.: Susan, deceased; Barbara, widow of Joseph Gee, of Ohio; Jacob, who lives in Ohio; Henry, our subject; Joseph, who resides in Kansas; John, deceased; Daniel, who lives in Kansas; and Mary, the wife of Valentine Roach, whose home is in Mercer County, Ohio.

Our subject was but three months old when his parents moved to Ohio, traveling in an old covered wagon, and camping out by night during the two months which the journey required. Mr. Blosser remained at home on the Pike County farm until twenty-one years of age, when he worked out for himself, first at farm work, earning \$13 per month, the first money he had ever received for himself. He next took a lease of fifty acres of bottom land, heavily timbered, belonging to his father. This he cleared and seeded to grass, and then sold his lease for \$300, which sum gave him his first start in life, about the year 1856.

Upon March 18, 1858, our subject was united in marriage with Miss Sarah Baker, a daughter of Josiah and Emma (Schooley) Baker, of Ross County, Ohio, and Virginians by birth. Mrs. Blosser was born in Ross County, Ohio, in 1839, and was one of seven children, four sons and three daughters, five of whom are living. A devoted wife, Mrs. Blosser has also by her refined and cultured manners, drawn a large circle of friends into an intimate acquaintance with the family. She is always ready to aid the needy, to comfort the sorrowing and to sympathize with the distressed, and it is her delight to lend a helping hand to those who need assistance.

In 1860, Mr. Blosser bought in Ross County, Ohio, two hundred and forty acres of land for \$11,000, although at the time he had only \$2,000 of his own. After three years he exchanged the place for a smaller farm, receiving the difference, and selling the last purchase in 1865 for \$11,000.

Having disposed of his property in Ohio, he at once departed for Saline County, Mo., with \$5,500 in his possession. At first he bought two hundred and forty acres of land, which he industriously improved for three years, adding other tracts meantime, and finally selling all for \$12,000. He then bought six hundred and forty acres where he now resides, paying therefor the sum of \$14,400.

The extensive acreage was then all prairie land unimproved, but has since received an addition, now making in the large and highly improved farm a total of nearly nine hundred acres. Mr. Blosser also owns in Republic County, Kan., five hundred acres of land, which he bought in 1883. At about the same time he purchased a tract of thirteen hundred acres of bottom land for about \$14,000, and in the spring of 1884 he sold eight hundred acres of the same for \$12,000. The remaining five hundred acres he has since improved, and the land now yields from ten to fifteen thousand bushels of corn per year.

Upon the home farm Mr. Blosser and his sons engage in general farming, raising wheat extensively, their acreage of that cereal sometimes producing ten thousand bushels per year. They use their own threshers, having on the place two steam threshing-machines of the most improved patented make. The intelligent family of our subject is composed of one daughter and six sons. Erskine, the eldest-born, married Annie Otte; Mary, the wife of Ward Haskett, lives in Saline County; Joseph is married to Ruby Sprague; Quincy married Elizabeth Gauldin; Henry I. married Clara Heskett; William and Louis are at school. Joseph has the management of the Kansas property, and the other sons are settled on the home lands.

As a boy, Mr. Blosser had a passion for hunting, and he is yet an enthusiastic follower of that sport. When he first came to Missouri he found abundant use for his rifle, quantities of wild game being plentiful, but now he is obliged to go farther in their pursuit, and every August or September for the past five or six years he has gone to Wyoming or Colorado, remaining for two months at a time. In this health-renewing and delightful excursion, he is accompanied by his wife and sons, who take with them a full camping outfit. As

trophies, the hall of the commodious family residence contains the head of an elk, and in the sitting-room is a specimen of the head and neck of a magnificent elk. In another room, the walls are decorated with the heads of blacktail deer, shot in Wyoming. The home dwelling is a large, artistically designed and finely finished mansion of three stories, including the mansard, which contains several rooms. The house, surrounded by beautiful foliage and stately old trees, makes a picture not easily forgotten.

