## SPANISH LAND GRANT TRAIL

Spanish Land Grant Trail crosses several wet-weather creeks, where scenic views of sandstone glades along Pickle Creek are visible. There is also a beautiful dry-mesic sandstone woodland community comprised of old growth shortleaf pine, oak and hickory. A variety of animals, such as white tail deer and wild turkey, call this area home. Backpacking is allowed at the three designated locations along the trail.
