The southern section of this building may be the brick building shown at this corner in the 1886 Sanborn map. At the time, the building was used as a furniture store, and there was a one-story frame addition on the north (where the two-story, two-bay addition is now), and a cabinet maker shop (possibly clad in metal siding) at the rear. By 1909, the building had its current footprint. In 1926 it was used as a garage. The building is in an area that may be eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic places as a commercial historic district.


The building sits on the corner of 2nd and Locust Streets, one block west of the courthouse square.

The original section of the building is the three-bay, two-story brick commercial block at the corner of 2nd and Locust. The building has a simple dentiled cornice and decorative brick window hoods over the second story windows. The storefront is aluminum frame, and though modern in material (c. 1970?) is traditional in its design, with slightly recessed center entrances flanked by large plate glass windows over brick kick plates. The more recent (c. 1905), two-bay addition is similar in design to the original section of the building with similar dentiled cornice and window hoods. The storefront, how ever, has been filled in and stuccoed.



This 1 ½ story Tudor cottage is clad in stucco. It has a steeply pitched side gable roof with projecting cross gable entrance bay at the southeast corner. The entrance is in a segmental arch opening with simple surround. The prominent brick chimney extends through a portion of the front gable. On the north elevation is a sun porch with round arch openings.


The house sits on slight rise and is flanked to the north by a church and associated parking lot. Near the northwest corner of the house is a hipped roof two-car garage with hipped roof dormer and paneled garage doors.

This large American Foursquare house has Prairie style-influenced detailing, indicated by the wide eaves, broad porch with very low-pitch shed roof and broad entablature, and the horizontal decorative detailing separating the first floor from the second story windows. The house has a slightly raised basement and stone foundation. It is topped by a hipped roof with hipped roof dormers on three (possibly four) sides. The walls are stuccoed. The entrance on the three bay façade is offset to the north with two 1/1 windows to the south. The second floor has a slightly projecting window surround flanked by thick engaged columns. To either side are large 1/1 windows. All windows in the building appear to be replacement vinyl sash.



This frame house sits on a foundation of what appears to be rusticated concrete blocks. The roof is hipped with a centered gabled dormer with paired (fixed?) windows. A projecting cross gable with canted corners is at the south corner of the façade. The front wall of the projection has a Queen Anne style multi-light transom and fixed lower pane. Above this window is a panel consisting of framed squares with small central squared modillions. The windows in the canted walls (possibly replacements) are 1/1 sash and are topped by decorative dentiled hoods. The gable end has a half-round fan light window and decorative paneled and carved verge board.

The most prominent feature of the house is its elaborately detailed porch. The porch roof is an extension of the main roof. The roof is supported by carved posts. Between the posts is a broad paneled cornice. The entrance to the porch has an arched opening with panels and modillions at the corners. Above the arch is a band of turned spindles. When originally surveyed in 1984, the house retained an arcaded porch rail (see Sandehn Survey). Also, at the time, some of the architectural details on the building were obscured by asbestos siding. This siding has since been removed.

This two-story house is a good local example of the Italian Renaissance Revival style. The two-story home has a medium-pitch hipped clad in red clay tile. The walls are stucco. The double door entrance is in a projecting center bay and is topped by a round arch transom. Surrounding the entrance is a small portico with simple entablature supported by Tuscan columns on plinth. Above this is a balustrade around a small balcony. Accessing the balcony are casement windows. On either side of the entrance bay are paired 8-pane casement windows (first floor) and paired 1/1 windows with multi-light storm windows (?) on the second. On either side of the main block are two one-story wings with round-arch openings.


The house and its immediate neighbors sit on large lots facing Birch Street. The Riley-Cormack House has one outbuilding that can be seen from the street. It is a two-car garage with hipped roof. The rafter tails along the roofline indicate that the building may have been constructed in the 1910s-1930s. Also on the lot is a sign for the historical society museum.