Mr. Blosser has accumulated his property by self-reliant industry and enterprise. He is a man of strictly temperate habits and believes in the prohibition laws. In business transactions his word is considered as good as his bond. Mr. and Mrs. Blosser and their family are all members of the Christian Church, and are prominent in all good works of their locality. Our subject has been an Elder in the church for many years, and has been most liberal in the support of that religious organization, and is also known as a generous giver to those less fortunate than himself. He and his sons are ardent Republicans. During the war he was a stanch Union man, and three of his brothers served in the Federal army. Although his investments have all been most profitable, and in consequence of his excellent judgment and superior business ability, he has been exceedingly prospered, Mr. Blosser is unostentatious and genial, and exhibits in his mode of living the simplicity and kindness of heart which distinguish the true American citizen.

## Blosser Home For Women

The Georgia Brown Blosser
Home for the Aged was founded
and incorporated by a pro forma decree of incorporation under the statutes of Missouri for
benevolent organizations; in the
circuit court of Saline county,
Missouri, in the year 1932, to
carry out the provisions of the
will of Mrs. Georgia Brown
Blosser, who was the wife of
Louis P. Blosser, Marshall, Mo.

Mrs. Blosser by her will left a sum of \$250,000 in trust with the Mercantile Trust company of St. Louis, Mo., for which to purchase a site and to build, maintain and equip a home for aged, respectable, indigent women who are members of the Methodist Episcopal church, and who, at the time of admission are actual residents of Saline county or one of its adjoining counties, and have been residents of such counties for at least five years prior to the time of entrance.

Mrs. Blosser named the following persons to serve as the original Board of Directors of the Home: Louis P. Blosser, Howard Beazley, Nadine Irvine, Ralph H. Duggins, Frank H. Naylor, Mattie Yancey, William G. Rea, Leonard W. Van Dyke and John M. Wilson. Vacancies on the board are filled by a vote of the remaining members, and approved by the annual conference of the Methodist church.

The directors purchased from Brisley and Woodsmall tracts of land adjoining the Blosser home for approximately \$6,250 and used \$39,443.31 for the building of a modern home to house nine persons. Owens & Saylor, Kansas City, Mo., were the architects and John Epple Construction company of Columbia, Mo., were the contractors.

The home was completed and open house to the public was held December 20, 1936. The building is a modern, fully equipped home for the residents and is kept in a fine state of repairs with up to date equipment. It is operated by a superintendent and assistant superintendent and in case of sickness of a member an infirmary in the home is available with a registered nurse in attendance. The net income on the remainder of the trust fund is available for the operation and maintenance of the home.

The first residents were Miss Nealie M. Long, Marshall, Mo., and Mrs. Burre Hoy Kemp, Blackwater, Mo. There have been a total of twenty-one residents in the home from the date of opening. The superintendents of the home were Mrs. Fred Gordon, Mrs. J. B. Swinney, Mrs. Mattie A. Davis, and Mrs. Josephine Reed, named in the order in which they served.

The Georgia Brown Blosser Home for the Aged has received numerous bequests from various estates, and the directors are grateful and thankful therefor.

The officers and the members of the board, at the time of this publication, are Louis P. Blosser, chairman of the board; Mary Beazley president; Ivy McClue, first vice president; P. H. Rea, second vice president; H. H. Harris, Jr., secretary and treasurer; Juanita Duggins, assistant secretary; L. W. Van Dyke; Dorothy Brown, Nellie Brown Keller, with Josephine Reed serving as superintendent.


#### CHRISTIAN CHURCH.

This church was organized in 1851, the original members being C. H. Hickman and wife, A. F. Bruce and wife, B. F. Downs and wife, — Bowen and wife, Bettie Odell, S. Harris and wife, Mrs. Barbara Smith, Mrs. Georgia Bruce, and others. A frame church was built in the year 1852, at a cost of \$2,000, It was dedicated the same year by Rev. D. P. Henderson. It is still standing. The pastors have been Elders J. W. McGarvey, — Stewart, George Plattenburg, W. H. Robinson, O. Spencer, John Duncan, R. N. Davis, R. M. Messick. Present membership, 300.


The original organization of this church was broken up during the war, and was re-organized in 1866, by Elder Geo. Plattenburg, with about thirty members. During the year 1880, this church, by an almost unanimous vote, decided that it would not tolerate the signing of dramshop petitions by its members. The church, at this time, is in a flourishing condition under the charge of its present pastor. Its officers at present are Dr. W. S. Holland, G. C. Fletcher, Dr. M. T. Chastain, W. D. Woodson, elders. The deacons are W. H. Fletcher, Wm. Walker, Daniel Folck, and John Coyle.

