MEIERHOFFER SAND COMPANY OFFICE BUILDING

SUMMARY: The Meierhoffer Sand Company Office Building, 201 Second Street, is a rectangular brick building with full basement which was originally a small office constructed circa 1900, with an addition constructed circa 1910 which housed a wagon scale. The load bearing brick walls of each section are laid in a common bond variant of seven stretcher rows per header row on a poured concrete foundation. The gable roof is sheathed with tin. Despite minor alterations, the Meierhoffer Sand Company Office Building retains sufficient physical characteristics to convey integrity of workmanship, materials, and design, in addition to its integrity of location and setting.

ELABORATION: The facade, or east-northeast elevation, is divided into four asymmetrically arranged bays. The northernmost bays are set in the older portion of the building, which comprises roughly half of the present structure. The northern bay housed a window, which is currently covered with plywood. This bay, as well as all the remaining bays on the structure, are capped with the arched brick lintel identified as a characteristic device employed by Missouri-German craftsmen. A door with transom is intact in the only other bay on the original structure's facade. The circa 1910 addition is distinguished by a gable wall dormer embellished with returns and imbricated shingles, set over a wide arched opening repeated on the rear, or west-southwest, elevation. These openings allowed customers to drive through the building over scales set in the floor of the addition. The arches are capped by three rowlock brick courses. Framing has closed the arch opening, which now houses a doorway and boarded-over window. A window, also covered with plywood, is set in a bay to the north of the arched opening. Interior end brick chimneys penetrate the ridge at each gable end.

The circa 1910 addition's rear, or west-southwest, elevation contains an arched doorway identical to the doorway on the facade. It is also enclosed, but with a single door set in the framed infill. A single plywood-covered window is set to the north of the arched doorway. The wall dormer, however, is absent. The rear elevation of the original structure contains two symmetrically arranged bays which originally contained arched windows, but have also been covered.

The south-southeast elevation contains no bays. The north-northwest elevation contains a single bay in the east side of the elevation. Its arched window opening is covered with plywood.



By 1929, the building was used as a grocery store, at which time the wagon scales were probably removed. It was converted to a dwelling at an unknown date and partitioned into four rooms on its ground floor, the form it presently retains.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

SUMMARY: The Meierhoffer Sand Company Office Building, 201 Second Street, is significant under Criterion C in the area of ARCHITECTURE. Built circa 1900 as a one room office, the Meierhoffer Building was enlarged circa 1910 with the construction of a drive-through addition which housed wagon scales. The brick construction, austere planer surfaces, simple rectangular design, and use of arched window and door headers are characteristics which define the Vernacular Brick Buildings property type (see "Historic Resources of Boonville, Missouri: Additional Architectural Contexts").

ELABORATION: In 1894, Charles Meierhoffer founded the Meierhoffer Sand Company. The office building was constructed by 1900, according to a Sanborn Fire Insurance Company map of that year. It was built on the site of a cooperage shop operated originally by Jacob Meierhoffer, Charles's father, a German immigrant who settled in Boonville in the 1850s. Jacob later operated the cooperage shop in a partnership with his two sons, and, in 1887, Charles Meierhoffer bought his brother's interest in the business. In 1919, the building housed a grocery. Presently it is vacant.