This 2 ½ story frame house has a hipped roof and stone foundation. The main entrance is under a one-bay flat roof porch with decorative gable fronting a small second story balcony. The Gable has Stick style framing with decorative modillions. The porch roof/balcony is supported by simple wood posts with canted corners. To the south is a slightly projecting bay with three tall narrow windows on the first and second floors. Between the window is a simple paneled detail, a detail that extends across the façade and sides of the house. Above the windows is a decorative cornice. Topping the projection is a large dormer with brackets supporting the slightly projecting gable roof. Between the brackets are three fixed pane windows. The gable end has imbricated shingles with an applied decorative feature in the peak. The verge boards are also decorative with evenly spaced modillions. A secondary front entrance is located on the south, recessed, corner of the house. The entrance also has a porch with flat roof and second story balcony. The balcony has a "skirt" of imbricated shingles and simple balustrade.



This Late-Victorian is two-story with medium-pitch hipped roof with projecting cross gables to the west (front) and north. The front (west) projecting gable has a three-sided, flat roof bay area on the first floor with large 1/1 wood windows. Above and below the windows are decorative panels, between each is a simple pilaster. Above the bay is a 1/1 window with decorative window surround topped by a small sunburst pattern. To the north is a wrap-around porch with hipped roof supported by squared columns. The porch's cornice contains broad panels with bulls eye medallions, arching brackets, and scrollwork brackets. The balustrade has turned spindles. Windows on the second story have similar decorative surrounds to that seen on the projecting gable, minus the sunburst design. At the time of the survey, the house appeared to be undergoing repair or restoration.





The house sits on a large lot and, despite the Birch St. address, faces onto Frost Street. At the southwest corner of the lot is a small Midwestern Three Portal type barn (see photo 2). The barn has a broad front facing gable roof, is of frame construction, and is clad in vertical wood (?) siding. There may be additional outbuildings on site that were not noted during windshield survey.

This large Prairie style home is roughly rectangular in footprint with slightly recessed wings in the east and west ends. The corners of the projection are highlighted by stone buttresses. This buttress-like feature can also be seen on the first floor corners of the main block of the house and its wings. The first floor bays on either side of the entrance contain paired windows. The openings are outlined in red brick. The whole is capped by a low pitched hipped clay tile roof with broad overhanging eaves.

This large home was constructed for Raleigh Morgan, a prominent farmer in Clinton County. Raleigh was born in in 1824 in what is now West Virginia. He was already a man of means when he arrived in Clinton County in 1857. According to one county history, he arrived with 2 slaves and \$7000 in cash, purchasing a farm about 7 miles from Plattsburg. The house was owned by descendants of the Morgan family for many years, though by the time of the 1984 survey, it had not been occupied for some 40 years. The photos from the original survey show a house with boarded windows and an overgrown yard. Since the survey, the house has been restored and is now a bed and breakfast.

Per local walking tour brochure, "Pink Rosebud Bed & Breakfast, built 1878. Originally constructed as a square wood frame house. In 1914 additions to the home were made, that were completed in 1922. This included the lions and fountains, and the stone. Stone came from the Federal Courthouse in Kansas City. It became a B&B in 1996."


The house sits on a large flat lot in a neighborhood of high-style and vernacular Late Victorian and early 20th-Century houses. The lawn is surrounded by a decorative wrought iron fence. There is a modern side gable garage and the northwest corner of the lot.

Described as "an elegant and commodious residence," this large 2-story stone (limestone, locally called "Carthage marble") house is an eclectic Late Victorian residence. The footprint of the building is a broad I-house with central projecting cross gable. The gable is filled with decorative wood fanlight patterns. Below the roof is a canted corner bay with segmental arched windows. Flanking the central bay are two flat roof porches supported by thick stone posts and Tuscan columns. Surrounding the porch roofs are turned post balustrades. On the southeast corner of the house is a tower topped by a conical roof.

The house sits on a large flat lot with scattered mature trees. It is on a street lighted with large homes from the late 19th and early 20th centuries.



The Stoutimore house is an excellent example of a frame Second Empire cottage. The 1 ½ story house has a blockish L-shaped footprint with a 2 ½ story tower and highly decorative porch in the crook of the L. The walls are clad in wide wood siding with corner quoins. The mansard roof has diamond and flat butt imbricated wood shingles. The porch roof is hipped with a gable marking the entrance. The roof is supported by turned porch posts with scrollwork arcaded balustrade. The arcaded detailing is also picked up in the porch entablature. The projecting front bay of the house contains an oriel containing three tall narrow 1/1 windows. The oriel is supported by massive brackets.