HE Marshall church was organized by Elder D. P. Henderson in 1847, with Aaron F. Bruce and Stewart Harris as Elders. The first meeting place of the little band was in the County Court house, but soon a neat frame building was erected and the church became a permanent religious force in the community. During the years from 1847 to 1861 the church was prospered, a being served by several of our best preachers and pastors. But during those dark years from 1861 to 1865 Marshall was in the midst of the strife and devastation of war, and this congregation, together with every other church in the community, was "scattered abroad." Their beautiful house was desolated. It was occupied by the Federal troops as a depot of supplies and finally as a stable for their horses—so that from being "a house of prayer" it became a place of war. At this time all past

records of the church were destroyed, so that anything like a connected history of the early years of the church is impossible. And too, there had hardly come to our people anywhere the period of settled pastors. Our preachers "went everywhere preaching the word." So no one is noted as serving the church for any considerable length of time during these fourteen years. Some simply held a protracted meeting, others preached regularly one, two, three or four times a month for a while. Many just stopped over a Lordsday or through a week to greet and strengthen their Brethren, so during this time the pulpit of the church was occupied by almost all our celebrated pioneer preachers of the time. Alex. Campbell was here on different occasions.

After the war, it was not until 1867 that the scattered members of the church were brought together, a meeting held, and out of the old and new materials a new organization was affected. It was out of the labors of several faithful preachers of this time that this re-organization, or new organization, came. Among these were Elders Azbill, Allen, W. H. Robinson, and others.

Their house was repaired, or practically a new one was built, which was occupied by the church until it moved into its present handsome structure in 1886.

About the first regular, pastor after the re-organization was W. H. Robinson. Both before and after his affliction of blindness Bro. Robinson served this congregation faithfully and well. In the year immediately following, the congregation was served by Elder Waller, Wm. Pinkerton, Geo. Plattenburg, Elisha Pinkerton, J. H. Duncan, R. N. Davis, and others. Each of these is held in grateful remembrance by the congregation. Each one proved himself to be a grand man of God "a workman that needed not to be ashamed."

R. N. Davis was followed by R. M. Messick. And to one looking back over the marks of the church's progress, as he is able to collect them now, it seems that it was under the faithful labor of Bro. Messick that the work of the church took better shape and became more effective. He was followed by J. A. Dearborn. Bro Dearborn's memory is connected by the church with the building of their house, for it was during the time when he was their pastor and guide that they built their present large and elegant brick church costing \$18,000. And it is not necessary to say to those who know what such a work means, that no pastor has carried for the church a greater burden of care and anxiety than Bro. Dearborn did as pastor during this trying time. And he richly deserves the grateful remembrance in which he is held by the church for it.

Next came Geo. Plattenburg. This was not his first service for the church. Sometime before this he had held meetings and also filled the office of pastor for them. Indeed of all the faithful servants of this church none have served it so long as Bro. Plattenburg, and being one of the ripest scholars of the Brotherhood, and with a strong personality it would naturally follow that the impression of his work is even to-day plainer upon the thought of the church than that of any other of its teachers.

Bro. Plattenburg was followed by J. B. Mayfield. To the wise and faithful labors of Bro. Mayfield the church is indebted more than to any others for the clearing away of a large church debt which had hung over them from the completion of their house in 1886 to this time, 1891. To aid Bro. Mayfield in this work the church secured the services of J. S. Myers, of Sedalia, two or three weeks, and at a dedication meeting, held October 11, 1891, they secured pledges upon which was collected by December 24, 1891, the date of a "Note Burning Jubilee," \$7719.75.

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This being more than enough to pay off all indebtedness the notes were burned and the church rejoiced. Bro. Mayfield was succeeded by H. D. Smith. In the remarkable prosperity of the church during the two years of his pastorate the splendid abilities of Bro. Smith are manifest. Especially is the church indebted to him for that missionary spirit that has given it a new life and spirit and activity.

H. A. McDonald followed Bro. Smith, and Marshall never had a more faithful minister, nor a more learned and efficient teacher of the scriptures. B. T. Wharton, the present pastor, began his labors with the church June 1, 1897.