The exterior or the house was restored sometime in 2010. Non-historic siding seen in the 1984 survey photograph has been removed.

According to Sanhehn, the house was constructed for R. L. (Bob) & Mary M. (nee Biggerstaff) Scearce. Born in Clay County in 1843, R.L. moved to Clinton County as a child in 1851 and became a well-known stock breeder.

According to the "Walking Tour of Historical Homes," "Built 1838, the oldest home on the tour. The house's exterior was once a rosy brick. The bricks were all hand-made. The walls are 12 inches thick. The porch was added in the 1870's to make it a Victorian. The back was put on in later years. During the Civil War the house served as a doctor's quarters. The doctor serviced both sides so they wouldn't burn his house down."

One apparently modern outbuilding is visible from the road. Located to the south of the house, it is 1 ½ stories with front facing gable roof.

In many respects this 2 story brick house is Italianate in design and embellishment. The roof is a low pitched hip with narrow eaves lined by a simple bracketed cornice. The slightly projecting entrance bay at the northeast corner is topped by a classical pediment. The segmental arch windows on the first and second floor have prominent window hoods. The porch, however, is elaborately detailed. The low pitched hipped roof is supported by slender turned wood posts. Between the posts is a large entablature with dentiled cornice and square modillions. Beneath this are Eastlake style turned spindles and decorative brackets. The balustrade has scrollwork supports and ogee rails. The entrance to the porch is topped by a small gable.



The house faces the intersection of Broadway & 2nd Street. To the east is Plattsburg's historic central business district. To the west is a large residential neighborhood of late 19th and early 20th Century houses and churches. The house marks the gateway to this neighborhood. The larger area is laid in a standard grid pattern of streets. The streets are lined with sidewalks.

Late Victorian house with massing of a Queen Ann, but more sedately detailed. The projecting cross gable is topped by a gabled dormer with imbricated shingles. Between the first and second floors of the cross gable is a decorative wood panel. The porch has turned posts and brackets, indicative of Italianate stylistic influences. Though clad in vinyl, the application was sensitive, leaving most of the decorative details (window surrounds, decorative shingled gable dormer and cornice line, etc.) intact. The 1984 survey photograph shows asbestos siding. The current vinyl siding either replaced or covers the older (non-original) cladding. Historic metal cresting around the roof has also been removed since the 1984 survey.

In the 1950s or 1960s, the building was altered with new porch posts (cast metal) and aluminum (possibly steel) siding. More recent alterations include the replacement of all window. 













This eclectic frame Queen Anne cottage has a steeply pitched hipped roof, prominent projecting gable, and complex footprint. Balancing the gable, next to the off-center entrance, is a multi-sided tower with flat roof (the original roof has been removed). Windows in the tower are large 1/1 wood sash with decorative wood surrounds. The surrounds have bulls-eye corner blocks topping simple pilasters. 





This church is a commodious example of a Steepled EI church type with Romanesque architectural details. Though greatly expanded in recent years, the original section of the brick church has a T-shaped footprint with massive corner entrance tower tucked into the intersection of the cross gable roof. The three story tower is recessed behind the projecting front entrance. The entrance doors are round arch and accessed by a concrete stoop. Above the doors are paired 2/2 windows with transoms and stone sills. The belfry on the third floor has paired round arch window openings filled with wood vents. The tower is topped by a spired roof with finial. The projecting cross gable has a large round arch stained glass windows divided into six mane sections by pressed metal or wood pilasters and spandrels. Other decorative features include stone accents and corbeled brick cornices. A large classroom addition is attached to the west elevation of the building.

This 1 ½ story frame Queen Anne cottage sits on a stone foundation and is clad in asbestos shingle. The roof is crossed gable, with a projecting front gable extending over a large bay window. Centered in the bay window is a Queen Anne style window (large single-pane wood sash with a short, multi-light upper sash). Set on the angled walls of the bay are two 1/1 double hung sash (per side). Window trim is plain with simple square corner blocks. In the projecting gable end has decorative verge boards, and paired single-pane casement windows with decorative surrounds. The surrounds have projecting carved corner blocks, a dentiled cornice, and turned wood elements. A porch supported by elaborate cast metal posts (probably 20th Century replacements) extends from the bay to the east corner of the house.