The last annual report of the church from June 1, 1897 to June 1, 1898 showed a gain in numbers of 147 during the year, making a total membership of 548 in the church. It announced a prosperous condition in all the societies of the church and departments of the church work; an increased attendance and interest in the prayer-meeting; a greater activity in Christian work, such as, Benevolence, Missions, Temperance, etc.; an efficiency in our work in the Bible School, under the leadership of Supt. Jas. A. Gordon, which placed us second to but one school in Missouri, in the opinion of the Committee of the State Bible School Convention, at Mexico, in June, Our financial report showed over \$3,000.00 cash raised during the year, by all the church in all its departments. Of this \$2,200.00 was spent at home on Pastor's salary, regular incidental expenses, running Bible school, and special expenses, such as protracted meeting, insurance, taxes, repairs on house, etc. The other \$800.00 was spent on missions and benevolences.

The present officers of the church, the account of the Bible school, and the Societies of the church, including their history, reports and officers, you will find in their proper places.





Until the death of C. M. Buckner a few months ago, the firm of Rose & Buckner was the oldest establishment on the Marshall Square to operate continuously without reorganization. John W. Rose tells the story of the establishment of the business as follows:

"Mr. Buckner and I had been boys together and had grown up side by side in Paris, Missouri, where his father was the local banker and mine the operator of the Paris Boot and Shoe Factory.

"I sold shoes in nearby counties while still a boy of fifteen. Later I went to St. Louis and traveled out of that city for several shoe factories. During another year I was employed as a retail shoe salesman there.

"Meanwhile Charley Buckner had moved to Marshall and opened up a grocery store. He kept writing me that Marshall was the best "long-grass" town in the state, and urging me to come here and settle down. Finally he succeeded in persuading me, and I came to Marshall.

"Charley met me at the depot in a horse and buggy. The streets were muddy and the square was a big puddle. The courthouse was just being finished and most of the buildings around the square were frame shacks. There were board sidewalks, for the most part, and now and then some brick.

"The town didn't look much like it does today. The Baptist church was nearly completed, but aside from that and the Catholic Convent, which was still under construction, there weren't a great many buildings. Everything just then was just 'being built.' Construction work was going on all over town.

"The reason for the boom was that the Chicago & Alton railroad had just gone through the town. Things were 'opening up' and the prospect was excellent.

"I got a place as a clerk in the shoe store of Philpott & Noble. They offered me ten dollars a week, but I held out for fifty a month—and got it. The highest salaried man in Marshall at that time I guess.

"After about a year, during which time Charlie and I roomed together over a smokeshop on the south side of the square, I left him to set up a home. I had married a Marshall girl, and before another year had passed another Marshall girl accepted Charley.

"We formed our partnership in 1883, selling shoes

exclusively. Not until fifteen years later did we expand our business to include a full line of clothing.

"Then, in 1905, we built our present brick building on the east side of the square. For the past twenty years and more we have operated stores in Marshall and Slater and, for that matter, throughout Missouri. The only secret of our success has been that we offered nothing but the highest quality merchandise."

A glance about the large store which is the Marshall home of Rose & Buckner will serve to convince anyone that Mr. Rose's statement of the secret of the firm's success is true. Nothing but quality shoes and clothing is displayed.

Rose & Buckner feature Stein-Bloch and Society Brand clothing, both celebrated brands of national reputation, and in their shoe department the same high standard is maintained, Thompson and International heading the list of manufacturers represented. The character of the incidental furnishings is indicated by the firm's exclusive sale of Knox hats.

Keeping pace with the metropolitan aspect which Marshall has rapidly assumed in the past few years, Rose & Buckner have stocked a complete line of sports toggery and accessories including such popular items today as golf equipment and like sporting goods. Fine leather goods, handbags, luggage and similar articles which have become "necessary luxuries" are included in this large, up-to-the-minute store.

An idea of the completeness of the service of Rose & Buckner is given by the shoe repair shop which they operate in connection with their store. Located on a balcony, this one department affords steady employment to an expert shoe repairman. Likewise a tailor is employed to make alterations and to clean and press articles of wearing apparel for the store's many customers. Such services as these are but other conveniences which Rose & Buckner afford their patrons.

Today the Rose & Buckner organization stands as a corporation, having been so formed on January 1, 1928. Since the death of Mr. Buckner the direction of the business has been in the hands of Mr. Rose and his son, J. P. Rose.