The porch has been framed-in and a multi-light picture window flanked by 1/1 double hung windows installed on the front. Faux shutters and a wide window flower box have also been installed. The side wing has a slightly lower roof ridge. Two large multi-light fixed windows (similar to the front picture window) have been installed. These too have faux shutters. 





This 1 ½ story frame house sits on a stone foundation and has the massing commonly seen in Queen Ann cottages, notably the cross gable roof and projecting front gable. Paired 1/1 wood windows are found in the projecting gable. The windows have simple wood surrounds. A similar single 1/1 wood window is in the gable peak. The entrance is roughly centered in a small shed roof foyer, to the east of which is a Queen Ann style window with large single pane under a leaded and colored glass transom. The porch, fronting the entrance, is highly styled with Victorian turned posts, brackets and an arcade-like motif in the gable. The porch is somewhat out of character for the house and appears to be a later alteration based on Sanborn map comparisons.



This 2 ½ story frame Victorian home has the formal footprint and elaborate detail commonly seen in plan book homes of the late 19th century. The house has a steeply pitched hipped roof with projecting cross gable on the front (north) façade. Though somewhat boxy in form, the house has the highly textured walls and decorative elements common in high style Victorian houses. The projecting front gable, for example, has three types of siding: clapboard on the first floor, shiplap on the second, and diamond patterned wood shingles in the gables. In the peak of the gable siding is laid at angles to form a V pattern behind turned and scrollwork decorative elements. All fenestration has decorative surrounds with pilasters; bulls eye corner blocks and ogee cornices. The most outstanding features of the house are the highly ornamented front and side porches. The front porch is L-shaped to fit within the crook of the projecting gable. Its hipped roof is crowned with cast iron cresting in an elaborate vine-work pattern. The porch entrance is under a gable infilled with decorative panels, and arched brackets, all supported by sturdy turned columns. The porch's cornice is a decorative arcade with drip molds. Similar motifs are found on the shed-roof side porch (east elevation).




The house is located in a historic residential neighborhood just west of the historic central business district. The neighborhood contains buildings dating from the late 19th and early 20th century. Streets are laid in a grid pattern and sidewalks line both sides of the street. The yard of the house is surrounded by a wood picket fence (installed post 1984). No outbuildings were visible or noted during the 2012 survey.

This 1 ½ story frame Queen Anne Cottage has an L-shaped footprint. The projecting front gable has a centered 1/1 window in the gable end with a horseshoe shaped verge board and dentiled cornice. Below this is a three sided bay, the windows of which have dentiled window hoods. To the west of the bay are paired windows. In the crook of the L is a two-story tower with steeply pitched hip roof. The tower room has paired windows on each wall of the second floor, the house's entrance is in the slightly wider tower base. The porch wraps the tower. The porch roof is supported by square wood sided columns on a brick knee wall. When originally surveyed in 1984, the lot also contained a small hipped roof summer house where Breckenridge did some of his writing. This small outbuilding appears to have been demolished since that time.



This commercial block may be two stories on the interior, but has no second story windows on the primary (west) elevation. The walls are clad in stucco and the roof is flat. The parapet wall is capped by clay coping tiles. The storefront level has a wide central garage door opening, flanked on either side by three-pane fixed windows in rectangular openings. The fenestration has decorative ogee surrounds with accented corners. At the second story level are three panels outlined in decorative trim with arching tops.

Based only on a brief site visit and photograph, it is difficult to assess the building's integrity. The relatively late date of construction may indicate that the stucco cladding is original, or this may be a later alteration. Additional research and historic photographs are needed to evaluate the building.







Fluted colossal stone pilasters divide the east (façade) and north elevations of this Neoclassical style bank building into symmetrical bays. The east elevation is capped by an entablature with "First National Bank" carved in stone. On the second floor, each bay contains two 1/1 windows with stone sills, except for the entrance bay on the east elevation. This bay contains a large stone panel with bas relief eagle with laurel wreath. Below this, the entrance has a simple classical surround with entablature, To either side, the storefront openings are infilled with stone (original) surrounding two large fixed pane windows.


